INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

AA : SPECIAL NOTES TO BIDDERS:

- 1(a) **Pre-Bid Conference**: A Pre-Bid Conference is planned to be held at E&D Directorate, Oil India Limited, NBCC Centre,5th Floor, Plot No.2,Okhla Phase-I, New Delhi-110020 on 24.04.2019 at 11-00 hrs., to explain the requirements of Company in details to the interested prospective bidders and to understand bidders' perspective including exchange of views/clarifications, if any, on Scope of Work and other terms and conditions of the tender. Bidders interested to attend the pre-bid conference must send email confirmation regarding their participation in the pre-bid conference along with their queries latest by 18.04.2019 at the e-mail address: aparna_doley@oilindia.in (for commercial matters) & abashishpal@oilindia.in & mousumideka@oilindia.in (for technical matters).
- 1(b) Maximum two(2) representatives from each prospective bidder shall be allowed to participate in the pre-bid conference. All costs associated to attend the pre-bid conference by their representatives shall be borne by the bidders.
- 1(c) The prospective bidders may submit their queries, if envisaged, against the tender conditions through e-mails to the above mentioned e-mail address at least one week prior to pre-bid conference. OIL expects that the bidders should comply to the tender conditions in toto. However, clarifications/exceptions/deviations, if required any, should be brought out by the bidders prior to or during the pre-bid conference only. After processing/discussing these suggestions, as a sequel to the pre-bid conference, Company shall communicate the changes in this regard, if agreed, through an addendum to the tender document in e-portal.

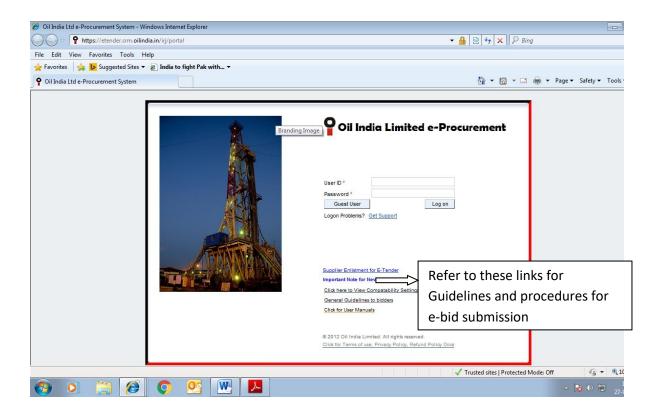
BB: GENERAL NOTES TO BIDDERS:

- 1.0
- a) Bidders without having E-tender Login ID and Password should complete their online registration at least seven (7) days prior to the scheduled bid closing date and time of the tender. For online registration, Bidder may visit the OIL's E-tender site https://etender.srm.oilindia.in/irj/portal.
- b) Necessary Login ID & Password will be issued by OIL only after submitting the complete online registration by the Bidder. In the event of late registration/incomplete registration by Bidder, OIL INDIA LIMITED shall not be responsible for late allotment of User ID & Password and request for bid closing date extension on that plea shall not be entertained by Company.
- c) MSEs Units (manufacturers/Service Providers only and not their dealers/distributors) who are already registered with District Industry Centers or Khadi & Village Industries Commission or Khadi & Village Industries Board or Coir Board or National Small Industries Corporation or Directorate of Handicrafts & Handloom or any other body specified by Ministry of MSME are exempted from payment of Bid Security (EMD) irrespective of monetary limit mentioned in their registration, provided they are registered for the item they intend to quote/participate.
- d) For availing benefits under Public Procurement Policy (Purchase preference & EMD exemption), the interested MSE Bidders must ensure that they are the manufacturer/service provider of tendered item(s) and registered with the appropriate authority for

the said item(s). Bids without EMD shall be rejected, if the technical offer does not include a valid copy of relevant MSE Certificate issued by appropriate authority specifying the item as per tender. Therefore, it is in the interest of such MSE Vendors to furnish a copy of complete certificate to the concerned tender handling officer of OIL at least seven (7) days prior to the scheduled Bid Closing Date of the tender; seeking clarification/confirmation as to whether their registered item is eligible for EMD exemption or not. Late communication in this regard and request for bid closing date extension on that plea shall not be entertained by Company.

- 2.0 Submission of Bid Security/EMD/Performance Bank Guarantee Must be paid either through online mode or Submission of Bank Guarantee/LC only. No DD/Cheques/Cashier Cheque or any other mode will be acceptable.
- 3.0 The tender will be governed by "General Terms & Conditions" for e-Procurement as per Booklet No. MM/GLOBAL/E-01/2005 for E-procurement (ICB Tenders) including Amendments & Addendum to "General Terms & Conditions" for e-Procurement.
- 4.0 Bid must be submitted online through OIL's e-procurement portal. Bid submitted in any other form will be rejected.
- 5.0 Please note that all tender forms and supporting documents are to be submitted through OIL's e-Procurement site only except the following documents, which are to be submitted manually in sealed envelope (super scribing tender no. and bid closing date) to DGM(C&P), E&D Directorate, NBCC Centre, 5th floor, Plot No.2, okhla Phase-I, New Delhi-110020, on or before 14:00 hrs (IST) on the Bid Closing Date mentioned in the Tender:
 - a) Original Bid Security along with two duplicate copies of Bid Security.
- b) Any other documents which have been particularly asked for in this tender for submission.
- 6.0 Bidders must ensure that their bid is uploaded in the system before the tender closing date and time. Also, they must ensure that above documents which are to be submitted in a sealed envelope are also submitted at the above mentioned address before the bid closing date and time, failing which the offer shall be rejected.
- 7.0 The tender is invited under SINGLE STAGE-TWO BID SYSTEM. The bidder has to submit both the "TECHNO-COMMERCIAL UNPRICED BID" and "PRICED BID" through electronic form in the OIL's e-Tender portal within the Bid Closing Date and Time stipulated in the e-Tender. The "Techno-commercial Unpriced Bid" shall contain all technical and commercial details except the prices which shall be kept blank. Details of prices as per Bid format / Commercial bid to be uploaded as attachment in the Attachment Tab "Notes and Attachments". Any offer not complying with above submission procedure will be rejected as per Bid Rejection Criteria mentioned in the tender.

Bidders are requested to go through OIL's e – Portal / Website before uploading their bids for updated information regarding participation requirements, guidelines and procedure for OIL's e – tenders. A screen shot of the OIL's e-portal is given below for ready reference:



Please do refer "NEW INSTRUCTION TO BIDDER FOR SUBMISSION" for the above two points and also please refer "New Vendor Manual (effective from 12.04.2017)" available in the above login Page of the OIL's E-tender Portal.

- 8.0 In Technical Bid opening, only Technical Rfx will be opened. Therefore, the bidder should ensure that "TECHNO-COMMERCIAL UNPRICED BID should contain details as mentioned in the technical specifications as well as BEC/ BRC and upload the same in the Technical Rfx Response-> User > Technical Bid. No price should be given in above Technical Rfx otherwise the offer will be rejected. Please go through the help document in details before uploading the document and ensure uploading of technical bid in the Technical Rfx Response-> User > Technical Bid only. The "PRICE BID" must contain the price schedule and the bidder's commercial terms and conditions. Details of prices as per Bid format / Commercial bid can be uploaded as Attachment under the attachment option under "Notes & Attachments".
- 9.0 PRICED BIDS OF ONLY THOSE BIDDERS WILL BE OPENED WHOSE OFFERS ARE FOUND TO BE TECHNO-COMMERCIALLY ACCEPTABLE.
- 10.0 Bidders are requested to examine all instructions, forms, terms and specifications in the bid. Failure to furnish all information required as per the bid or submission of offers not substantially responsive to the bid in every respect will be at the bidders risk and may result in rejection of its offer without seeking any clarifications.
- 11.0 Please mention clearly in your quotation the Net. Weight, Gross Weight & Volume, Indian Agent's Name and its Commission, Payment Terms, Ocean Freight/Air Freight Charges, Port of Loading, Delivery period, Country of origin with manufacturer's name, etc.
- 12.0 To ascertain the substantial responsiveness of the bid, OIL reserves the right to ask the bidder for clarification in respect of clauses covered under BRC also and such clarifications fulfilling the BRC clauses in toto must be received on or before the

deadline given by OIL, failing which the offer will be summarily rejected.

- 13.0 Other terms and conditions of the tender shall be as per "General Terms & Conditions" for e- Procurement as per Booklet No. MM/GLOBAL/E-01/2005 for E-procurement (ICB Tenders). However, if any of the Clauses of the Bid Rejection Criteria (BRC) / Bid Evaluation Criteria (BEC) mentioned here contradict the Clauses in the "General Terms & Conditions" for e-Procurement as per Booklet No. MM/GLOBAL/E-01/2005 for E-procurement (ICB Tenders) of the tender and/or elsewhere, those mentioned in this BEC / BRC shall prevail.
- 14.0 All the Bids must be Digitally Signed using "Class 3" digital certificate (ecommerce application) only as per Indian IT Act obtained from the licensed Certifying Authorities operating under the Root Certifying Authority of India (RCAI), Controller of Certifying Authorities (CCA) of India. The bid signed using other than "Class 3" digital certificate, will be liable for rejection.
- 15.0 Please do refer the User Manual provided on the portal on the procedure How to create Response for submitting offer.
- 16.0 Bidders to note that Govt. of India under Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises Development (MSMED) Act 2006, has proclaimed the Public Procurement Policy, 2012 with effect from 1st April, 2012 in respect of procurement of goods and services, produced and provided by micro and small enterprises, by its Ministries, Departments and Public Sector Undertakings for promotion and development of Micro and Small Enterprises. A new Clause on applicability of Public Procurement Policy for procurement of goods from Micro and Small Enterprises (MSE) in the tender is furnished vide Amendment to General Terms and Conditions for Global Tender (MM/GLOBAL/E-01/2005). Bidders are requested to take note of the same and to submit their offers accordingly.
- 17.0 The items shall be brand new, unused & of prime quality. The manufacturer shall warrant (in the event of an order) that the product supplied will be free from all defects & fault in material, workmanship & manufacture and shall be in full conformity with ordered specifications. This clause shall be valid for 18 months from date of shipment or 12 months from date of commissioning and handing over to OIL, whichever is earlier. The defective materials, if any, rejected by OIL shall be replaced by the supplier at their own expense. Bidders must confirm the same in their quotations.
- 18.0 Quantity of Individual item may be increased or decrease at the time of final placement of order. The minimum FOB/FCA charges in case of partial order for reduced quantity/enhanced quantity shall have to be indicated by the bidder. In case, this is not indicated specifically, the charges quoted would be pro-rata calculated and the same will be binding on the bidder.
- 19.0 Any deviation(s) from the tender specification should be clearly highlighted specifying justification in support of deviation.
- 20.0 The Integrity Pact is applicable against this tender .OIL shall be entering into an Integrity Pact with the bidders as per format enclosed in this tender document. This Integrity Pact proforma has been duly signed digitally by OIL's competent signatory. The proforma has to be returned by the bidder (along with the technical bid) duly signed (digitally) by the same signatory who signed the bid, i.e., who is duly authorized to sign the bid. Uploading the Integrity Pact with digital signature will be construed that all pages of the Integrity Pact has been signed by the bidder's authorized signatory who sign the Bid. If any bidder refuses to sign Integrity Pact or declines to submit Integrity Pact with the offer, their bid shall be rejected straightway.

21.0 Original Bid Closing Date shall be considered by OIL for evaluation of BRC Criteria in case of any extension of the original bid closing date.

22.0 Performance Security clause (Clause No. 10.0 of Section-A) of "General Terms & Conditions for Global Tenders (MM/GLOBAL/01/2005" has been amended and the new clause is detailed in the Amendment dated 25.04.2016 issued to MM/GLOBAL/01/2005. Successful bidder will be required to furnish a Performance Bank Guarantee @10% of the order value. Bidders to note the same and to confirm its acceptance in their offers.

23.0 Bidder to sign and submit completely filled up <u>Commercial Check List</u> enclosed as APPENDIX-A3 with the tender, failing which their offer will be rejected.

24.0 Payment Terms:

24.1 70% of the material value will be released on receipt of ordered materials at E&D Directorate, OKHLA, New Delhi & satisfactory physical inspection of the materials by OIL & proof of dispatch of material along with other relevant documents as indicated in the tender document.

- 24.2 25% of the material value along plus Installation & commissioning charges will be released after successful installation & commissioning of the entire solution and issue of a certificate of acceptance of the System as per scope of work / specifications.
- 24.3 Balance 5% of the material value will be released on completion of 1(one) year warranty, after successfully fulfilling warranty conditions as per Warranty Terms (clause-10 of Section -IV), for first year.
- 24.4 **Payment of AMC Charges**: AMC charges quoted will be paid quarterly after successful completion of each quarter i.e. payment @ 25% of AMC charges will be released at the end of each quarter of each year with Penalty deductions, as per the terms and conditions of AMC.

Bidders must confirm the same while quoting.

- 25.0 **Liquidated Damage**: Refer to "General Terms & Conditions" for e- Procurement as per Booklet No. MM/GLOBAL/E-01/2005 for E-procurement (ICB Tenders). The applicable GST on the Liquidated Damage shall have to be borne by the seller. Accordingly, the Liquidated Damage shall be recovered from the seller along with applicable GST.
- 26.0 The items covered in this Tender is not eligible for concessional customs duty

and concessional GST.

Overseas Bidders are not required to include Customs Duty and IGST components in their quoted cost, since all applicable taxes & Duties in India shall be to the account of Oil India Limited.

- 27.0 Bidders to note that Ministry of Petroleum & Natural Gas, Government of India implemented PPLC Policy to provide Purchase Preference (linked with local content) by notification no. Ref. O-27011/44/2016-ONG-II/FP dtd.25.04.2017. Bidders are requested to take note of the same and to submit their offers accordingly wherever applicable. Policy details are available in **APPENDIX-A2.**
- 28.1 In case of placement of order, OIL reserves the right to convert the order from FOB Port of export to C&F Kolkata term considering the ocean freight quoted by the party in their offer. In case the order is converted to C&F Kolkata Port, the performance security amount shall also be enhanced considering the quoted ocean freight charges.
- 28.2 Bidder should confirm in their quotation that in case of C&F order, their nominated freight forwarder should provide Delivery Order under Single Window facility having office of local agent in India at Kolkata and offer 14 days free detention time of containers at discharging port.
- 29.0 Along with the technical bid, bidders must submit duly filled undertaking as per format provided vide **APPENDIX-A1** as undertaking towards submission of authentic information/documents.
- 30.0 Clauses related to GST:
- 1. For the purposes of levy and imposition of GST, the expressions shall have the following meanings:
- (a) GST means any tax imposed on the supply of goods and/or services under GST Law.
- (b) Cess means any applicable cess, existing or future on the supply of Goods and Services as per Goods and Services Tax (Compensation to States) Act, 2017.
- (c) GST Law means IGST Act 2017, CGST Act 2017, UTGST Act, 2017 and SGST Act, 2017 and all related ancillary Rules and Notifications issued in this regard from time to time.
- 2. The rates quoted by the bidders shall be inclusive of all taxes, duties and levies. However, bidders are required to provide separately the rate and amount of all types of taxes, duties and levies. In case, the quoted information related to various taxes, duties & levies subsequently proves wrong, incorrect or misleading, OIL will have no liability to reimburse the difference in the duty/ tax, if the finally assessed amount is on the higher side and OIL will have to right to recover the difference in case the rate of duty/ taxes finally assessed is on the lower side. Further, bidders have to clearly show the amount of GST separately in the Tax Invoices. Further, it is the responsibility of the bidders to make all possible efforts to make their accounting / IT system GST compliant in order to ensure availability of Input Tax Credit (ITC) to Oil India Ltd.
- 3. Offers without giving any of the details of the taxes (Including rates and amounts) as specified above will be considered as inclusive of all taxes including GST. When a bidder mentions taxes as extra without specifying the rates & amount, the offer will be loaded with maximum value towards taxes received against the tender for comparison purposes. If the bidder emerges as lowest bidder after such loading, in the event of

order on that bidder, taxes mentioned by OIL on the Purchase Order/ Contracts will be binding on the bidder.

- 4. Bidders are required to pass on the benefit arising out of introduction of GST, including seamless flow of Input Tax Credit, reduction in Tax Rate on inputs as well as final goods by way of reduction of price as contemplated in the provision relating to Anti-Profiteering Measure vide Section 171 of the CGST Act, 2017. Accordingly, for supplies made under GST, the bidders should confirm that benefit of lower costs has been passed on to OIL by way of lower prices/taxes and also provide details of the same as applicable. OIL reserves the right to examine such details about costs of inputs/input services of the bidders to ensure that the intended benefits of GST have been passed on to OIL.
- 5. Oil India Ltd. shall declare the value of free issue of materials and services, if any, involved in the execution of the contract. The Contractor should consider the same while working out the GST liability, if any. Further in cases where GST is leviable on any facilities provided by OIL and used by bidders and the consideration for which is recovered by OIL in the form of reduction in the invoice raised by bidders then OIL will raise GST invoices on such transactions and the same will be reimbursed by bidders.
- 6. When Input tax credit is available for Set Off Evaluation of L-1 prices shall be done based on Quoted price after deduction of Input Tax Credit (ITC) of GST, if available to OIL.OIL shall evaluate the offers on the basis of the quoted rates only and any claim subsequently by the bidders for additional payment/liability shall not be admitted and has to be borne by the bidders.
- 7. When Input tax credit is NOT available for Set Off Evaluation of L-1 prices shall be done based on Quoted price only. OIL shall evaluate the offers on the basis of the quoted rates only and any claim subsequently by the bidders for additional payment/liability shall not be admitted and has to be borne by the bidders 7. Bidders agree to do all things not limited to providing GST compliant Tax Invoices or other documentation as per GST law relating to the supply of goods and/or services covered in the instant contract like raising of and /or acceptance or rejection of credit notes / debit notes as the case may be, payment of taxes, timely filing of valid statutory Returns for the tax period on the Goods and Service Tax Network (GSTN), submission of general information as and when called for by OIL in the customized format shared by OIL in order to enable OIL to update its database etc. that may be necessary to match the invoices on GSTN common portal and enable OIL to claim input tax credit in relation to any GST payable under this Contract or in respect of any supply under this Contract.
- 8. In case Input Tax Credit of GST is denied or demand is recovered from OIL by the Central / State Authorities on account of any non-compliance by bidders, including non-payment of GST charged and recovered, the Vendor/Supplier/Contractor shall indemnify OIL in respect of all claims of tax, penalty and/or interest, loss, damages, costs, expenses and liability that may arise due to such non-compliance. OIL, at its discretion, may also withhold/recover such disputed amount from the pending payments of the bidders.
- 31 For convenience of the Bidders and to improve transparency, the rates/cost quoted by bidders against OIL's e-tenders shall be available for online viewing by such Bidders whose price bids are opened by Company. A Bidder can view item-wise rates/costs of all other such peer bidders against the tender immediately after price bid opening, if the e-tender is floated by Company with PRICE CONDITION. In case the Price-Bid is invited by Company through attachment from under "Notes & Attachment" (i.e. NO PRICE CONDITION), Bidders must upload their detailed Price-Bid as per the prescribed format under "NOTES & ATTACHMENT", in addition to filling up

the "TOTAL BID VALUE" tab taking into account the cost of all individual line items and other applicable charges like freight, tax, duties, levies etc. Under NO PRICE condition (i.e. Price Bid in attachment form), the "Total Bid Value" as calculated & quoted by the Bidder shall only be shared amongst the eligible bidders and Company will not assume any responsibility whatsoever towards calculation errors/omissions therein, if any. Notwithstanding to sharing the "Total Bid Value" or the same is whether filled up by the Bidder or not, Company will evaluate the cost details to ascertain the inter-se-ranking of bidders strictly as per the uploaded attachment and Bid Evaluation Criteria only. Online view of prices as above shall be available to the Bidders only upto seven days from the date of Price-Bid opening of the e-tender.

BID REJECTION CRITERIA (BRC) / BID EVALUATION CRITERIA (BEC)

The bids shall conform to the specifications and terms & conditions given in the Tender. Bids shall be rejected in case the items offered do not conform to the required parameters stipulated in the technical specifications and to the relevant international/national standards wherever stipulated. Notwithstanding the general conformity of the bids to the stipulated specifications and terms & conditions, the following requirements must be particularly met by the bidders, without which the offer shall be considered as non-responsive and rejected:

(1.0) BID REJECTION CRITERIA (BRC) (Technical):

1.1 The bidder must be either

OEM(Original Equipment Manufacturer) of the offered 3D Stereoscopic Display Screen and Display Management System

OR

Public Procurement Policy for Micro and Small Enterprises (MSEs)

Government of India, vide Gazette of India no.503 dated 26.03.2012 has proclaimed the Public Procurement Policy on procurement of goods and services from Micro & Small Enterprises (MSEs) by all Central Ministries/Departments/PSUs for promotion and development of Micro and Small Enterprises. In case of more than one such Micro and Small Enterprises, the supply shall be shared equally subject to matching the L1 price.

The government vide office memorandum no. 21(1)/2014-MA dated 12.02.2015 have intimated that in the situation of L-1+15% and subsequent matching of L-1 price, CPSUs may take more than 20% supplies from micro and small enterprises as per their previous procurement pattern on case to case basis for which the Ministry has no objection.

If a bidder seeks free of cost tender document under the MSE policy, then it shall be considered that the bidder has sought benefit against the MSE policy and this option once exercised cannot be modified subsequently.
- 2. Bidders seeking Purchase preference (linked with local content) (PP-LC) shall be required to meet / exceed the target of Local Content (LC) of 30%

The LC limits shall be linked with date of TBO (Technical Bid Opening) of tender. For a tender due to open between 01.04.18 and 31.03.20, LC limit mentioned for 2018-20 shall be applicable. Similarly for a tender opening between 01.04.2020 to 31.03.2022, LC limits mentioned therein shall be applicable).

2.1 Such bidders shall furnish following undertaking on its letter head along with their techno-commercial bid. The undertaking shall become a part of the contract.

- 2.3 At the bidding stage the bidder shall provide Break-up of "Local Component" and "Imported Component" in the prescribed format enclosed as Enclosure III of the policy document of the policy and shall be uploaded by the bidders along with their price bid in the e-procurement portal.
- 3. Eligible (techno-commercially qualified) LC bidder shall be granted a purchase preference to 10% i.e. where the evaluated price is within 10% of the evaluated lowest price of Non Local Content (NLC) bidder, other things being equal. Accordingly, purchase preference shall be granted to the eligible (techno-commercially qualified) LC bidder concerned, at the lowest valid i.e. NLC price bid.
- 3.1 Only those LC bidders whose bids are within 10% of the NLC L1 bid would be allowed an opportunity to match L1 bid. All the eligible LC bidders shall be asked to submit their confirmation to match their price in sealed envelopes. Envelopes of the bidders shall be opened and award for the prescribed quantity shall be made to the lowest evaluated TA/CA (Techno- Commercial Acceptable) bidder among the eligible LC bidders. In case the lowest eligible LC bidder fails to match L1 price, the next eligible LC bidder will be awarded the prescribed quantity and so on. In case none of the eligible LC bidders matches the L1 bid, the actual bidder holding L1 price will secure the order.
- 4. Order for supply of 50% of the tendered quantity would be awarded to the lowest techno-commercially qualified LC bidder, subject to matching with valid NLC L1 price. The remaining will be awarded to L1 (i.e. NLC bidder). Prescribed 50% tenderec quantity for LC bidders shall not be further sub-divided among eligible LC bidders.
- 4.1 However, if L1 bidder happens to be a LC bidder, the entire procurement value shall be awarded to such bidder.
- 4.2 The tendered quantity is not split-able / non-dividable / cannot be procured from multiple sources. Hence, the entire procurement value shall be awarded to the lowest technocommercially qualified LC bidder subject to matching with valid NLC L1 rates.
- 5. For the purpose of this policy, all terms used vide aforesaid policy shall be governed by the definitions specified at para 2 of the policy document notified by MoPNG vide letter No. O-27011/44/2015-ONG-II/FP dated 25.04.2017.
- 6. The successful bidder shall be obliged to fulfill the requirements of quality and delivery

time in accordance with the provisions of the Purchase order/contract.

- 7. OIL shall have the right to satisfy itself of the production capability and product quality of the manufacturer.
- 8.0 Determination of LC
- 8.1 LC of Services shall be calculated on the basis of the ratio of service cost of domestic component in service to the total cost of services.
- The total cost of service shall be constituted of the cost spent for rendering of service covering:
- a) Cost of component (material), which is used.
- b) Manpower and consultant cost, cost of working equipment/facility, and
- c) General service cost, excluding profit, company overhead cost, taxes and duties.
- 8.3 The criteria for determination of cost of local content in the service shall be as under:
- a) In the case of material being used to help the provision of service, based on country of origin.
- b) In the case of manpower and consultant based on INR component of the services contract.
- c) In the case of working equipment/facility, based on country of origin and
- d) In the case of general service cost, based on the criteria as mentioned in clauses a, b and c above.
- e) Indian flag vessels in operation as on date.
- 8.4 Determination of Local Content: The determination of local content of the working equipment/facility shall be based on the following provision.

Working equipment produced in the country is valued as 100% (one hundred percent) local content, working equipment produced abroad is valued as much as nil (0% percent) local contend.

9.0 Calculation of LC and Reporting

- 9.1 LC shall be calculated on the basis of verifiable data. In the case of data used in the calculation of LC verifiable, the value of LC of the said component shall be treated as nil.
- 9.2 Formats for the calculation of LC of services may be seen at Enclosure-III of the policy document.
- 10.0 Certification and Verification
- 10.1 Bidder seeking Purchase Preference under the policy, shall be obliged to verify the LC of goods as follows:

10.1.2 At bidding stage:

- a) Price Break-up
- (i) The bidder shall provide break-up of "Local Component" and "Imported Component" along with the price bid as per provisions under clause 2.3.
- (ii) Bidder must have LC in excess of the specified requirement.
- b) Undertaking by the bidder
- i. The bidder shall submit undertaking along with the techno-commercial bid as per clause no.2.1, such undertaking shall become a part of the contract.
- ii. Bidder shall also submit the list of items / services to be procured from Indiar manufacturers / service providers.
- c) Statutory Auditor's Certificate

The Undertaking submitted by the bidder shall be supported by a certificate from Statutory Auditor as per clause 2.2.

10.1.3 After Contract Award

- a) In the case of procurement cases with the value less than Rs. 5 crore (Rupees Five Crore), the LC content may be calculated (self-assessment) by the contractor and certified by the Director/Authorized Representative of the Company.
- b) The verification of the procurement cases with the value Rupees Five Crore and above shall be carried out by a Statutory Auditor engaged by the bidder.
- 10.2 Each supplier shall provide the necessary local content documentation to the statutory auditor, which shall review and determine the local content requirements have been me

and issue of local content certificate to that effect on behalf of OIL, stating the percentage of local content in the good or service measured. The Auditor shall keep all necessary information obtained from suppliers for measurement of Local Content confidential.

- The Local Content certificate shall be submitted along with each invoice raised. However, the % of local content may vary with invoice while maintaining the overall % of Local Content for the total work/purchase of the pro-rata Local Content requirement. Ir case, it is not satisfied cumulatively in the invoices raised up to that stage, the supplier shall indicate how the local content requirement would be met in the subsequent stages.
- 10.4 Where currency quoted by the bidder is other than Indian Rupee then the bidder claiming benefits under PP-LC shall consider exchange rate prevailing on the date of notice inviting tender (NIT) for the calculation of Local Content.
- OIL shall have the authority to audit as well as witness production processes to certify the achievement of the requisite local content.
- 11 Sanctions
- 11.1 OIL shall impose sanction on bidder not fulfilling LC of goods/services in accordance with the value mentioned in certificate of LC.
- 11.2 The sanctions may be in the form of written warning, financial penalty and blacklisting.
- 11.3 If the bidder does not fulfill his obligation after the expiration of the period specified in such warning. OIL shall initiate action for blacklisting such bidder/ successful bidder.
- 11.4 A bidder who has been awarded the contract after availing Purchase Preference is found to have violated the LC provision, in the execution of the procurement contract of goods and/or services shall be subject to financial penalty over and above the PBG value prescribed in the contract and shall not be more than an amount equal to 10% of the Contract Price.
- 11.4.1 In pursuance of the clause No.11.4 above, towards fulfillment of conditions pertaining to Local Contents in accordance with the value mentioned in the certificate of LC, the bidder shall have to submit additional Bank Guarantee (format attached at Enclosure B) equivalent to the amount of PBG.

INTEGRITY PACT

Between

Oil India Limited (OIL) hereinafter referred to as "The Principal"

And

(Name of the bidder)......hereinafter referred to as "The Bidder/Contractor"

Preamble:

In order to achieve these goals, the Principal cooperates with the renowned international Non-Governmental Organization "Transparency International" (TI). Following TI's national and international experience, the Principal will appoint an external independent Monitor who will monitor the tender process and the execution of the contract for compliance with the principles mentioned above.

Section: 1 -Commitments of the Principal

- (1) The Principal commits itself to take all measures necessary to prevent corruption and to observe the following principles:
 - 1. No employee of the Principal, personally or through family members, will in connection with the tender for, or the execution of a contract, demand, take a promise for or accept, for him/herself or third person, any material or immaterial benefit which he/she is not legally entitled to.
 - 2. The Principal will, during the tender process treat all Bidders with equity and reason. The Principal will in particular, before and during the tender process, provide to all Bidders the same information and will not provide to any Bidder confidential/additional information through which the Bidder could obtain an advantage in relation to the tender process or the contract execution.
 - 3. The Principal will exclude from the process all known prejudiced persons.
- (2) If the Principal obtains information on the conduct of any of its employees which is a criminal offence under the relevant Anti-Corruption Laws of India, or if

there be a Page 2 of 6 substantive suspicion in this regard, the Principal will inform its Vigilance Office and in addition can initiate disciplinary actions.

Section: 2 -Commitments of the Bidder/Contractor

- (1) The Bidder/Contractor commits itself to take all measures necessary to prevent corruption. He commits himself to observe the following principles during his participation in the tender process and during the contract execution.
 - 1. The Bidder/Contractor will not, directly or through any other person or firm, offer, promise or give to any of the Principal's employees involved in the tender process or the execution of the contract or to any third person any material or immaterial benefit which he/she is not legally entitled to, in order to obtain in exchange any advantage of any kind whatsoever during the tender process or during the execution of the contract.
 - 2. The Bidder/Contractor will not enter with other Bidders into any undisclosed agreement or understanding, whether formal or informal. This applies in particular to prices, specifications, certifications, Subsidiary contracts, submission or non-submission of bids or any other actions to restrict competitiveness or to introduce cartelization in the bidding process.
 - 3. The Bidder/Contractor will not commit any offence under the relevant Anticorruption Laws of India; further the Bidder/Contractor will not use improperly, for purposes of competition or personal gain, or pass on to others, any information or document provided by the Principal as part of the business relationship, regarding plans, technical proposals and business details, including information contained or transmitted electronically.
 - 4. The Bidder/Contractor will, when presenting his bid, disclose any and all payments he has made, is committed to or intends to make to agents, brokers or any other intermediaries in connection with the award of the contract.
- (2) The Bidder/Contractor will not instigate third persons to commit offences outlined above or be an accessory to such offences.
- (3) The Bidder/Contractor signing Integrity Pact shall not approach the Courts while representing the matters to IEMs and he/she will await their decision in the matter.

Section 3 -Disqualification from tender process and exclusion from future Contracts

If the Bidder, before contract award has committed a transgression through a violation of Section 2 or in any other form such as to put his reliability or risibility as Bidder into question, the Principal is entitled to disqualify the Bidder from the tender process or to terminate the contract, if already signed, for such reason.

- 1. If the Bidder/Contractor has committed a transgression through a violation of Section 2 such as to put his reliability or credibility into question, the Principal is entitled also to exclude the Bidder/Contractor from future contract award processes. The imposition and duration of the exclusion will be determined by the severity of the transgression. The severity will be determined by the circumstances of the case, in particular the number of transgressions, the position of the transgressions within the company hierarchy of the Bidder and the amount of the damage. The exclusion will be imposed for a minimum of 6 months and maximum of 3 years.
- 2. The Bidder accepts and undertakes to respect and uphold the Principal's Absolute right to resort to and impose such exclusion and further accepts and undertakes not to challenge or question such exclusion on any ground, including the lack of any hearing before the decision to resort to such exclusion is taken. This undertaking is given freely and after obtaining independent legal advice.
- 3. If the Bidder/Contractor can prove that he has restored/recouped the Damage caused by him and has installed a suitable corruption prevention system, the Principal may revoke the exclusion prematurely.
- 4. A transgression is considered to have occurred if in light of available evidence no reasonable doubt is possible.
- 5. Integrity Pact, in respect of a particular contract, shall be operative from the date Integrity Pact is signed by both the parties till the final completion of the contract or as mentioned in Section 9- Pact Duration whichever is later. Any violation of the same would entail disqualification of the bidders and exclusion from future business dealings

Section 4 -Compensation for Damages

- 1. If the Principal has disqualified the Bidder from the tender process prior to the award according to Section 3, the Principal is entitled to demand and recover from the Bidder liquidated damages equivalent to Earnest Money Deposit / Bid Security.
- (2) If the Principal has terminated the contract according to Section 3, or if the Principal is entitled to terminate the contract according to Section 3, the principal shall be entitled to demand and recover from the Contractor liquidated damages equivalent to Security Deposit / Performance Bank Guarantee.
- 3. The bidder agrees and undertakes to pay the said amounts without protest or demur subject only to condition that if the Bidder/Contractor can prove and establish that the exclusion of the Bidder from the tender process or the termination of the contract after the contract award has caused no damage or less damage than the amount or the liquidated damages, the Bidder/Contractor shall compensate the Principal only to the extent of the damage in the amount proved.

Section 5 -Previous transgression

- 1. The Bidder declares that no previous transgression occurred in the last 3 years with any other Company in any country conforming to the TI approach or with any other Public Sector Enterprise in India that could justify his exclusion from the tender process.
- 2. If the Bidder makes incorrect statement on this subject, he can be disqualified from the tender process or the contract, if already awarded, can be terminated for such reason.

Section: 6 -Equal treatment of all Bidders/Contractor/Subcontractors

- 1. The Principal will enter into Pacts on identical terms with all bidders and contractors.
- 2. The Bidder / Contractor undertake(s) to procure from all subcontractors a commitment in conformity with this Integrity Pact. The Bidder/Contractor shall be responsible for any violation(s) of the provisions laid down in this agreement/Pact by any of its sub-contractors/sub-vendors.
- 3. The Principal will disqualify from the tender process all bidders who do not sign this Pact or violate its provisions.

Section: 7 -Criminal charges against violating Bidders/Contractors/ Subcontractors

If the Principal obtains knowledge of conduct of a Bidder, Contractor or Subcontractor, or of an employee or a representative or an associate of a Bidder, Contractor or Subcontractor, which constitutes corruption, or if the Principal has substantive suspicion in this regard, the Principal will inform the Vigilance Office.

Section: 8 -External Independent Monitor/Monitors

- 1. The Principal appoints competent and credible external independent Monitor for this Pact. The task of the Monitor is to review independently and objectively, whether and to what extent the parties comply with the obligations under this agreement.
- 2. The Monitor is not subject to instructions by the representatives of the parties and performs his functions neutrally and independently. He reports to the Chairperson of the Board of the Principal.
- 3. The Contractor accepts that the Monitor has the right to access without restriction to all Project documentation of the Principal including that provided by the Contractor. The Contractor will also grant the Monitor, upon his request and demonstration of a valid interest, unrestricted and unconditional access to his project documentation. The same is applicable to Subcontractors. The Monitor is under contractual obligation to treat the information and documents of the Bidder/Contractor/Subcontractor with confidentiality.

- 4. The Principal will provide to the Monitor sufficient information about all meetings among the parties related to the Project provided such meetings could have an impact on the contractual relations between the Principal and the Contractor. The parties offer to the Monitor the option to participate in such meetings.
- 5. As soon as the Monitor notices, or believes to notice, a violation of this agreement, he will so inform the Management of the Principal and request the Management to discontinue or heal the violation, or to take other relevant action. The monitor can in this regard submit non-binding recommendations. Beyond this, the Monitor has no right to demand from the parties that they act in a specific manner, refrain from action or tolerate action. However, the Independent External Monitor shall give an opportunity to the bidder / contractor to present its case before making its recommendations to the Principal.
- 6. The Monitor will submit a written report to the Chairperson of the Board of the Principal within 8 to 10 weeks from the date of reference or intimation to him by the 'Principal' and, should the occasion arise, submit proposals for correcting problematic situations.
- 7. If the Monitor has reported to the Chairperson of the Board a Substantiated suspicion of an offence under relevant Anti-Corruption Laws of India, and the Chairperson has not, within reasonable time, taken visible action to proceed against such offence or reported it to the Vigilance Office, the Monitor may also transmit this information directly to the Central Vigilance Commissioner, Government of India.
- 8. The word 'Monitor' would include both singular and plural.

Section:9 -Pact Duration

This Pact begins when both parties have legally signed it. It expires for the Contractor 12 months after the last payment under the respective contract, and for all other Bidders 6 months after the contract has been awarded.

If any claim is made/ lodged during this time, the same shall be binding and continue to be valid despite the lapse of this pact as specified above, unless it is discharged/determined by Chairperson of the Principal.

Section: 10 -Other provisions

- 1. This agreement is subject to Indian Law. Place of performance and jurisdiction is the Registered Office of the Principal, i.e. New Delhi. The Arbitration clause provided in the main tender document / contract shall not be applicable for any issue / dispute arising under Integrity Pact.
- 2. Changes and supplements as well as termination notices need to be made in writing. Side agreements have not been made.
- 3. If the Contractor is a partnership or a consortium, this agreement must be, signed by all partners or consortium members.
