13.1	Packing of goods must be sufficiently robust to withstand multiple handling during transit for delivery to their final destination so that contents do not get damaged. Protection of the plant and equipment against corrosion or deterioration must be given special attention.	
13.2	Machined steel and iron parts are to be heavily greased / varnished as a prevention against rust.	
13.3	In the case of internal combustion engines, compressors and similar equipment, internal parts are to be sprayed with an inhibitor or water splitting preservative and all openings covered with tape/ cap to prevent ingress of water.	
13.4	Boxes / Packing cases containing electrical / electronic equipment are to be waterproof lined.	
13.5	All items must have their respective identification marks painted / embossed on them.

Once the hook sling is securely fastened complying to the safety instructions, OIL's Crane shall lift and unload tubulars from the vehicle. Following points are to be noted and complied in this connection: (i) Supplier to ensure that height of the loaded tubular is below the cabin height of the vehicle for safe off-loading. (ii) Supplier to ensure that tubular bundles are securely fastened by very strong material to withstand the rigors of road transportation and capable of lifting by Crane. In terms of GeM GTC clause 26 regarding Restrictions on procurement from a bidder of a country which shares a land border with India, any bidder from a country which shares a land border with India will be eligible to bid in this tender only if the bidder is registered with the Competent Authority. While participating in bid, Bidder has to undertake compliance of this and any false declaration and non-compliance of this would be a ground for immediate termination of the contract and further legal action in accordance with the laws.
