BID EVALUATION CRITERIA (BEC)/BID REJECTION CRITERIA (BRC)

BID EVALUATION CRITERIA (BEC)

The bid shall conform to the specifications and terms and conditions given in the Bidding Documents. Bids will be rejected in case material and services offered do not conform to the required parameters stipulated in the technical specifications. Notwithstanding the general conformity of the bid to the stipulated specifications, the following requirements will have to be particularly met by the Bidders without which the same will be considered as non-responsive and will not be considered for evaluation. All the documents related to BEC shall be submitted along with the Technical Bid.

1.0 ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

Ministry of Petroleum & Natural Gas vide Notification No. FP- 20013/2/2017-FP-PNG-Part(4) (E-41432) dated 26.04.2022 has notified that Public Procurement (Preference to Make in India), Order 2017 (PPP- MII) issued by DPIIT and as amended from time to time shall be applicable to all the Public Sector Undertakings and their wholly owned subsidiaries under MoP&NG with certain modifications.

The bidder must be incorporated/registered in India and must maintain more than 20% local content (LC) for the offered services to be eligible to bid against this tender.

Regarding calculation of local content and submission of documents during bidding & execution of contracts, provision of Purchase preference policy linked with Local Content (PP-LC) notified vide Letter No. FP- 20013/2/2017-FP-PNG-Part(4) (E-41432) dated 26.04.2022 by-MoPNG (including subsequent amendments thereof, if any) shall be applicable.

If such local content is not maintained during execution of contract, OIL reserves the right to invoke the Performance Securities submitted by the bidding and supporting companies, in addition to resorting to other options as may be deemed appropriate.

Whether or not the bidders want to avail PP-MII benefit against this tender, it is mandatory for them to meet the following at the bidding stage:

- a) The Bidder must provide the percentage (%) of local content in their bid, without which the bid shall be summarily rejected being non-compliant.
- b) The Bidder shall submit an undertaking as per Proforma-XIV from the authorized signatory of bidder having the Power of Attorney along with the bid specifying the LC Percentage and such undertaking shall become a part of the contract, if awarded.
- c) Bidder to submit a copy of their Certificate of Incorporation/registration in India.

2.0 TECHNICAL CRITERIA:

- A)** The bidder must have successfully executed/completed similar Works over the last 7 (seven) years reckoned from the Original Bid Closing Date in Central/State Government/ PSUs/ Nationalised Banks/ Public Limited Company as under: –

The bidder must have successfully executed/completed at least one similar work of INR 1,84,433.45.

Similar Works mentioned above means: - Providing services for Fabrication / repair for Engines, Pumps and Auxilliary equipment.

- B)** For proof of requisite experience and relevant technical requirements, any one of the following documents/photocopies must be submitted along with the bid:
- i)** In case of contracts executed under Oil India Ltd., copy of 'Certificate of Completion (COC)'/ 'Certificate of Payment (COP)'/ 'Service Entry Sheet (SES)'/ Work order of jobs successfully completed during the last 7 (seven) years ending bid closing date showing gross value of job done. It may be clearly noted that simply mentioning of OIL CCO/ Contract Number will not be accepted.
 - ii)** In case the contracts executed not under Oil India Ltd, then the purchase order / work order / contract document along with completion certificate issued by any Central/State Government/ PSUs/ Nationalized Banks/ Public Limited Company in last 7 (seven) years ending bid closing date showing:
 - (a) Gross value of job done,
 - (b) Nature of job done,
 - (c) Time period covering the financial year(s) as per NIT; and
 - (d) Clearly mentioning job completion date.
- C)** A job executed by a bidder for its own organization/subsidiary cannot be considered as experience for the purpose of meeting BEC/ BRC.
- D)** In case of tenders for Annual rate contracts/Maintenance and Service contracts, if the prospective bidder is executing rate / maintenance /service contract which is still running and the contract value/ quantity executed prior to due date of bid submission is equal to or more than the minimum prescribed value in the BEC such experience will also be taken in to consideration provided that the bidder has submitted satisfactory work / supply / service execution certificate issued by end user.

3.0 FINANCIAL CRITERIA:

A) ANNUAL TURN OVER

- (i)** Annual financial turnover as per Audited Annual Reports in any of preceding 03 financial years/Accounting years to be reckoned from the original bid closing date should be at least INR 1,10,660.07.
- (ii)** For consortium: At least one member of the consortium to meet the above criteria of 50% turnover. The other members of consortium should meet minimum 25% turnover requirement.

B) Net worth: Positive for the preceding financial / accounting year.

Note:

- i.** Annual Financial Turnover of the bidder from operations shall mean: Aggregate value of the realization of amount made from the sale, supply or distribution of goods or on account of services rendered, or both, by the company (bidder) during a financial year' as per the Companies Act, 2013 Section 2 (91).
- ii.** Net worth shall mean: 'Share capital + Reserves created out of profits and securities Premium - Aggregate value of accumulated losses (excluding revaluation reserves) - deferred expenditure - Miscellaneous Expenditure to the extent not written off and carried forward Loss - Reserves created out of write back of depreciation and amalgamation'.

C) For proof of Annual Turnover & Net worth any one of the following documents must be submitted along with the bid: -

- (i)** A certificate issued by a practicing Chartered/Cost Accountant (with Membership Number and Firm Registration Number), as per format prescribed in PROFORMA-VII.

OR

(ii) Audited Balance Sheet along with Profit & Loss account.

Note: Mention of UDIN (Unique Document Identification Number) is mandatory for all Certificates issued w.e.f. February 1, 2019 by Chartered Accountant in Practice.

- D) In case the bidder is a Central Govt. Organization/PSU/State Govt. Organization/Semi-State Govt. Organization or any other Central/State Govt. Undertaking, where the auditor is appointed only after the approval of Comptroller and Auditor General of India and the Central Government, their certificates may be accepted even though FRN (Firm Registration Number) is not available. However, bidder will have to provide documentary evidence for the same.
- E) Considering the time required for preparation of Financial Statements, if the last date of preceding financial/accounting year falls within the preceding six months/within the due date for furnishing of audit report as per Section 139(1) of IT Act, 1961 (read along with latest circulars/notifications issued by CBDT from time to time) reckoned from the original bid closing date and the Financial Statements of the preceding financial/accounting year are not available with the bidder, then the financial turnover of the previous three financial/accounting years excluding the preceding financial/accounting year will be considered. In such cases, the Net worth of the previous financial/accounting year excluding the preceding financial/accounting year will be considered. However, the bidder has to submit an undertaking in support of the same along with their technical bid as per PROFORMA-VI.

4.0 COMMERCIAL EVALUATION CRITERIA:

- 4.1 The bids are to be submitted in single stage under composite Bid System i.e. Un-priced Techno-Commercial Bid and Price Bid together. The Un-priced techno- commercial bid (or Technical bid) must comprise of all the technical documents substantiating the previous experience, financial & technical credentials of the bidder and any other document as asked for in the bid document. There should not be any indication of price in the Technical bid; otherwise, the bid shall be rejected straightway.
- 4.2 Details of prices as per Price Bid format/Priced bid to be uploaded under "Notes and Attachment" Tab. Bidders must quote clearly and strictly in accordance with the price schedule outlined in relevant section of Bidding Documents; otherwise the bid will be rejected.
- Note: The breakup of the quoted/offered price i.e. the duly filled Price Bid Format MUST NOT be uploaded with the technical bid; otherwise, the bid shall be rejected straightway.**
- 4.3 The quantities shown against each item in the BOQ shall be considered for the purpose of Bid Evaluation. It is, however, to be clearly understood that the assumptions made in respect of the quantities for various operations are only for the purpose of evaluation of the bid and the Contractor will be paid on the basis of the actual Quantity consumed, as the case may be.
- 4.4 The price quoted by the successful bidder must be firm during the performance of the contract and not subject to variation on any account except as mentioned in the bid document. Any bid submitted with adjustable price quotation other than the above will be treated as non-responsive and rejected.
- 4.5 EMD/Bid Security: (NOT APPLICABLE) ~~Bid Security in original shall be furnished as a part of the Techno-Commercial Un-priced Bid and shall reach the office of the GM-Contracts, OIL, PHQ at Guwahati on or before 14:00 Hrs (IST) on the bid~~

~~closing/opening date. A scanned copy of the bid security shall however be uploaded along with the Technical Bid. The amount of Bid Security shall be as per the EMD/Bid Security amount mentioned in "FORWARDING LETTER of INTRODUCTION" of the tender. Bid without proper & valid bid security shall be rejected.~~

~~Note: For detailed procedure for submission of bid security and rejection criteria, please refer to Clause No. 12.0 of ITB.~~

- 4.6 Any bid received in the form of Physical document/ Telex/Cable/Fax/E-mail will not be accepted.
- 4.7 Bids shall be typed or written in indelible ink.
- 4.8 Bids shall contain no interlineations, erasures or overwriting except as necessary to correct errors made by bidder, in which case such corrections shall be initiated by the persons(s) signing (digitally) the bid. However, white fluid should not be used for making corrections. Any bid not meeting this requirement shall be rejected.
- 4.9 Any bid containing false statement will be rejected and action will be taken by Company as per Bid Document.
- 4.10 The bidder shall submit an undertaking/declaration as per Annexure- D confirming that they have read and understood OIL's Banning Policy and that, neither they nor any of their allied concerns or partners or associates or directors, or proprietors involved in any capacity, are currently on OIL's Holiday/Banning List. Further, the bidder shall confirm that neither they nor any of their forementioned entities have, during the last three years, been involved in any transgression with any company conforming to the Transparency International (TI) approach or with any Public Sector Enterprise of India that could justify exclusion from the tender process. The bidder shall also disclose details of all such allied entities, if any, as required under the Banning Policy
- 4.11 Bidder must accept and comply with the following provisions as given in the Tender Document in toto, failing which offer will be rejected:
 - (i) Firm price
 - (ii) Bid Security Declaration
 - (iii) Period of validity of Bid
 - (iv) Price Schedule
 - (v) Performance Bank Guarantee / Security deposit
 - (vi) Delivery / Completion Schedule
 - (vii) Scope of work
 - (viii) Guarantee of material / work
 - (ix) Liquidated Damages clause
 - (x) Tax liabilities
 - (xi) Arbitration / Resolution of Dispute Clause
 - (xii) Force Majeure
 - (xiii) Applicable Laws
 - (xiv) Specifications
 - (xv) Integrity Pact
- 4.12 There should not be any indication of price in the Un-priced Techno-Commercial Bid. A bid will be straightway rejected if this is given in the Un-priced Techno- Commercial Bid.
- 4.13 Bid received with validity of offer less than 90 (Ninety) days from Bid Closing Date will be rejected. Bidder must submit a declaration regarding bid validity as per the format prescribed in PROFORMA-I

4.14 The Integrity Pact is NOT applicable against this tender. ~~OIL shall be entering into an Integrity Pact with the bidders as per format enclosed vide "Integrity Pact" of the tender document. The proforma has to be returned by the bidder (along with the Un priced Techno Commercial Bid) duly signed by the same signatory who signed the bid, i.e., who is duly authorized to sign the bid. Uploading the Integrity Pact with digital signature will be construed that all pages of the Integrity Pact have been signed by the bidder's authorized signatory who sign the Bid.~~

In the event of any dispute between the management and the management and the contractor relating to those contracts where Integrity Pact is applicable, in case, both parties are agreeable, they may try to settle dispute through mediation before the panel of IEMs in a time bound manner. if required, the organizations may adopt any mediation rules for this purpose. In case, the dispute remains unresolved even after mediation by the panel of IEMs, the organization may take further action as per the terms and conditions of the contract. The fees/expenses on dispute resolution shall be equally shared by both parties.

4.15 Bidders should not be under liquidation/bankruptcy/undergoing any insolvency resolution process as on Bid Closing date. Further neither the Bidders nor any of any of its allied concerns/partners or associates or directors or proprietors involved in any capacity should be under Holiday List/Banning List/Suspension List of OIL as on Bid Closing date. Bidders shall submit undertaking towards compliance of above as per the prescribed formats (Appendix-D & Appendix-E) along with the bid. If any bidder declines to submit the above undertakings, their bids shall be liable for rejection.

5.0 PRICE EVALUATION CRITERIA:

5.1 The bids conforming to the technical specifications, terms and conditions stipulated in the bidding document and considered to be responsive after subjecting to Evaluation Criteria mentioned above will be considered for Price Evaluation as per criteria given below.

5.2 It is to be clearly understood that the assumptions made in respect of the quantities for various operations are only for the purpose of evaluation of the bid and the Contractor will be paid on the basis of the actual number of days/parameter, as the case may be.

5.3 The bidders are advised not to offer any discount/rebate separately and to offer their prices after considering discount/rebate, if any.

5.4 Conditional and unsolicited discount will not be considered in evaluation. However, if such bidder happens to be the lowest recommended bidder, unsolicited discount without any condition will be considered for computing the contract price.

5.5 The inter-se-ranking of the techno-commercially qualified bidders will be determined on overall lowest cost basis (L-1 offer) i.e. considering the Total quoted price inclusive of all liabilities and quoted GST.

5.6 In case more than one bidder emerges as lowest bidder due to equal rate quoted by the bidder, then the lowest bidder will be decided by draw of lots. Company's decision in this regard is final and binding to all bidders.

5.7 OIL shall prefer to deal with registered bidder under GST. Therefore, bidders are requested to get themselves registered under GST, if not registered yet. However, in case any unregistered bidder is submitting their bid, their prices will be loaded with applicable GST while evaluation of bid.

5.8 Quoted unit rates against each Line Item of the price bidding format shall be considered only up to 2 decimal places without rounding off for evaluation. In case the unit rate against a line item is found blank, the cost of that particular service shall be

considered as inclusive in the total offered price.

- 5.9 When a bidder mentions taxes as extra without specifying the rates & amount, the offer will be loaded with maximum value towards taxes received against the tender for comparison purposes. If the bidder emerges as lowest bidder after such loading, in the event of order on that bidder, taxes mentioned by OIL on the Purchase Order/Contracts will be binding on the bidder.
- 5.10 Input Tax Credit on GST (Goods & Service Tax) for this service is NOT available to OIL & the bids will be evaluated based on total price including GST.
- 5.11 Price Bid uploaded without giving any details of the taxes (Including rates and amounts) shall be considered as inclusive of all taxes including GST.
- 5.12 In case the GST rating of Contractor on the GST portal/Govt. official website is negative/black listed, then the bids may be rejected by OIL. Further, in case rating of bidder is negative/black listed after award of work for supply of goods/services, then OIL shall not be obligated or liable to pay or reimburse GST to such Contractor and shall also be entitled to deduct/recover such GST along with all penalties/interest, if any, incurred by OIL.

6.0 GENERAL:

- 6.1 In case bidder takes exception to any clause of bidding document not covered under BEC/BRC, then the Company has the discretion to load or reject the offer on account of such exception if the bidder does not withdraw/modify the deviation when/as advised by company. The loading so done by the company will be final and binding on the bidders. No deviation will however be accepted in the clauses covered under BEC/BRC.
- 6.2 Bidders should provide self-attested copies of GST Registration Certificate, PAN Card, ESIC registration (if applicable), P.F. Registration Number OR Declaration (Declaration by applicant that provisions of Provident Fund Act are not applicable to them. In case P.F. is required to be deposited later on, the same shall be deposited by the bidder (Applicant). In case successful bidder doesn't have P.F. Code at the time of bidding and PF Act is applicable on him/her, the same has to be provided by him/her during mobilization phase of the contract.
- 6.3 Bidder must have P.F. & ESIC Registration. Documentary evidence for the same should be submitted along with technical bid.

OR

In case bidder doesn't have P.F. & ESIC Registration at the time of bidding then the bidder shall have to submit an undertaking that they shall get registered with P.F. and ESIC Authority and shall produce the documentary evidence for the same during mobilization phase of the contract.

- 6.4 To ascertain the substantial responsiveness of the bid the Company reserves the right to ask the bidder for clarification in respect of clauses covered under BEC/BRC also and such clarifications fulfilling the BEC/BRC clauses in toto must be received on or before the deadline given by the company, failing which the offer will be evaluated based on the submission. However, mere submission of such clarification shall not make the offer responsive, unless company is satisfied with the substantial responsiveness of the offer.

- 6.5 If any of the clauses in the BEC/BRC contradict with other clauses of bidding document elsewhere, the clauses in the BEC/BRC shall prevail.
- 6.6 Bidder(s) must note that requisite information(s)/financial values etc. as required in the BEC/BRC & Tender are clearly understandable from the supporting documents submitted by the Bidder(s); otherwise Bids shall be rejected.
- 6.7 OIL will not be responsible for delay, loss or non-receipt of applications for participating in the bid sent by mail and will not entertain any correspondence in this regard.
- 6.8 The originals of such documents [furnished by bidder(s)] shall have to be produced by bidder(s) to OIL as and when asked for.

7.0 PURCHASE PREFERENCE CLAUSE:

7.1.1 PURCHASE PREFERENCE TO MSE BIDDERS: Purchase Preference to Micro and Small Enterprises is applicable for this tender. Bidders seeking benefits, under Purchase Preference Policy (MSE) shall have to be registered under Udyam Registration or UAM.

- a) Purchase Preference to Micro and Small Enterprises (MSEs) falling within the price band of L-1+ 15% and Purchase preference policy-linked with Local Content (PP-LC) falling within the price band of L-1+ 20% shall be applicable in this tender.
- b) In case a bidder is eligible to seek benefits under PP-LC policy as well as Public Procurement Policy for MSEs - Order 2012, then the bidders should categorically seek benefits against only one of the two policies i.e. either PP-LC or MSE policy. Bidder to categorically confirm under which policy i.e. PP-LC or MSE, they want to avail the benefit and to submit requisite document/certificate in support to avail this benefit. The bids shall be evaluated based on their declaration. No benefit shall be given if the bid is submitted without any above declaration along with supporting document as per the respective policies. Please refer PROFORMA-XVI to confirm under which category (PPLC of MSE) the benefit has been sought.

Documentation required to be submitted by MSEs: Categorization and various Criteria applicable to MSE bidders shall be guided by the Gazette Notification No. CG-DL-E-26062020-220191 dated 26.06.2020.

The bidder claiming as MSE status (MSE-General, MSE-SC/ST, MSE - Woman) against this tender has to submit the following documents for availing the benefits applicable to MSEs:

Udyam Registration Number with Udyam Registration Certificate.

Note: In case bidding MSE is owned by Schedule Caste or Schedule Tribe entrepreneur or Woman Entrepreneur, valid documentary evidence issued by the agency who has registered the bidder as MSE owned by SC/ST entrepreneur / Woman Entrepreneurs should also be enclosed.

7.1.2 AWARD OF CONTRACT: The requirement of this tendered service is not

splitable under the Purchase Preference policy. In case of participation of both MSE and LC bidder(s) against the tender, MSE bidder(s) will be given preference over LC bidder(s) to match with L1 bidder as per Public Procurement Policy. Accordingly, Purchase preference shall be extended as per the following:

- a) Purchase preference will be given to MSEs as defined in Public Procurement Policy for Micro and Small Enterprises (MSEs) Order, 2012 dated 23.03.2012 issued by Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises and its subsequent Orders/Notifications issued by concerned Ministry. If the bidder wants to avail the Purchase preference for services, the bidder must be the Service provider of the offered Service. Relevant documentary evidence in this regard shall be uploaded along with the bid in respect of the offered service. If L-1 is not an MSE and MSE Service Provider (s) has/have quoted price within L-1+ 15% of margin of purchase preference /price band defined in relevant policy, then 100% order quantity will be awarded to such MSE bidder(s) subject to acceptance of L1 bid price.
- b) (i) In case of non-eligible MSE bidder (s): Among all qualified bids, the lowest bid will be termed as L1. If L1 is “Class-I local supplier”, the contract for full quantity will be awarded to L1.

(ii) If L1 bidder is not a “Class-I local supplier”, 50% of the order quantity shall be awarded to L1. Thereafter, the lowest bidder among the “Class-I local supplier” will be invited to match the L1 price for the remaining 50% quantity subject to the Class-I local supplier’s quoted price falling within the margin of purchase preference, and contract for that quantity shall be awarded to such “Class-I local supplier” subject to matching the L1 price. In case such lowest “Class-I local supplier” fails to match the L1 price or accepts less than the offered quantity, the next higher “Class-I local supplier” within the margin of purchase preference shall be invited to match the L1 price for remaining quantity and so on, and contract shall be awarded accordingly. In case some quantity is still left uncovered on Class-I local suppliers, then such balance quantity may also be ordered on the L1 bidder.

8.0 DOCUMENT AUTHENTICITY UNDERTAKING: Bidders should note that Company (OIL) may verify authenticity of all the documents/certificates/information submitted by the bidder(s) against the tender. In case at any stage of tendering process or Contract execution etc., if it is established that bidder has submitted forged documents/certificates/information towards fulfilment of any of the tender/contract conditions, Company shall immediately reject the bid of such bidder(s) or cancel/terminate the contract besides taking action as per OIL’s Banning Policy dated 6th January 2017 revised on 17.03.2023, available in the OIL’s website. Accordingly, service provider/vendor to submit the Undertaking of authenticity of information/documents submitted as per Proforma-V.

9.0 COMPLIANCE OF THE COMPETITION ACT, 2002: The bidder shall strictly comply with the provisions of the Competition Act, 2002, more particularly, Section-3 of the Act. Any violation the provisions of the Act shall attract penal action under the Act.
