Oil India Limited - Grant of prior Environmental Clearance (EC) to the proposed project under the provision of the EIA Notification 2006 regarding.

Sir/Madam,

This is in reference to your application submitted to MoEF&CC vide proposal number IA/RJ/IND2/445883/2023 dated 07/03/2024 for grant of prior Environmental Clearance (EC) to the proposed project under the provision of the EIA Notification 2006 and as amended thereof.

3. The Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change has examined the proposal for proposed onshore Development Drilling & Production (25 Nos. Wells), Production Installations (02 nos.) with Associated Facilities in 210 Sq.Km Baghewala PML Block located at Baghewala Village, Taluk Pokhran, District Jaisalmer & Bikaner, State Rajasthan by M/s. Oil India Limited.

4. The proposal was considered in EAC (Ind-2) meetings held on 02nd July, 2024 and 20th November, 2024 wherein the project proponent and their accredited Consultant M/s. Hubert Enviro Care Systems (p) Limited (NABET certificate no. NABET/EIA/2224/SA0190 and validity 27.07.2024) made a detailed presentation on the salient features of the project. The minutes of the meeting and all the Applications and documents submitted [(viz. Form-1 Part A, Part B, Part C EIA, EMP)] are available on the PARIVESH portal which can be accessed by scanning the QR Code available above.

5. All Offshore and onshore oil and gas exploration, development & Production are listed at S.N. 1(b) of the Schedule of Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Notification under Category 'A' and are appraised at the Central Level by Expert Appraisal Committee (EAC).

6. The details of products and capacity are enclosed in Annexure 2.

7. The Ministry has issued Environmental Clearance to the existing wells capacity of 20 wells vide file no. J-11011/325/2013-IA II(I) dated 30.09.2016. Certified compliance report of existing EC has been obtained from Regional Office, MoEFCC, vide File no. – IV/ENV/PL-29/947/2017 dated 18.05.2022. Action Taken Report has been submitted to IRO, MOEFCC, Ref. No. R/S&E/E-19/087/2022, dated 26.07.2022, for one partial compliance. Further, the latest compliance status has been obtained from the Regional Office based on a site inspection done on 17th October, 2023 which mentions that there is no progress since the last CCR. One partial compliance is related to the subsidence study for which PP has informed that MoU has been signed with ISRO & NRSC for Rajasthan fields.

8. Standard ToR has been issued by the Ministry vide letter F. No. IA- J-11011/325/2013-IA-II(I) dated: 01.06.2022. It was informed that no litigation is pending against the project.

Public Hearing for the proposed project had been conducted by the Rajasthan State Pollution Control Board on 20-01-2023 at 11.00 am Gram Panchayat Bhawan, Tawriwala and Mr. Gopal Lal, Additional District Magistrate, Jaisalmer (Rajasthan) presided over the meeting along with Smt. Shilpi Sharma - Regional Officer, Regional Office, Rajasthan State Pollution Control Board, Jaisalmer, Rajasthan. The main issues raised during the public hearing and their action plan are enclosed in Annexure 5.

9. Total land area required is 2.5 Hectares per well for the drilling site. 10.56 Ha of the total area of production setup will be developed for the greenbelt development i.e., 33% of the total project area. In the drilling phase, for the proposed project, the area for the drill site is ~ 2.5ha/well, For 25 wells, 25x2.5=62.5 Ha for the proposed project is within the Block area. Two (02) nos. production Set-up (s)/ installation(s) are proposed initially. However, the nos. of production setup/installation may be increased as production goes up. The typical area required for each setup/ installation will be ~16 Ha. So the total area of production setup(s) is 32 ha approx. For 2 proposed production setup, 2x16=32Ha within the Block area. OIL has obtained the Petroleum Mining Lease from The Government Of Rajasthan, Mines & Petroleum Department vide No. F18 (11)Mines/Gr.1/2001 Part-1 dated 16.06.2023 valid up to 31.12.2040 for an area of 200.26 sq.km The estimated project cost is Rs. 495 Crores. The capital cost of EMP would be Rs. 76,20,000 and the recurring cost for EMP would be Rs. 28,48,772 per well. Industry proposes to allocate Rs.3,71,00,000 towards Extended EMP. Total Employment will be 307 persons as direct & indirect.

10. There are NO national parks, wildlife sanctuaries, Biosphere Reserves, Tiger/Elephant Reserves, Wildlife Corridors etc. within 10 km distance. There is NO Reserve forests/protected forests. There is NO National parks, wildlife sanctuaries, biosphere reserves, Tiger/Elephant reserves, wildlife Corridors etc. There is NO Eco-sensitive Zone in this area. Water bodies: Distributaries: Within the Project Site 3nos. of water bodies such as Kharewali/Khara, Khairuwala, Jaluwala Distributary, Phularsar Distributary is at a 10.81Km distance of NE direction, Canals: Within the Project Site 2

nos. of Charanwala Branch, Canal, Indira Gandhi Nahar is at a 7.29Km distance of ESE direction, Phalodi Lift is at a 11.30Km distance of SE direction, Minor: Within the Project Site, Charanwala is at a 2.05Km distance of E direction, Bharmasar is at a 2.75Km distance of E direction, Gogriyawala is at a 6.47Km distance of E direction, Narayansar is at a 8.37Km distance of E direction, Phulasar Minor No 1 is at a 7.31Km distance of NNE direction, Phulasar Minor No 2 is at a 10.64Km distance of NE direction, Phulasar Subminor No 1 is at a 7.93Km distance of N direction, PhulasarSubminor No 2 is at a 8.56 Km distance of N direction.

11. Ambient air quality monitoring was carried out at 11 locations during November 2021 – January 2022 and the baseline data indicates the ranges of concentration as: minimum and maximum levels of PM10 (63.41 to 75.51g/m³), PM2.5 (22.48 to 28.81g/m³), SO₂ (5.48 to 6.96 g/m³), NO₂(6.58 to 8.36 g/m³). AAQ modelling study for point source emissions indicates that the maximum incremental GLCs after the proposed project would be 90.54g/m³, 9.02g/m³, 10.38 g/m³. With respect to PM10, SO₂ and NO_x, the resultant concentrations are well within the National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS).

12. The Existing total water requirement of 35KLPD which being met through the IGNP water supply. For the proposed project 25KLD of water will be met through IGNP water supply. In addition to that 25KLPD will be proposed for production setup. In the Drilling phase Effluent generation will be 8KLPD which will be treated through the proposed mobile Effluent Treatment Plant of capacity 10KLPD. Domestic wastewater will be 1.5 KLPD which will be treated through the proposed mobile Sewage Treatment Plant of capacity 2 KLPD and treated water is used for Gardening purpose and sludge will be used as manure for the greenbelt and in the production phase Domestic wastewater will be 4 KLPD which will be treated through proposed mobile Sewage Treatment Plant of capacity 5 KLPD The treated effluent will not be discharged outside the premises.

Produced Water Management

The produced hydrocarbons will flow through flow lines to the proposed OCS, Baghwala for the temporary storage and through bowser it will be transferred to North Santhal Group Gathering Station cum Central Tank Farm (NSCTF) which handles crude.

Well fluids is fed to the Indirect Bath Heater & then to Production Separators operated at 2.5 kg/cm² to separate gas from liquid. After the separation of gas, liquid is fed to the Free Water Knock Out Drum (FWKOD). In FWKOD, separated free water by gravity action is pumped to the NS Effluent Treatment Plant through Effluent transfer pumps. Emulsion from FWKOD is fed to Heater-Treaters via HT feed pumps. The combination of demulsifier, heating and gravity settling in heater treaters breaks the emulsion effectively. The treated crude oil from the heater treater is received in oil storage tanks. The oil is given a settling time of 06-08 hours and settled water/emulsion is drained to oily water tanks from where water is send to wash tanks at NSETP and oil is recycled to heater treaters. Bottom oil at oil storage tanks is recycled to heater treaters to meet the desired quality of oil.

The separated water from heater treaters is sent to wash tanks at NSETP for further treatment and safe disposal into effluent disposal wells. The oil part of effluent in wash tanks is skimmed from the wash tanks and collected at skim oil tanks for recycling to heater treater. The Chemical dosing equipment contains tanks and pumping facilities for demulsifier, deoiler & caustic soda dosing.

13. The Proposed Power requirement during the drilling Phase will be 2875 kVA which will be sourced from Diesel Generators having capacity 2x600KVA & 1x250KVA. The proposed Power requirement for the production Phase will be 820 kw which will be sourced from JDVVNL, 1 x 600kVA DG set will be used as standby during power failure and stack height 8 m above ground level will be provided as per CPCB norms to the proposed DG sets. One Power driven Boiler is proposed during the production phase for which power will be sourced from JDVVNL.

14. Details of Process emissions generation and its management:

- The source of stack are 3 nos of 600kVA Diesel Generator (1 no. will be standby) having a stack height of 8m having emission per stack for PM10, SO₂ and NO_x are to be 0.0609g/s, 0.0570g/s and 0.0173g/s for each stack respectively and 1nos of 250kVA Diesel Generator having a stack height of 7m having emission per stack for PM10, SO₂ and NO_x are to be 0.0254g/s, 0.0237g/s and 0.0072g/s.

- Selective Catalytic Reduction (SCR) is recommended as an air pollution control measure for the reduction of NO_x emission (90% reduction for SCR) from DG.

The cumulative incremental concentrations of after implementation of SCR (APC Measure for No_x) PM₁₀, SO₂ and NO_x are observed to be 0.80g/m³, 0.75g/m³ and 0.46g/m³ respectively. The total pollutant concentrations of PM₁₀, SO₂, NO_x and CO are 90.54g/m³, 9.02g/m³, 10.38g/m³ respectively.

15. Details of solid waste/Hazardous waste generation and its management:

During the Construction Phase, 9.45 kg/day of Organic Municipal Solid Waste and 6.3 kg/day of Inorganic Municipal solid waste will be generated in which the Organic Waste will be Disposed off nearby municipal disposal site via local vendors & Inorganic waste will be Proper segregation and storage of recyclable waste in designated bins onsite. Recyclables will be periodically sold to local waste recyclers.

During the Drilling Phase, in existing 27.54 kg/day of Organic Municipal Solid Waste and 18.36 kg/day of Inorganic Municipal solid waste will be generated in which the Organic Waste will be Disposed off nearby municipal disposal site via local vendors & Inorganic waste will be Proper segregation and storage of recyclable waste in designated bins onsite. Recyclables will be periodically sold to local waste recyclers.

During the Production Phase, 45.9 kg/day of Organic Municipal Solid Waste and 30.6 kg/day of Inorganic Municipal solid waste will be generated in which the Organic Waste will be Disposed off nearby municipal disposal site via local vendors & Inorganic waste will be Proper segregation and storage of recyclable waste in designated bins onsite. Recyclables will be periodically sold to local waste recyclers.

Hazardous Waste Generation - Used/ spent oil (Category 5.1) of quantity 0.4TPA will be collected in HDPE drums in secured dyked area and Disposed to CPCB/ TSPCB registered used oil recyclers/ facilities via authorized vendor(s)/transporter(s). The ETP sludge leftover will be sent to TSDF or RSPCB approved secured Landfill.

16. During deliberations, the following issues were discussed:

- EAC noted that, as per the Interim Subsidence Study Report submitted for Baghewala PML block, SBAS method estimated a negligible ground deformation in most parts of Baghewala block regions. However, minor ground deformation is observed in some parts of the area. Analysis of two representative points show steady and consistent subsidence over time of one point is located close to the well cluster, records a LOS subsidence rate of 2.02 ± 0.06 cm/y whereas Point 2, which is located at a slight distance from the majority of the wells, records an Advanced Land Observing Satellite subsidence rate of 1.93 ± 0.07 cm/y. Further, the report also indicated that the rates of subsidence, in general, are not expected to alter the surface topography. In this regard, EAC suggested that the preliminary assessment should be verified through field observations and OIL would pursue NRSC to use the latest available technology for Land Subsidence study for submission of final subsidence report. The recommendations of the final report shall be strictly adhered by the Oil India Ltd. (OIL) which shall be updated to the Ministry.

17. The EAC, constituted under the provision of the EIA Notification, 2006 and comprising of Experts Members/domain experts in various fields, have examined the proposal submitted by the Project Proponent in desired form along with the EMP report prepared and submitted by the Consultant accredited by the QCI/ NABET on behalf of the Project Proponent. The EAC noted that the Project Proponent has given undertaking that the data and information given in the application and enclosures are true to the best of his knowledge and belief and no information has been suppressed in the report. If any part of data/information submitted is found to be false/ misleading at any stage, the project will be rejected and Environmental Clearance given, if any, will be revoked at the risk and cost of the project proponent.

18. The Committee noted that the EIA/EMP report is in compliance of the ToR issued for the project, reflecting the present environmental concerns and the projected scenario for all the environmental components. The Committee has found the baseline data is within NAAQ standards. The Committee has deliberated the action plan proposed by the project proponent to arrest the incremental GLC due to the project. The Committee has also deliberated on the CER plan and found to be addressing the issues in the study area. The EAC has deliberated the proposal and has made due diligence in the process as notified under the provisions of the EIA Notification, 2006, as amended from time to time and accordingly made the recommendations to the proposal. The Experts Members of the EAC have found the proposal in order and have

recommended for grant of Environmental Clearance.

19. The Environmental Clearance granted to the project/activity is strictly under the provisions of the EIA Notification 2006 and its amendments. It does not tantamount/construe to approvals/consent/ permissions etc. required to be obtained or standards/conditions to be followed under any other Acts/ Rules/ Subordinate legislations, etc., as may be applicable to the project. The project proponent shall obtain necessary permission as mandated under the Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974 and the Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1981, as applicable from time to time, from the State Pollution Control Board, prior to construction & operation of the project.

20. Based on the proposal submitted by the project proponent and recommendations of the EAC (Industry-2), **the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change hereby accords environmental clearance to the project proposed Onshore Development Drilling & Production (25 Nos. Wells), Production Installations (02 nos.) with Associated Facilities in 210 Sq.Km Baghewala PML Block** located at Baghewala Village, Taluk Pokhran, District Jaisalmer & Bikaner, State Rajasthan by M/s. Oil India Limited, under the provisions of the EIA Notification, 2006, and the amendments therein, is subject to compliance of the terms and conditions enclosed in Annexure-1.

21. The Ministry reserves the right to stipulate additional conditions, if found necessary at subsequent stages and the project proponent shall implement all the said conditions in a time-bound manner. The Ministry may revoke or suspend the Environmental Clearance, if implementation of any of the above conditions is not found satisfactory.

22. Concealing factual data or submission of false/fabricated data and failure to comply with any of the conditions mentioned above may result in withdrawal of this clearance and attract action under the provisions of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986.

23. Any appeal against this environmental clearance shall lie with the National Green Tribunal, if preferred, within a period of 30 days as prescribed under Section 16 of the National Green Tribunal Act, 2010.

24. The above conditions will be enforced, inter-alia under the provisions of the Water (Prevention & Control of Pollution) Act, 1974, the Air (Prevention & Control of Pollution) Act, 1981, the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986, the Hazardous Waste (Management, Handling and Transboundary Movement) Rules, 2016 and the Public Liability Insurance Act, 1991 read with subsequent amendments therein.

25. This issues with the approval of the Competent Authority.

Specific EC Conditions for (Off-shore And Onshore Oil And Gas Exploration, Development And Production)

1. Off-shore And Onshore Oil And Gas Exploration, Development And Production

S. No	EC Conditions
1.1	The company shall comply with all the environmental protection measures and safeguards proposed in the documents submitted to the Ministry. The preliminary assessment submitted for land subsidence study should be verified through field observations and OIL would pursue NRSC to use the latest available technology for Land Subsidence study for submission of final subsidence report. The recommendations of the final report shall be strictly adhered by the Oil India Ltd. (OIL) and implemented as required within 06 months of the receipt of report, which shall be updated to the Ministry.
1.2	All the recommendations made in the EIA/EMP in respect of environmental management, and risk mitigation measures relating to the project shall be implemented (Annexure - 3 & 4).
1.3	No drilling activities shall be carried out within 500 m from the water bodies.
1.4	No pipelines or its part shall be laid in the Forest land/Protected Area without prior permission/approval from the Competent Authority.
1.5	Total fresh water requirement shall not exceed 25 m ³ /day per each drilling well location and will be met from IGNP water supply. Prior permission shall be obtained from the concerned regulatory authority.
1.6	The project proponent will treat and reuse the treated water within the factory and no waste or treated water shall be discharged outside the premises. Mobile ETP coupled with RO shall be installed to reuse the treated water in drilling system. Size of the waste pit shall be equal to the hole volume+ volume of drill cutting and volume of discarded mud if any. Two feet free board may be left to accommodate rainwater. There shall be separate storm water channel and rainwater shall not be allowed to mix with waste water. Alternatively, if possible, pit less drilling be practiced instead of above. Produced water generated shall be treated with in the premises as per the Standards for Liquid Effluent of Oil Drilling and Gas Extraction Industry notified in The Environment (Protection) Rules 1986 and shall not be discharged untreated anywhere or in any stream.
1.7	During production, storage and handling, the fugitive emission of methane, if any, shall be monitored using Infra-red camera/ appropriate technology. No flaring shall be carried out during operation phase.
1.8	The project proponent also to ensure trapping/storing of the CO ₂ generated, if any, during the process and handling.
1.9	Approach road shall be paved to minimize generation of suspended dust.
1.10	The project proponent shall make all arrangements for control of noise from the drilling activity. Acoustic enclosure shall be provided for the DG sets along with the adequate stack height as per CPCB guidelines.
1.11	The company shall construct the garland drain to prevent runoff of any oil containing waste into the nearby water bodies. Separate drainage system shall be created for oil contaminated and non-oil contaminated.
1.12	Drill cuttings separated from drilling fluid shall be adequately washed and disposed in HDPE lined pit. Waste mud shall be tested for hazardous contaminants and disposed according to

	HWMH Rules, 2016. No effluent/drilling mud shall be discharged/disposed off into nearby surface water bodies. The company shall comply with the guidelines for disposal of solid waste, drill cutting and drilling fluids for onshore drilling operation notified vide GSR.546(E) dated 30th August, 2005. Industry shall obtain membership of TSDF site before obtaining CTO and shall dispose the hazardous waste generated at drill site to TSDF approved by GPCB.
1.13	Oil spillage prevention and mitigation scheme shall be prepared. In case of oil spillage/contamination, action plan shall be prepared to clean the site by adopting proven technology. The recyclable waste (oily sludge) and spent oil shall be disposed of to the authorized recyclers.
1.14	Gas produced during testing shall be flared with appropriate flaring device as prescribed by the CPCB. The flare shall be designed as per good oil field practices and OISD guidelines. The stack height shall be provided as per the regulatory requirements and emission from the stacks will meet MOEFCC/CPCB guidelines.
1.15	The project proponent shall take necessary measures to prevent fire hazards, containing oil spill and soil remediation as needed. At fixed installations or plants use of ground flare shall be explored. At the place of ground flaring, the overhead flaring stack with knockout drums shall be installed to minimize gaseous emissions during operation.
1.16	The project proponent shall develop a contingency plan for H ₂ S release including all necessary aspects from evacuation to resumption of normal operations. The workers shall be provided with personal H ₂ S detectors in locations of high risk of exposure along with self-containing breathing apparatus.
1.17	Blow Out Preventer system shall be installed to prevent well blowouts during drilling operations.
1.18	On completion of the project, necessary measures shall be taken for safe plugging of wells with secured enclosures to restore the drilling site to the original condition. The same shall be confirmed by the concerned regulatory authority from environment safety angle. In case of hydrocarbon not found economically viable, a full abandonment plan shall be implemented for the drilling site in accordance with the applicable DGH / Indian Petroleum Regulations.
1.19	PP proposed to allocate Rs. 3.71 Crores towards extended EMP which shall be spent as submitted as per plan. Further, all the proposed activities under extended EMP shall be completed before the commissioning of the plant in consultation with District Administration. PP proposed to allocate Rs. 7.135 Crores to address all the issues raised in Public Hearing. All the commitments made in Public Hearing shall be completed within 3 years (Annexure -5).
1.20	No lead acid batteries shall be utilized in the project/site.
1.21	Occupational health surveillance of the workers shall be carried out as per the prevailing Acts and Rules. All workers & employees shall be provided with required safety kits/mask for personal protection.
1.22	Oil content in the drill cuttings shall be monitored and report & shall sent to the Ministry's Regional Office.
1.23	The project proponent shall prepare operating manual in respect of all activities, which would

	cover all safety & environment related issues and measures to be taken for protection. One set of environmental manual shall be made available at the drilling site/ project site. Awareness shall be created at each level of the management. All the schedules and results of environmental monitoring shall be available at the project site office. Remote monitoring of site should be done.
1.24	PP shall sensitize and create awareness among the people working within the project area as well as its surrounding area on the ban of Single Use Plastic in order to ensure the compliance of Notification published by MOEFCC on 12th August, 2021. A report along with photographs on the measures taken shall also be included in the six-monthly compliance report being submitted to concerned authority.

1. General Conditions

1.1	No further expansion or modifications in the plant, other than mentioned in the EIA Notification, 2006 and its amendments, shall be carried out without prior approval of the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change/SEIAA, as applicable. In case of deviations or alterations in the project proposal from those submitted to this Ministry for clearance, a fresh reference shall be made to the Ministry/SEIAA, as applicable, to assess the adequacy of conditions imposed and to add additional environmental protection measures required, if any.
1.2	The energy source for lighting purpose shall be preferably LED based, or advanced having preference in energy conservation and environment betterment.
1.3	The overall noise levels in and around the plant area shall be kept well within the standards by providing noise control measures including acoustic hoods, silencers, enclosures etc. on all sources of noise generation. This shall be advertised within seven days from the date of issue of the clearance letter, at least in two local newspapers that are widely circulated in the region of which one shall be in the vernacular language of the locality concerned and a copy of the same shall be forwarded to the concerned Regional Office of the Ministry.
1.10	The project authorities shall inform the Regional Office as well as the Ministry, the date of financial closure and final approval of the project by the concerned authorities and the date of start of the project.
