1.0 OIL INDIA LIMITED (OIL), a "Navaratna" Category, Government of India Enterprise, is a premier OIL Company engaged in exploration, production and transportation of Crude Oil, Multi Products & natural gas with its Field Headquarters at Duliajan, Assam.

The Pipeline Department of Oil India Limited deals with transportation of hydrocarbons to different refineries and thus operates a total of 1860 Km of Hydrocarbon pipelines, which comprises of 1206 Km of Crude oil trunk pipeline and 654 KM Product pipeline.

2.0 In connection with its Pipeline Headquarters being located at Guwahati, OIL invites Local Competitive Bids (LCB) from competent and experienced Contractors through OIL's e-procurement site for **Decommissioning**, **Dismantling**, **Demolition and Disposal of Old Plant & Machineries and Structures of Crude Oil Pipeline Pump Stations**.

Above works are required to be carried out within existing installation of OIL, namely, PS4 Sekoni, PS5 Noonmati, PS6 Bongaigaon, PS7 Madarihat, Numaligarh NSPL-NDT, Siliguri NSPL-RT in the states of Assam and West Bengal. - 3.0 **Pre-Bid Conference:** Not-applicable.
- 4.0 <u>Integrity Pact</u>: The Integrity Pact must be uploaded in OIL's E-procurement portal along with the Technical Bid digitally signed by the same signatory who signed the Bid i.e. who is duly authorized to sign the Bid. If any Bidder refuses to sign Integrity Pact or declines to submit the Integrity Pact, their bid shall be rejected straightway. Uploading the Integrity Pact with digital signature will be construed that all pages of the Integrity Pact has been signed by the Bidder's authorized signatory who signs the Bid.

5.0 **GUIDELINES FOR PARTICIPATING IN OIL'S E-PROCUREMENT:**

5.1 To participate in OIL's E-procurement tender, bidders should have a legally valid digital certificate of Class 3 with <u>Organizations Name</u> and <u>Encryption certificate</u> as per Indian IT Act from the licensed Certifying Authorities operating under the Root Certifying Authority of India (RCAI), Controller of Certifying Authorities

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- (CCA) of India (http://www.cca.gov.in). Digital Signature Certificates having "Organization Name" field as "Personal" are not acceptable.
- 5.2 Bidders without having E-tender Login ID and Password should complete their online registration at least seven (7) days prior to the scheduled bid closing date and time of the tender. For online registration, Bidder may visit the OIL's E-tender sitehttps://etender.srm.oilindia.in/irj/portal
- 5.3 Necessary Login ID & Password will be issued by OIL only after submitting the complete online registration by the Bidder. In the event of late registration/incomplete registration by Bidder, OIL INDIA LIMITED shall not be responsible for late allotment of User ID & Password and request for bid closing date extension on that plea shall not be entertained by Company.
- 5.4 Bids without **Bid Security Declaration** shall be rejected. All bidders must upload Bid Security declaration along with their technical Bid.
- 5.5 MSE Vendors also required to submit **Bid Security Declaration** along with the MSE certificate as a part of their technical bid.
- 5.6 Parties shall be eligible for accessing the tender in E-portal after OIL enables them in the E-portal on receipt of request for the same.
- 5.7 Parties, who do not have a User ID, can click on **Guest login button** in the OIL's E-portal to view the available open tenders. The detailed guidelines are available in OIL's e-procurement site (Help Documentation). 6.0 **IMPORTANT NOTES:**

- 6.1 Bidders shall take note of the following important points while participating in OIL's e-procurement tender:
 - i) The bid along with all supporting documents must be submitted through OIL's E-procurement site only except the following document's which shall be submitted manually by the Bidder in two copies in a sealed envelope super-scribed with OIL's IFB No., Bid Closing date and addressed to DGM (Materials), OIL IN-DIA LTD.
 - a) Printed catalogue and Literature, if called for in the tender.
 - b) Any other document required to be submitted in original as per tender requirement.
 - ii) Bid should be submitted on-line in OIL's E-procurement site before 11.00 AM (IST) (Server Time) of the bid closing date as mentioned and will be opened on the same day at 4.00 PM (IST) at the office of the DGM (Materials) in presence of the authorized representatives of the Bidders.
 - iii) If the digital signature used for signing is not of "Class -3" with **Organizations** name, the bid will be rejected.

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iv) The tender is invited under SINGLE STAGE-TWO BID SYSTEM. The Bidders shall submit both the "TECHNICAL" and "PRICED" bids through electronic form in the OIL's e-Procurement portal within the Bid Closing Date and Time stipulated in the e-Tender. The Technical Bid should be submitted as per Scope of Work & Technical Specifications along with all technical documents related to the tender and uploaded under "Technical Attachment" Tab only. Bidders to note that no price details should be uploaded in "Technical Attachment" Tab Page. Details of prices as per Price Bid format/Priced bid can be uploaded as Attachment just below the "Tendering Text" in the attachment option under "Notes & Attachments" tab. A screen shot in this regard is given in the "Instruction to Bidder for Submission" file for guidance. Offer not complying with above submission procedure will be rejected as per Bid Evaluation Criteria mentioned in Part-2, (III)-Commercial Criteria.

- 1.0 Bidder shall bear all costs associated with the preparation and submission of bid. Oil India Limited, hereinafter referred to as Company, will in no case be responsible or liable for those costs, regardless of the conduct or outcome of the bidding process.
- 2.0 The services required, bidding procedures and contract terms are prescribed in the Bid Document. This Bid Document includes the following:

- 2.1 The Bidder is expected to examine all instructions, forms, terms and specifications in the Bid Documents. Failure to furnish all information required in the Bid Documents or submission of a bid not substantially responsive to the Bid Documents in every respect will be at the Bidder's risk & responsibility and may result in the rejection of its bid.
- 2.2 Bidders shall be deemed, prior to submitting their bids, to have satisfied themselves about the weather conditions, working culture in the area, socio-political

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environment, safety & security aspects, law & order situation and law of the land, and obtain for themselves all necessary information as to the risks, contingencies and all other circumstances, which may influence or affect the various obligations under the Contract.

3.0 TRANSFERABILITY OF BID DOCUMENTS:

- 3.1 Bid Documents are non-transferable. Bid can be submitted only in the name of the Bidder in whose name the Bid Document has been issued.
- 3.2 In case of e-Tender, Bidder must submit the bid using Organizational Class-3 Digital Signature issued by the Competent Authority in favour of the bidder. Bid submitted using Digital Signature other than the Digital Signature of the bidder shall be summarily rejected.
- 3.3 Unsolicited bids will not be considered and will be rejected straightway.

4.0 **AMENDMENT OF BID DOCUMENTS**:

- 4.1 At any time prior to the deadline for submission of bids, the Company may, for any reason, whether at its own initiative or in response to a clarification requested by a prospective Bidder, modify the Bid Documents through issuance of an Addendum.
- 4.2 The Addendum will be uploaded in OIL's E-Tender Portal in the "Technical RFx Response" under the tab "Amendments to Tender Documents". The Company may, at its discretion, extend the deadline for bid submission, if the Bidders are expected to require additional time in which to take the Addendum into account in preparation of their bid or for any other reason. Bidders are to check from time to time the E-Tender portal ["Technical RFx Response" under the tab "Amendments to Tender Documents"] for any amendments to the bid documents before submission of their bids. No separate intimation shall be sent to the Bidders.

5.0 **PREPARATION OF BIDS**

5.1 **LANGUAGE OF BIDS**: The bid as well as all correspondence and documents relating to the bid exchanged between the Bidder and the Company shall be in English language, except that any printed literature may be in another language provided it is accompanied by an official and notarised English translated version, which shall govern for the purpose of bid interpretation.

5.2 **BIDDER'S/AGENT'S NAME & ADDRESS**:

Bidders should indicate in their bids their detailed postal address including the Fax/Telephone /Cell Phone Nos. and E-mail address. Similar information should also be provided in respect of their authorised Agents in India, if any.

5.3 **DOCUMENTS COMPRISING THE BID**:

Bids are invited under Single Stage Two Bid System. The bid to be uploaded by the Bidder in OIL's E-Tender portal shall comprise of the following components:

(A) TECHNICAL BID

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- (i) Complete technical details of the services & equipment specifications with catalogue, etc.
- (ii) Documentary evidence established in accordance with Clause 10.0 hereunder.
- (iii) Bid Security Declaration in accordance with Clause 11.0 hereunder.
- (iv) Copy of Bid-Form without indicating prices in Proforma-C
- (v) Statement of Compliance as per Proforma-D
- (vi) Copy of Priced Bid without indicating prices (Proforma-B)
- (vii) Integrity Pact digitally signed by OIL's competent personnel as Annexure-A1, attached with the bid document to be digitally signed by the Bidder.
- (viii)Undertaking towards submission of authentic information/documents as per Format vide Annexure-XI.

(B) PRICED BID

- (i) Bidder shall quote their prices in the following Proforma available in OIL's E-procurement portal in the "Notes & Attachments" Tab:
 - a) Price-Bid Format as per Proforma-B (Annexure:DD)
 - b) Bid Form as per Proforma-C
- (ii) The Priced Bid shall contain the prices and any other commercial information pertaining to the service offered. Currency of quote shall be INR only.
- (iii) For convenience of the qualified Bidders and to improve transparency, the rates/costs quoted by bidders against OIL's e-tenders shall be available for online viewing by such Bidders whose price bids are opened by Company. A Bidder can view item-wise rates/costs of all other such peer bidders against the tender immediately after price bid opening, if the e-tender is floated by Company with PRICE CONDITION. In case the Price-Bid is invited by Company through attachment form under "Notes & Attachment" (i.e. NO PRICE Condition), Bidder must upload their detailed Price-Bid as per the prescribed format under "Notes & Attachment", in addition to filling up the "Total Bid Value" Tab taking into account the cost of all individual line items and other applicable charges like freight, tax, duties, levies etc. Under NO PRICE condition (i.e. Price Bid in attachment form), the "Total Bid Value" as calculated & quoted by the Bidders shall only be shared amongst the eligible bidders and Company will not assume any responsibility whatsoever towards calculation errors/omissions therein, if any. Notwithstanding to sharing the "Total Bid Value" or the same is whether filled up by the Bidder or not, Company will evaluate the cost details to ascertain the inter-se-ranking of bidders strictly as per the uploaded attachment and Bid Evaluation Criteria only. Online view of prices as above shall be available to the Bidders only up to seven (07) days from the date of Price-Bid opening of the e-tender.
- 6.0 **BID FORM**: The Bidder shall complete the Bid Form and the appropriate Price Schedule furnished in their Bid.

7.0 **BID PRICE:**

7.1 Prices must be quoted by the Bidders online as per the price bid format available in OIL's E- Tender Portal in "Notes & Attachment" Tab. Unit prices must be quoted by the Bidders, both in words and in figures.

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- 7.2 Prices quoted by the successful Bidder must remain firm during its performance of the Contract and is not subject to variation on any account.
- 7.3 All duties and taxes including Corporate Income Tax, Personal Tax, Octroi/Entry Tax, other Cess/levies etc. except Goods and Service Tax (GST) payable by the successful Bidder under the Contract for which this Bid Document is being issued, shall be included in the rates, prices and total Bid Price submitted by the Bidder, and the evaluation and comparison of bids shall be made accordingly. For example, personal taxes and/or any corporate taxes arising out of the profits on the contract as per rules of the country shall be borne by the Bidder.
- 8.0 **CURRENCY OF BID AND PAYMENT**: A Bidder is expected to submit their bid in Indian Rupees. Currency once quoted will not be allowed to be changed.
- 9.0 **DOCUMENTS ESTABLISHING BIDDER'S ELIGIBILITY AND QUALIFICATIONS:** These are listed in **BID EVALUATION CRITERIA (BEC), PART-2** of the Bid document.

10.0 **BID SECURITY DECLARATION:**

The Bid Security Declaration as per (Proforma-E) is required submit as a part of technical bid. Offer without Bid Security Declaration will be rejected.

11.0 **PERIOD OF VALIDITY OF BIDS**:

- 11.1 Bids shall remain **valid for 120** days from the date of closing of bid prescribed by the Company. **Bids of shorter validity will be rejected as being non-responsive.** If nothing is mentioned by the Bidder in their bid about the bid validity, it will be presumed that the bid is valid for 120 days from Bid Closing Date.
- 11.2 In exceptional circumstances, the Company may solicit the Bidder's consent to an extension of the period of validity. The request and the response thereto shall be made in writing through Fax or e-mail.

12.0 **SIGNING OF BID**:

12.1 Bids are to be submitted online through OIL's E-procurement portal with digital signature. The bid and all attached documents should be digitally signed by the Bidder using "Class 3" digital certificates with Organizations Name [e-commerce application (Certificate with personal verification and Organisation Name)] as per Indian IT Act 2000 obtained from the licensed Certifying Authorities operating under the Root Certifying Authority of India (RCAI), Controller of Certifying Authorities (CCA) of India before bid is uploaded. Digital Signature Certificates having "Organization Name" field other than Bidder's Name are not acceptable. However, aforesaid Digital Signature Certificates having Bidder's Name in the "Organization Name" field are acceptable. Bidder must also have Encryption Certificate along with Digital Signature Certificate (DSC) of Class III [Organization].

The bid including all uploaded documents shall be digitally signed by duly authorized representative of the Bidder holding a Power of Attorney to bind the Bidder to the contract.

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If any modifications are made to a document after attaching digital signature, the digital signature shall again be attached to such documents before uploading the same. The Power of Attorney shall be submitted by Bidder.

The authenticity of above digital signature shall be verified through authorized CA after bid opening and in case the digital signature is not of "Class-3" with organization name, the bid will be rejected.

Bidder is responsible for ensuring the validity of digital signature and its proper usage by their employees.

- 12.2 The original and all copies of the bid shall be typed or written in indelible inks. Since bids are to be submitted ONLINE with digital signature, manual signature is NOT relevant. The letter of authorisation (as per **Proforma-H**) shall be indicated by written Power of Attorney accompanying the Bid.
- 12.3 Any physical documents submitted by Bidders shall contain no interlineations, white fluid erasures or overwriting except as necessary to correct errors made by the Bidder, in which case such correction shall be initialled by the person or persons who has/have digitally signed the Bid.
- 12.4 Any Bid, which is incomplete, ambiguous, or not in compliance with the Bidding process will be rejected.

13.0 **SUBMISSION OF BIDS**

The tender is processed under Single Stage - Two Bid system. Bidder shall submit 13.1 the Technical bid and Priced bid along with all the Annexure and Proforma (wherever applicable) and copies of documents in electronic form through OIL's eprocurement portal within the Bid Closing Date & Time stipulated in the e-tender. For submission of Bids online at OIL's E-Tender Portal, detailed instructions are available in "HELP DOCUMENTATION" available in OIL's E-Tender Portal. Guidelines for bid submission are also provided in the "Forwarding Letter". The Technical Bid is to be submitted as per Terms of Reference/Technical Specifications of the bid document and Priced Bid as per the Price Schedule. The Technical Bid should be uploaded in the "Technical Attachment" under "Techno-Commercial Bid" Tab Page only. Prices to be quoted as per Proforma-B should be uploaded as Attachment just below the "Tendering Text" in the attachment link under "Techno-Commercial Bid" Tab under General Data in the e-portal. No price should be given in the "Technical Attachment", otherwise bid shall be rejected. The priced bid should not be submitted in physical form and which shall not be considered. For details please refer "INSTRUCTIONS" documents.

Documents sent through E-mail/Fax/Telephonic method will not be considered.

13.2 All the conditions of the contract to be made with the successful Bidder are given in various Sections of the Bid Document. Bidders are requested to state their compliance to each clause as per Proforma-D of the bid document and in case of non-compliance, if any, the same to be highlighted in the Proforma-D and the same should be uploaded along with the Technical Bid.

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- 13.3 Bids received through the e-procurement portal shall only be accepted. Bids received in any other form shall not be accepted.
- 14.0 **INDIAN AGENT/REPRESENTATIVE/RETAINER/ASSOCIATE:** Not Applicable.
- 15.0 **DEADLINE FOR SUBMISSION OF BIDS**:
- 15.1 Bids should be submitted online as per the online tender submission deadline. Bidders will not be permitted by System to make any changes in their bid/quote after the bid submission deadline is reached.
- 15.2 No bid can be submitted after the submission dead line is reached. The system time displayed on the e-procurement web page shall decide the submission dead line.
- 16.0 **LATE BIDS**: Bidders are advised in their own interest to ensure that their bids are uploaded in system before the closing date and time of the bid.

17.0 MODIFICATION AND WITHDRAWAL OF BIDS:

- 17.1 The Bidder after submission of Bid may modify or withdraw its Bid prior to Bid Closing Date & Time.
- 17.2 No Bid can be modified or withdrawn subsequent to the deadline for submission of Bids.
- 17.3 No Bid can be withdrawn in the interval between the deadline for submission of Bids and the expiry of the period of Bid Validity specified by the Bidder on the Bid Form. Withdrawal of a Bid during this interval shall result in debar from participation in future tenders of OIL and shall be put in the Holiday List for a period of six (06) months to two (02) years as the case may be as per Company's Banning Policy.
- 18.0 **EXTENSION OF BID SUBMISSION DATE:** Normally no request for extension of Bid Closing Date & Time will be entertained. However, OIL at its discretion, may extend the Bid Closing Date and/or Time due to any reasons.

19.0 **BID OPENING AND EVALUATION:**

19.1 Company will open the Technical Bids, including submission made pursuant to clause 18.0, in presence of Bidder's representatives who choose to attend at the date, time and place mentioned in the Forwarding Letter. However, an authorisation letter (as per **Proforma-I**) from the Bidder must be produced by the Bidder's representative at the time of Bid Opening. Unless this Letter is presented, the representative will not be allowed to attend the Bid Opening. The Bidder's representatives who are allowed to attend the Bid Opening shall sign a register evidencing their attendance. Only one representative against each Bid will be allowed to attend. In technical bid opening, only "Technical Attachment" will be opened. Bidders therefore should ensure that technical bid is uploaded in the "Technical Attachment" Tab Page only in the E-portal.

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- 19.2 In case of any unscheduled holiday or Bandh on the Bid Opening Date, the Bids will be opened on the next full working day. Accordingly, Bid Closing Date / time will get extended up to the next working day and time.
- 19.3 Bids which have been withdrawn pursuant to clause 18.0 shall not be opened. Company will examine bids to determine whether they are complete, whether requisite Bid Securities have been furnished, whether documents have been digitally signed and whether the bids are generally in order.
- 19.4 At bid opening, Company will announce the Bidder's names, written notifications of bid modifications or withdrawal, if any, and other details as the Company may consider appropriate.
- 19.5 Normally no clarifications shall be sought from the Bidders. However, for assisting in the evaluation of the bids especially on the issues where the Bidder confirms compliance in the evaluation and contradiction exists on the same issues due to lack of required supporting documents in the Bid (i.e. document is deficient or missing), or due to some statement at other place of the Bid (i.e. reconfirmation of confirmation) or vice-versa, clarifications may be sought by OIL. In all the above situations, the Bidder will not be allowed to change the basic structure of the Bid already submitted by them and no change in the price or substance of the Bid shall be sought, offered or permitted.
- 19.6 Prior to the detailed evaluation, Company will determine the substantial responsiveness of each bid to the requirement of the Bid Documents. For purpose of these paragraphs, a substantially responsive bid is one, which conforms to all the terms and conditions of the Bid Document without material deviations or reservation. A material deviation or reservation is one which affects in any way substantial way the scope, quality, or performance of work, or which limits in any substantial way, in-consistent way with the Bid Documents, the Company's right or the Bidder's obligations under the contract, and the rectification of which deviation or reservation would affect unfairly the competitive position of other Bidders presenting substantial responsive bids. The Company's determination of Bid's responsiveness is to be based on the contents of the Bid itself without recourse to extrinsic evidence.
- 19.7 A Bid determined as not substantially responsive will be rejected by the Company and may not subsequently be made responsive by the Bidder by correction of the non-conformity.
- 19.8 The Company may waive minor informality or nonconformity or irregularity in a Bid, which does not constitute a material deviation, provided such waiver, does not prejudice or affect the relative ranking of any Bidder.

20.0 **OPENING OF PRICED BIDS:**

20.1 Company will open the Priced Bids of the technically qualified Bidders on a specific date in presence of representatives of the qualified Bidders. The technically qualified Bidders will be intimated about the Priced Bid Opening Date & Time in advance. In case of any unscheduled holiday or Bandh on the Priced Bid Opening Date, the Bids will be opened on the next working day.

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- 20.2 The Company will examine the Price quoted by Bidders to determine whether they are complete, any computational errors have been made, the documents have been properly signed, and the bids are generally in order.
- 20.3 Arithmetical errors will be rectified on the following basis. If there is a discrepancy between the unit price and the total price (that is obtained by multiplying the unit price and quantity) the unit price shall prevail and the total price shall be corrected accordingly. If there is a discrepancy between words, and figures, the amount in words will prevail. If any Bidder does not accept the correction of the errors, their Bid will be rejected.
- 21.0 **CONVERSION TO SINGLE CURRENCY:** Not Applicable.
- 22.0 **EVALUATION AND COMPARISON OF BIDS:** The Company will evaluate and compare the bids as per **BID EVALUATION CRITERIA (BEC), PART-2** of the Bid Document.
- 22.1 **DISCOUNTS / REBATES**: Unconditional discounts/rebates, if any, given in the bid will be considered for evaluation.
- 22.2 Post bid or conditional discounts/rebates offered by any Bidder shall not be considered for evaluation of bids. However, if the lowest Bidder happens to be the final acceptable Bidder for award of contract, and if they have offered any discounts/rebates, the contract shall be awarded after taking into account such discounts/rebates.
- 22.3 **LOADING OF FOREIGN EXCHANGE**: There would be no loading of foreign exchange for deciding the inter-se-ranking of domestic Bidders.
- 22.4 **EXCHANGE RATE RISK**: Since Indian Bidders are now permitted to quote in any currency and also receive payments in that currency, Company will not be compensating for any exchange rate fluctuations in respect of the services.
- 22.5 **REPATRIATION OF RUPEE COST**: Not Applicable.
- 23.0 **CONTACTING THE COMPANY**:
- 23.1 Except as otherwise provided in **Clause 19.0** above, no Bidder shall contact Company on any matter relating to its bid, from the time of the bid opening to the time the Contract is awarded except as required by Company vide **sub-clause 19.6**.
- 23.2 An effort by a Bidder to influence the Company in the Company's bid evaluation, bid comparison or Contract award decisions may result in the rejection of their bid.

24.0 AWARD CRITERIA:

The Company will award the Contract to the successful Bidder whose bid has been determined to be substantially responsive and has been determined as the lowest evaluated bid, provided further that the Bidder is determined to be qualified to perform the Contract satisfactorily.

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25.0 COMPANY'S RIGHT TO ACCEPT OR REJECT ANY BID:

Company reserves the right to accept or reject any or all bids and to annul the bidding process and reject all bids, at any time prior to award of contract, without thereby incurring any liability to the affected Bidder, or Bidders or any obligation to inform the affected Bidder of the grounds for Company's action.

26.0 **NOTIFICATION OF AWARD**:

- 26.1 Prior to the expiry of the period of bid validity or extended validity, Company will notify the successful Bidder in writing by registered letter or by fax or E-mail (to be confirmed in writing by registered / couriered letter) that its Bid has been accepted.
- 26.2 The notification of award will constitute the formation of the Contract.
- 27.0 **PERFORMANCE SECURITY**: Successful bidder has to submit Performance Security as mentioned in GCC clause no. 10.0.
- 27.1 Performance security @03% of total contract value is applicable against this contract. The Performance Bank Guarantee shall be denominated in the currency of the contract.
- 27.2 The Performance Bank Guarantee specified above must be valid as mentioned in the LOA. The Performance Bank Guarantee will be discharged by Company not later than 30 days following its expiry. In the event of any extension of the Contract period, Bank Guarantee should be extended by Contractor by the period equivalent to the extended period.
- 27.3 The Performance Bank Guarantee shall be payable to Company as compensation for any loss resulting from Contractor's failure to fulfil its obligations under the Contract.
- 27.4 The Performance Security will not accrue any interest during its period of validity or extended validity.
- 27.5 Failure of the successful Bidder to comply with the requirements of **clause 27.0** and/or 28.0 and their sub-clauses shall constitute sufficient grounds for annulment of the award and forfeiture of the Performance Security. In such an eventuality, the party shall be put in the Holiday List for a period from six (06) months to two (02) years as the case may be as per Company's Banning Policy.
- 27.6 Bidders are requested to advise the Bank Guarantee issuing bank to comply with the following and ensure to submit, the receipt of the copy of SFMS message as sent by the issuing bank branch, along with the original Bank Guarantee in OIL's office.

The bank guarantee issued by the bank must be routed through SFMS platform as per following details:

28.0 **SIGNING OF CONTRACT**:

- 28.1 At the same time as the Company notifies the successful Bidder that its Bid has been accepted, the Company will either call the successful Bidder for signing of the agreement or send the Contract Form provided in the Bid Documents, along with the General & Special Conditions of Contract, Technical Specifications, Schedule of Rates incorporating all agreements agreed between the two parties.
- 28.2 The successful Bidder shall sign and date the contract and return it to the Company after receipt of LOA. Till the contract is signed, the LOA issued to the successful Bidder shall remain binding amongst the two parties.
- 28.3 In the event of failure on the part of the successful Bidder to sign the contract, OIL reserves the right to terminate the LOA issued to the successful Bidder debar the bidder and invoke the Performance Security if submitted by the successful Bidder. The party shall also be put in the Holiday List for a period from six (06) months to two (02) years as the case may be as per Company's Banning Policy.

29.0 FURNISHING FRAUDULENT INFORMATION/DOCUMENTS:

If it is found that a Bidder/contractor has furnished fraudulent information / documents, the Performance Security shall be forfeited and the party shall be banned for a period of 3 (three) years from the date of detection of such fraudulent act besides the legal action as per Company's Banning Policy.

30.0 **CREDIT FACILITY**:

Bidders should indicate clearly in the Bid about availability of any credit facility inclusive of Government to Government credits indicating the applicable terms and conditions of such credit.

31.0 **MOBILISATION ADVANCE PAYMENT**: Not Applicable.

- 41.1 The Bidders have to get verified and certified the various documents required against BEC/BRC of the tender by anyone of the above Independent Inspection Agencies and submit the duly certified Inspection Certificate by the Inspection Agencies along with the Technical Bid of the Tender. All Charges of the Third-party Independent Inspection Agencies towards verification of bidder's documents and certification thereof shall be borne by the respective bidders and Payments on account of above inspection, verification and certification shall be made directly by the Bidder to the Inspection Agency(s). - 4.1 Bidder shall submit the Price Break up as per Proforma-B (Annexure DD). Bidders should fill up the annexure, sign and upload under "Notes & Attachments" > "Attachments" only. Evaluation of offers shall be done on as per price bid format.
- 4.2 Comparison of bids shall be done on Total Evaluated Cost on the basis of rates/ percentage (as stipulated) quoted in the Price Bid Format and contract shall be awarded to the L1 bidder.
- 4.3 If there is any discrepancy between the unit price and the total price, the unit price will prevail and the total price shall be corrected. Similarly, if there is any discrepancy between words and figure, the amounts in words shall prevail and will be adopted for evaluation.
- 4.4 Price bids of only those bidders will be opened whose offers are found to be techno-commercially acceptable.
- 4.5 The Integrity Pact is applicable against this tender. OIL shall be entering into an Integrity Pact with the bidders as per format enclosed vide Annexure XII of the tender document. This Integrity Pact Proforma has been duly signed digitally by OIL's competent signatory. - 4.6 No press advertisement will be published regarding amendment to Bidding Document or extension of Bid Closing Date. The same will be uploaded in OIL's website and informed to all prospective bidders who have received the bidding documents. Bidders to keep themselves updated.
- 4.7 Other terms and conditions of the enquiry shall be as per General Terms and Conditions for LCB Tender. However, if any of the Clauses of the Bid Rejection Criteria / Bid Evaluation Criteria (BEC/BRC) mentioned here contradict the Clauses in the General Terms & Conditions of LCB Tender of the tender and/or elsewhere, those mentioned in this BEC/BRC shall prevail.
- 4.8 Bid Documents / User Id & Password for OIL's E-Tender portal are not transferable.
- 4.9 Any bid received in the form of Physical document/ Telex/Cable/Fax/E-mail will not be accepted.
- 4.10 There should not be any indication of price in the Un-priced Techno-Commercial Bid. If there is any indication of price in the Un-priced Techno-Commercial Bid, Such Bid will be rejected straightway.

c) All Charges of the Third-party Independent Inspection Agencies towards verification of bidder's documents and certification thereof shall be borne by the respective bidders and Payments on account of above inspection, verification and certification shall be made directly by the Bidder to the Inspection Agency(s). OIL will not be responsible for any payment dispute between Bidders and Third Party Inspection Agencies.

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- d) As mentioned above, Bidder(s) have to submit the verified documents along with the Technical Bids. Bid submitted with un-verified supporting documents shall not be normally considered. However, in case a bidder submits its bid alongwith all relevant supporting documents as per BEC/BRC without getting all/some of them verified by the designated Independent Inspection agency, such bid can be provisionally considered provided it is accompanied by an Undertaking by the Bidder on their official letterhead to submit the duly verified copies/verification certificate within seven (7) days of actual bid opening. Company will neither send any reminder nor seek any clarification in this regard from such bidders, and the bid will be rejected outright if the bidder fails to submit the verified copies/verification certificate within seven (7) days of actual bid opening at its own risk and responsibility. If a bidder does not submit the undertaking towards submission of third party certification within 7 days from date of Bid Closing date, but certified document reaches us within the cut-off date of above seven (7) days, then such bids shall be considered.
- e) The detailed methodology of inspection / verification of documents followed by the agencies are provided in Instruction To Bidder (ITB) at appropriate Clause.

D) EVALUATION OF BIDS

4.12 Bids qualifying as per terms of Technical Criteria (Para A above) and Financial Criteria (Para B above) shall be eligible for Price Bid Opening for financial evaluation (Price Bid Evaluation) of the bid subject to complying other commercial criteria. Decision of the owner in this regard shall be final and binding on all.

E) EVALUATED BID PRICE:

- 5.0 Qualified Bids and conforming to the terms & conditions stipulated in the bidding document and considered to be responsive after subjecting to Bid Evaluation Criteria shall be considered for further evaluation as per the Evaluation Criteria given below:
 - a) Commercial Bids shall be evaluated taking into account the Price/ percentage (as stipulated) quoted against as per Proforma-B (Annexure DD) excluding GST.
 - b) Contract will be awarded for all the items as per Price Bid Format.
 - c) Lump sump cost (if any) must include all liabilities and taxes including statutory liabilities but excluding GST which shall be quoted separately in the Price Bid format.

F) INTER-SE-RANKING OF THE QUALIFIED BIDS:

- 5.1 To ascertain the inter-se-ranking, the comparison of the responsive bids will be made subject to loading for any deviation. Comparison of offers will be done on **to-tal evaluated cost** on the basis of rates/ percentage (as stipulated) quoted in the Price Bid Format.
- 5.2 Work for Individual Group shall be awarded as per the following:

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- a) Bidder has option to quote for one Group or more than one Group subject to meeting BEC requirement. However, the bidder shall be considered for award of maximum of **Four Groups** only, based upon Bidder's qualification and on overall **least cost** to Owner/OIL.
- b) In case the Lowest (L-1) evaluated Bidder (s), for all the Groups, happens to be different, then the same shall be considered for award, i.e. one Group to one bidder on Lowest(L-1) bid basis. However,
- c) In case a Bidder happens to be L-1 for more than one Group, keeping in view Bidder's Eligibility/ Qualification for Groups, all combinations of the evaluated prices of qualified bidder(s) shall be prepared, and then the overall lowest combination, resulting in least cost to Owner/OIL, among all combinations will be considered for award.
- d) In case the lowest evaluated price happens to be same for more than one combination, then the combination for award shall be selected based on the Financial Turnover of the bidder(s) and the Priority or ranking of the Groups as under
- i) For the purpose of choosing the combination for award, the ranking of the Group shall be as Group A> Group D> Group B> Group C.
- ii) Out of several combinations for the same lowest evaluated price, Award of Group A shall be done initially on the bidder who is having highest financial turnover in the FY 2019-20.
- iii) In case the Annual Turnover of the bidders is also identical, then draw of lot amongst above bidders shall be done for selection of a L1 bidder for Group A.
- iv) Once the award of Group A is finalized to a bidder say X, then all such combinations having the same lowest evaluated price and wherein X was considered for Group A shall be further evaluated for award of other Group and all other combinations shall cease to be lowest possible combinations and not be considered for further evaluation.
- v) The award for other groups (B, C, D) shall be done with the same methodology as mentioned above and in sequence of the ranking of the Groups, wherever multiple least cost combinations are arrived at.
- e) Once certain Group (s) is awarded to such L-1 bidder (On Least Cost to OIL basis), the bidder ceases to be lowest bidder for the remaining Groups (s). The award of remaining Group (s) on other bidders should not be considered as award on L2, L3,...bidder.
- 5.3 In case of identical lowest price ranking amongst more than 1 (one) bidder or combinations, as a last resort, the selection will be made by draw of lot amongst above bidders.

G) GENERAL:

6.0 In case bidder takes exception to any clause of bid document not covered under BEC, then the Company has the discretion to load or reject the offer on account of such exception if the bidder does not withdraw/modify the deviation when/as advised by company. The loading so done by the Company will be final and binding on the bidders.

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- 7.0 To ascertain the substantial responsiveness of the Bid the Company reserves the right to ask the bidder for clarification in respect of clauses covered under BEC also and such clarifications fulfilling the BEC clauses in toto must be received on or before the deadline given by the Company, failing which the offer will be summarily rejected.
- 8.0 If any of the clauses in the BEC contradict with other clauses of the Bid Document elsewhere, then the clauses in the BEC shall prevail.

PART-3

GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

1.0 APPLICABILITY, DEFINITION & INTERPRETATION

1.1 **Applicability**

All clauses in the General Conditions of Contract [GCC] shall apply to all transactions except as otherwise stated in the Special Conditions of Contract [SCC] and/or BEC/BRC. Furthermore, in the event if there is any conflict between the Principal text of the Agreement and the Appendixes, the Principal text will prevail.

1.2 **Definition & Interpretation**

In the contract (as hereinafter defined) the following words and expressions shall have the meaning hereby assigned to them except where the context otherwise requires:

1.2.1 **COMPANY/OIL/Operator:**

Shall mean Oil India Limited [OIL] a public sector undertaking, incorporated under COMPANY's Act 1956 having its registered office at Duliajan-786602, Assam, India and includes its successor and permitted assigns.

1.2.2 **CONTRACTOR:**

Shall mean the person or persons, firm or COMPANY or corporation incorporated in India or abroad, who has been awarded with the contract and includes contractor's legal representatives, his successors and permitted assigns.

1.2.3 **Contract:**

Shall mean a written agreement between the COMPANY and the CONTRACTOR for execution of the services/works including all contract documents and subsequent amendments, if any.

1.2.4 **Site:**

Shall mean the place in which the operations/services are to be carried out or places approved by OIL for the purposes of the CONTRACT together with any other places designated in the CONTRACT as forming part of the site.

1.2.5 COMPANY's Site Representative/Engineer:

Shall mean the person or the persons appointed by the COMPANY from time to time to act on its behalf at the site for overall co-ordination, supervision and project management at site.

1.2.6 **Sub-Contract:**

Shall mean order/contract placed by the CONTRACTOR for any portion of the CONTRACT or work sublet with necessary written consent of COMPANY on third party. Such sub-letting shall not relieve the CONTRACTOR from any obligation, duty or responsibility under the CONTRACT.

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1.2.7 **Sub-Contractor:**

Shall mean any person or firm or COMPANY (other than CONTRACTOR) to whom any part of the work has been entrusted by CONTRACTOR, with written consent of OIL or the persons appointed by OIL, successors and permitted assigns of such persons, firm or COMPANY).

1.2.8 Contractor's Representative:

Shall mean such person/or persons duly appointed representative at the site and base as the CONTRACTOR may designate in writing to the COMPANY as having authority to act for the CONTRACTOR in matters affecting the work and to provide the requisite services.

1.2.9 Contract Price/Value:

Shall mean the sum accepted or the sum calculated in accordance with the rates accepted in tender and/or the contract rates as payable to the CONTRACTOR for the entire execution and completion of the services/works, including amendments/modification/change order issued by the COMPANY.

1.2.10 **Firm price:**

The prices will remain unchanged, except for statutory changes, during currency of the CONTRACT unless specifically agreed to in writing by COMPANY.

1.2.11 Service/Works/Operations:

Shall mean and include all items and things to be supplied/done and all work/Service to be performed by the CONTRACTOR as specified in the Scope of Work under this CONTRACT and shall also include all extra, additional, altered or substituted works/services as required for the purpose of successful execution of the Contract.

1.2.12 Equipment/Materials/Goods:

Shall mean and include any equipment, machinery, instruments, stores, goods which CONTRACTOR is required to provide to the COMPANY for/under the CONTRACT and amendments thereto.

1.2.13 **Drawings:**

Shall mean and include all Engineering sketches, general arrangements/ layout drawings, sectional plans, all elevations, photographs, etc. related to the CONTRACT together with modification and revision thereto.

1.2.14 Specifications:

Means and includes all technical specifications, provision attached and referred to in the tender/contract document regarding method and manner of performing the services and qualities of the service/materials to be provided under the contract and also as modified by the COMPANY/its site representative during the execution of contract in the best interest of service.

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1.2.15 Engineer In-charge (EIC):

Shall mean the person designated from time to time by the COMPANY and shall include those who are expressly authorized by the COMPANY to act for and on its behalf for operation of the contract.

1.2.16 Inspectors:

Shall mean any person or outside Agency nominated by COMPANY to inspect equipment, materials and services, if any, in the CONTRACT (stage wise as well as final) as per the terms of the CONTRACT.

1.2.17 **Tests:**

Shall mean such process or processes to be carried out by the CONTRACTOR as are prescribed in the CONTRACT, considered necessary by the COMPANY or their representative to ascertain quality, workmanship, performance and efficiency of equipment or services thereof.

1.2.18 **Approval:**

Shall mean and include the written consent duly signed by COMPANY or their authorized official in respect of all documents, drawings or other particulars in relation to the CONTRACT.

1.2.19 **Day:**

Shall mean a calendar day of twenty –four (24) consecutive hours beginning at 00:00 hours with reference to local time at the site.

1.2.20 **Month:**

Shall mean a calendar month as per Gregorian calendar.

1.2.21 **Year:**

Shall mean calendar year as per Gregorian calendar.

1.2.22 Working day:

Means any day which is not declared to be holiday by the COMPANY.

1.2.23 **Bid/offer:**

Shall mean the proposal/Offer along with supporting documents submitted by the bidder in response to the tender or enquiry in accordance with the terms of Tender or Enquiry, for consideration by COMPANY, prior to award of contract.

1.2.24 **Guarantee:**

Shall mean the period and other conditions governing the warranty/guarantee of the services as provided in the CONTRACT.

1.2.25 Mobilization:

Shall mean rendering the equipment fully manned and equipped as per CONTRACT and ready to begin work at site designated by the COMPANY and accepted by the

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COMPANY after inspection.

1.2.26 **De-mobilization**:

Shall mean the removal of all items forming part of the mobilization from the site of the COMPANY and inspection and acceptance thereafter by the COMPANY including compliance of requirement in relation to re-export of imported equipment/materials under concessional duty scheme in accordance with relevant notification from Customs Authorities.

1.2.27 Willful Misconduct:

Shall mean intentional disregard of good and prudent standards of performance or proper conduct under the Contract with knowledge that it is likely to result in any injury to any person or persons or loss or damage of property of the Company or Third Party.

1.2.28 Gross Negligence:

Shall mean any act or failure to act (whether sole, joint or concurrent) by a person or entity which was intended to cause, or which was in reckless disregard of or unjustifiable indifference to, avoidable and harmful consequences such person or entity knew, or should have known, would result from such act or failure to act. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Gross negligence shall not include any action taken in good faith for the safeguard of life or property.

1.2.29 Criminal Negligence:

Shall mean that the crime happened negligently, there was duty of care upon the Person but inadvertently due to his negligence, the duty was breached, which causes harm to the people in the form of death or serious injury.

1.2.30 **GST Legislations:**

'GST legislations' means 'any or all of the following legislations as may be applicable to the CONTRACTOR and OIL:

- (A) The Central Goods & Services Tax Act, 2017;
- (B) The Integrated Goods & Services Act, 2017;
- (C) The Union Territory Goods & Services Tax Act, 2017;
- (D) The respective State Goods & Service Tax Acts'
- (E) The Goods and Services (Compensation to States) Act, 2017
- (F) The Customs Act and the Customs Tariff Act.
- (G) Any other applicable Act related to GST

2.0 **CONTRACT DOCUMENT:**

2.1 **Governing language:** The governing language for the CONTRACT shall be English. All CONTRACT documents and all correspondence and communication to be given and all other documentation to be prepared and supplied under the CONTRACT shall be written in English and the CONTRACT shall be construed and interpreted in accordance with English language.

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- 2.2 **Entire Agreement:** The CONTRACT constitutes the entire agreement between OIL and the CONTRACTOR with respect to the subject matter of the CONTRACT and supersedes all communication, negotiations and agreement (whether written or oral) of the parties with respect thereto made prior to the date of this agreement, unless such communication(s) expressly forms part of the contract or included by reference.
- 2.3 **Amendment in CONTRACT:** No Amendment of the Contract shall be valid unless it is in writing, is dated, expressly refers to the Contract, and is signed by a duly authorized representative of each party thereto. OIL shall not be bound by any printed conditions, provisions in the CONTRACTOR's BID, forms of acknowledgement of CONTRACT, invoice and other documents which purport to impose any condition at variance with or supplement to CONTRACT.

3.0 WAIVERS AND AMENDMENTS:

- 3.1 **Waivers:** It is fully understood and agreed that none of the terms and conditions of this contract shall be deemed waived by either party unless such waiver is executed in writing only by the duly authorized representatives of both the parties. The failure of either party to execute any right shall not act as a waiver of such right by such party.
- 3.2 **Change Program:** It is agreed that CONTRACTOR shall carry out work in accordance with the completion program to be furnished by the COMPANY, which may be changed from time to time by reasonable modifications in the program as COMPANY sees fit. COMPANY's instruction in this regard shall be final and binding.

4.0 **CONTRACT TIMELINE:**

4.1 Effective Date of Contract:

The contract shall become effective as of the date COMPANY notifies the CONTRACTOR in writing that it has been awarded the contract. This date of issuance of Letter of Award (LOA) by the COMPANY will be the effective date of contract. All terms and conditions of the contract shall come into force with the date of issuance of LOA.

4.2 Date of Commencement of Operation:

The date on which the mobilization is completed in all respects and CONTRACTOR is ready to commence operation as per the contract provision [Certified by the COMPANY's representative] will be treated as the date of Commencement of Operation.

4.3 **Duration of the contract:**

The contract shall be valid for a period as defined in the LOA and Special Conditions of Contract [SCC].

5.0 **SCOPE OF WORK/CONTRACT:**

Scope of the CONTRACT shall be as defined in the CONTRACT, specifications, drawings and Appendices.

6.0 **GENERAL OBLIGATION OF CONTRACTOR:**

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CONTRACTOR shall, in accordance with and subject to the terms and conditions of this Contract:

- 6.1 Perform the work described in the Terms of Reference/Scope of Work. The CONTRACTOR shall execute the work with professional competence and in an efficient and workman like manner.
- 6.2 Except as otherwise provided in the Terms of Reference and the special Conditions of the contract, employ all labours/personnel as required to perform the work.
- 6.3 Perform all other obligations, work and services which are required by the terms of this contract or which reasonably can be implied from such terms as being necessary for the successful and timely completion of the work.
- 6.4 Comply with all applicable statutory obligations specified in the contract.
- 6.5 CONTRACTOR shall be deemed to have satisfied himself before submitting their bid as to the correctness and sufficiency of its bid for the services required and of the rates and prices quoted, which rates and prices shall, except insofar as otherwise provided, cover all its obligations under the contract.
- 6.6 CONTRACTOR shall be deemed, prior to submitting their bids, to have satisfied themselves about the weather conditions, working culture in the area, sociopolitical environment, safety & security aspects, law & order situation and law of the land, and obtain for themselves all necessary information as to the risks, contingencies and all other circumstances, which may influence or affect the various obligations under the Contract.
- 6.7 CONTRACTOR shall give or provide all necessary supervision during the performance of the services and as long thereafter within the warranty period as COMPANY may consider necessary for the proper fulfilling of CONTRACTOR's obligations under the contract.

7.0 GENERAL OBLIGATION OF COMPANY:

COMPANY shall, in accordance with and subject to the terms and conditions of this contract:

- 7.1 Pay CONTRACTOR in accordance with terms and conditions of the contract.
- 7.2 Allow CONTRACTOR access, subject to normal security and safety procedures, to all areas as required for orderly performance of the work as specified in the Scope of Works of the contract or work connected therewith.
- 7.3 Perform all other obligations required of COMPANY by the terms of this contract.

8.0 **DUTIES AND POWER/AUTHORITY:**

8.1 OIL's site representative/engineer:

The duties and authorities of OIL's site representative/engineer are to act on behalf of OIL for:

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- (a) Overall supervision, co-ordination and Project Management at site.
- (b) Proper and optimum utilization of equipment and services.
- (c) Monitoring of performance and progress
- (d) Commenting/countersigning on reports made by the CONTRACTOR's representative at site in respect of works, receipts, consumption etc. after satisfying himself with the facts of the respective cases.
- (e) He shall have the authority, but not obligation at all times and any time to inspect/test/examine/verify any equipment machinery, instruments, tools, materials, personnel, procedures and reports etc. directly or indirectly pertaining to the execution of the work. However, this shall not construe to imply an acceptance by the inspector. Hence, the overall responsibility of quality of work shall rest solely with the CONTRACTOR.
- (f) Each and every document emerging from site in support of any claim by the CONTRACTOR has to have the countersignature/comments of the OIL's representative/engineer without which no claim shall be entertained by the OIL.

8.2 **CONTRACTOR's representative:**

- (a) The CONTRACTOR's representative shall have all the powers requisite for the performance of the Service/Works, subject to holding due authorization from the CONTRACTOR.
- (b) Representative(s) shall liaise with OIL's representative/engineer for the proper co-ordination and timely completion of the works and on any matter pertaining to the works.
- (c) Representative(s) shall extend full co-operation to OIL's representative/inspector/engineer in the manner required by them for supervision/inspection/observation of equipment, material, procedures, performance, reports and records pertaining to works.
- (d) To have complete charge of CONTRACTOR's personnel engaged in the performance of the work and to ensure compliance of rules and regulations and safety practice.

9.0 Personnel to be deployed by contractor:

CONTRACTOR warrants that it shall provide competent, qualified and sufficiently experienced personnel to perform the work correctly and efficiently.

9.1 The CONTRACTOR should ensure that their personnel observe all statutory safety requirement including those prescribed by the COMPANY. Upon COMPANY's written request, CONTRACTOR, entirely at its own expense, shall remove immediately any personnel of the CONTRACTOR determined by the COMPANY to be unsuitable and shall promptly replace such personnel with personnel acceptable to the COMPANY. Replacement personnel should be mobilized within 15 days from the date of issuance of notice without affecting the operation of the COMPANY.

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- 9.2 The CONTRACTOR shall be solely responsible throughout the period of the contract for providing all requirements of their personnel including but not limited to, their transportation to & fro from field site, enroute/ local boarding, lodging, personal protective gear & medical attention etc. COMPANY shall have no responsibility or liability in this regard.
- 9.3 However, COMPANY shall provide available medical assistance/facilities to CONTRACTOR's Personnel in case of emergency at its own establishment on chargeable basis.
- 9.4 CONTRACTOR's key personnel shall be fluent in English language (both writing and speaking).

10.0 **PERFORMANCE SECURITY:**

- 10.1 On receipt of notification of award from the COMPANY, the CONTRACTOR shall furnish the Performance Security to COMPANY within 15 (fifteen) days from the date of issue of LOA for an amount specified in the Forwarding Letter and Letter of Award (LOA) as per Proforma-F and must be in the form of a Bank Draft/Cashier's cheque/Banker's cheque*/ NEFT/RTGS/Electronic fund transfer to designated account of OIL# or Fixed Deposit Receipt (account OIL INDIA LIMITED) or irrevocable Bank Guarantee from Any schedule Indian Bank or Any Branch of an International bank situated in India and registered with Reserve Bank of India as scheduled foreign bank in case of domestic CONTRACTOR/service provider.
- Bank Guarantee issued by a Bank, amongst others, must contain the following particulars of such bank:

Full address.

Branch Code.

Code Nos. of the authorized signatory with full name and designation.

Phone Nos., Fax Nos., E-mail address.

- 10.3 The domestic CONTRACTOR/service provider(s) will have to submit the Bank Guarantee from any of the scheduled banks and on non-judicial stamp paper of requisite value as per the Indian Stamp Act, purchased in the name of the issuing banker.
- 10.4 The Performance Security shall be denominated in the currency of the contract.
- 10.5 The Performance Security specified above must be valid for the entire duration of the Contract and claim period should be valid for a minimum of 03 (three) months beyond the contract period. The Performance Security will be discharged by COMPANY not later than 30 days following its expiry of claim period. In the event of any extension of the Contract period, Bank Guarantee should be extended by CONTRACTOR by the period equivalent to the extended period.
- 10.6 The Performance Security shall be encashed by COMPANY on account of CONTRACTOR's failure to fulfil its obligations under the Contract and/or non-performance/un-satisfactory of the Contractor. Company shall not be required to proof any loss or damage on account of Contractor's non-performance/un-satisfactory performance.

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- 10.7 The Performance Security will not accrue any interest during its period of validity or extended validity.
- 10.8 Failure of the successful Bidder to comply with the requirements of clause 10.0 shall constitute sufficient grounds for annulment of the award and forfeiture of the Bid Security. In such an eventuality, action will be initiated as per the Banning Policy of OIL in vogue.

#Subject to credit in OIL's account within prescribed time

*The validity of Bank Draft/Cashier's/Banker's cheque (as applicable) should not be less than 3 months.

In the event CONTRACTOR fails to honour any of the commitments entered into under this agreement, and/or in the event of termination of the contract under provisions of Integrity Pact and/or in respect of any amount due from the CONTRACTOR to OIL, OIL shall have unconditional option under the guarantee to invoke the above bank guarantee and claim the amount from the bank. The bank shall be obliged to pay the amount to OIL on demand.

11.0 **SIGNING OF CONTRACT:**

The successful bidder is required to sign a formal detailed contract with OIL within a maximum period of 60 days of date of LOA. Until the contract is signed, the LOA as well as GCC & SCC as prescribed in the Tender, shall remain binding amongst the two parties. In the event of failure on the part of the successful Bidder to sign the contract, OIL reserves the right to terminate the LOA issued to the successful Bidder and invoke the Performance Security if submitted by the successful Bidder. Such CONTRACTOR shall be put on holiday as per the Banning Policy of OIL [available at www.oil-india.in].

12.0 CLAIMS, TAXES & DUTIES:

12.1 **Claims:**

CONTRACTOR agrees to pay all claims, taxes and fees for equipment, labour, materials, services and supplies to be furnished by it hereunder and agrees to allow no lien or charge resulting from such claims to be fixed upon any property of COMPANY. COMPANY may, at its option, pay and discharge any liens or overdue charges for CONTRACTOR's equipment, labour, materials, services and supplies under this CONTRACT and may thereupon deduct the amount or amounts so paid from any sum due, or thereafter become due, to CONTRACTOR hereunder.

12.2 Notice of claims:

CONTRACTOR or COMPANY, as the case may be, shall promptly give the other, notice in writing of any claim made or proceeding commenced for which that party is entitled to indemnification under the CONTRACT. Each party shall confer with the other concerning the defense of any such claims or proceeding, shall permit the other to be represented by counsel in defense thereof, and shall not affect settlement of or compromise any such claim or proceeding without the other's written consent.

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12.3 **Taxes:**

- 12.3.1 CONTRACTOR, unless specified otherwise in the CONTRACT, shall bear all tax liabilities, duties, Govt. levies etc. including GST and customs duty, Corporate and personnel taxes levied or imposed on the CONTRACTOR on account of payments received by it from the COMPNAY for the work done under this CONTRACT. It shall be the responsibility of CONTRACTOR to submit to the concerned Indian authorities, the returns and all other concerned documents required for this purpose and to comply in all respects with the requirements of the laws in this regard, in time.
- 12.3.2 Tax levied on CONTRACTOR as per the provisions of Indian Income Tax Act and any other enactment/rules on income derived/payments received under the contract will be on CONTRACTOR's account.
- 12.3.3 CONTRACTOR shall be responsible for payment of personal taxes, if any, for all the personnel deployed in India by CONTRACTOR.
- 12.3.4 The CONTRACTOR shall furnish to the COMPANY, if and when called upon to do so, relevant statement of accounts or any other information pertaining to work done under the contract for submitting the same to the Tax authorities, on specific request from them in accordance with provisions under the law. CONTRACTOR shall be responsible for preparing and filing the return of income etc. within the prescribed time limit to the appropriate authority.
- 12.3.5 Prior to start of operations under the contract, the CONTRACTOR shall furnish the COMPANY with the necessary documents, as asked for by the COMPANY and/or any other information pertaining to the contract, which may be required to be submitted to the Income Tax authorities at the time of obtaining "No Objection Certificate" for releasing payments to the CONTRACTOR.
- 12.3.6 Corporate income tax will be deducted at source from the invoice at the specified rate of income tax as per the provisions of Indian Income Tax Act as may be in force from time to time and COMPANY will issue TDS Certificate to the CONTRACTOR as per the provisions of Income Tax Act.
- 12.3.7 Corporate and personnel taxes on CONTRACTOR shall be the liability of the CONTRACTOR and the COMPANY shall not assume any responsibility on this account.
- 12.3.8 All local taxes, levies and duties, sales tax, octroi, etc. on purchases and sales made by CONTRACTOR shall be borne by the CONTRACTOR.
- 12.3.9 CONTRACTOR shall provide all the necessary compliances/invoice/ documents for enabling OIL to avail Input tax credit benefits in respect of the payments of GST which are payable against the CONTRACT. The CONTRACTOR should provide tax invoice issued under GST legislations for the goods and Services (indicating GST). Payment towards the components of GST shall be released by OIL only against appropriate documents i.e.: Tax Invoice/Bill of entry for availing input tax credit (as applicable).
- 12.3.10The tax invoices as per above provisions should contain all the particulars as required under the invoicing rules under the GST legislations, including, but not limited to the following:

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- (i) Name, Address and the GST Registration Number (under the relevant Tax Rules) of the Service Provider (CONTRACTOR).
- (ii) Name and Address and GST Registration Number of the Service Receiver (Address of OIL).
- (iii) Description, Classification and Value of taxable service/goods and the amount of applicable tax (CGST, SGST, IGST, UTGST and cess).
- 12.3.11 In case of imported goods, CONTRACTOR/supplier is required to provide original Bill of Entry or copy of Bill of Entry duly attested by Custom authority.
- 12.3.12 The CONTRACTOR should mention the Place of supply in the invoice raised under GST Law.
- 12.3.13 OIL would not accept any invoice without its GSTIN mentioned on the invoice

Note: CONTRACTOR who is under composition levy of the GST legislation would raise Bill of supply instead of Tax invoice, which will have GSTIN of supplier as well as OIL.

12.4 Goods and Services Tax:

- 12.4.1 "GST" shall mean Goods and Services Tax charged on the supply of material(s) and services. The term "GST" shall be construed to include the Integrated Goods and Services Tax (hereinafter referred to as "IGST") or Central Goods and Services Tax (hereinafter referred to as "CGST") or State Goods and Services Tax (hereinafter referred to as "SGST") or Union Territory Goods and Services Tax (hereinafter referred to as "UTGST") depending upon the import/ interstate or intrastate supplies, as the case may be. It shall also mean GST compensation Cess, if applicable.
- 12.4.2 Where the OIL is entitled to avail the input tax credit of GST:

OIL will reimburse the GST to the Supplier of Goods/Services (Service Provider) at actual against submission of Invoices as per format specified in rules/regulation of GST to enable OIL to claim input tax credit of GST paid. In case of any variation in the executed quantities, the amount on which the GST is applicable shall be modified in same proportion. Returns and details required to be filled under GST laws &rules should be timely filed by supplier with requisite details.

12.4.3 Where the OIL is not entitled to avail/take the full input tax credit of GST:

OIL will reimburse GST to the Supplier of Goods/Services (Service Provider) at actual against submission of Invoices as per format specified in rules/ regulation of GST subject to the ceiling amount of GST as quoted by the bidder. In case of any variation in the executed quantities (If directed and/or certified by the In-Charge) the ceiling amount on which GST is applicable will be modified on prorata basis.

- 12.4.4 The CONTRACTOR will be under obligation for charging correct rate of tax as prescribed under the respective tax laws. Further the CONTRACTOR shall avail and pass on benefits of all exemptions/concessions available under tax laws. Any error of interpretation of applicability of taxes/duties by the CONTRACTOR shall be to CONTRACTOR's account.
- 12.4.5 In case of statutory variation in GST, other than due to change in turnover, payable on the contract value during contract period, the Supplier of Goods/Services (Service Provider) shall submit a copy of the 'Government Notification' to evidence the rate as applicable on the Bid due date and on the date of revision.
- 12.4.6 Beyond the contract period, in case OIL is not entitled for input tax credit of GST, then any increase in the rate of GST beyond the contractual delivery period shall be to Service provider's account whereas any decrease in the rate GST shall be passed on to the OIL.
- 12.4.7 Beyond the contract period, in case OIL is entitled for input tax credit of GST, then statutory variation in applicable GST on supply and on incidental services, shall be to OIL's account.
- 12.4.8 Claim for payment of GST/Statutory variation, should be raised within two [02] months from the date of issue of 'Government Notification' for payment of differential (in %) GST, otherwise claim in respect of above shall not be entertained for payment of arrears.
- 12.4.9 The base date for the purpose of applying statutory variation shall be the Bid Opening Date.
- 12.4.10 The CONTRACTOR will be liable to ensure to have registered with the respective tax authorities, wherever applicable and to submit self-attested copy of such registration certificate(s) and the CONTRACTOR will be responsible for procurement of material in its own registration (GSTIN) and also to issue its own Road Permit/E-way Bill, if applicable etc.

12.5 Anti-profiteering clause

- 12.5.1 As per Clause 171 of GST Act it is mandatory to pass on the benefit due to reduction in rate of tax or from input tax credit to the consumer by way of commensurate reduction in prices.
- 12.5.2 In case rating of Contractor is negative/black listed after award of work for supply of goods/services, then OIL shall not be obligated or liable to pay or reimburse GST to such vendor/Contractor and shall also be entitled to deduct/recover such GST along with all penalties/interest, if any, incurred by OIL.
- 13.0 **CUSTOMS DUTY, IF APPLICABLE**: NOT APPLICABLE
- 14.0 **INSURANCE**:
- 14.1 CONTRACTOR shall at his own expense arrange secure and maintain insurance with reputed insurance companies to the satisfaction of the Company as follows:

Contractor at his cost shall arrange, secure and maintain insurance as may be

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necessary and to its full value for all such amounts to protect the works in progress from time to time and the interest of Company against all risks as detailed herein. The form and the limit of such insurance, as defined here in together with the under works thereof in each case should be as acceptable to the Company. However, irrespective of work acceptance the responsibility to maintain adequate insurance coverage at all times during the period of Contract shall be that of Contractor alone. Contractor's failure in this regard shall not relieve him of any of his responsibilities & obligations under Contract. All costs on account of insurance liabilities covered under Contract will be to Contractor's account and will be included in Value of Contract. However, the Company may from time to time, during the currency of the Contract, ask the Contractor in writing to limit the insurance coverage risk and in such a case, the parties to the Contract will agree for a mutual settlement, for reduction in value of Contract to the extent of reduced premium amounts. Contractor shall cover insurance with Indian Insurance Companies.

- 14.2 Any deductible set forth in any of the above insurance shall be borne by Contractor.
- 14.3 CONTRACTOR shall require all of his sub-Contractor to provide such of the foregoing insurance coverage as Contractor is obliged to provide under this Contract and inform the Company about the coverage prior to the commencement of agreements with its sub-Contractors.
- 14.4 All insurance taken out by Contractor or their sub-contractor shall be endorsed to provide that the underwriters waive their rights of recourse on the Company and to the extent of the liabilities assumed by Contractor under this Contract.

14.5 **Certificate of Insurance:**

Before commencing performance of the CONTRACT, CONTRACTOR shall furnish OIL with certificates of insurance indicating:

- a) Kinds and amounts of insurance as required herein
- b) Details of coverage
- c) Insurance corporation or companies carrying the aforesaid coverage
- d) Effective and expiry dates of policies
- e) That OIL shall be given thirty (30) days written advance notice of any material change in the policy
- f) Waiver of subrogation endorsement has been attached to all policies and
- g) The territorial limits of all policies.
- 14.6 Contractor shall also inform the Company at least 60 days in advance regarding the expiry cancellation and/or changes in any of such documents & ensure revalidation/renewal, etc., as may be necessary well in time.
- 14.7 If any of the above policy expire or/are cancelled during the term of this CONTRACT and CONTRACTOR fails for any reason to renew such policies, OIL in no

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case shall be liable for any loss/damage occurred during the term when the policy is not effective. Furthermore, a penal interest @1% of the Total contract value shall be charged towards not fulfilling of the contractual obligations. Notwithstanding above, should there be a lapse in any insurance required to be taken by the Contractor for any reason whatsoever, loss/damage claims resulting therefrom shall be to the sole account of Contractor.

14.8 Contractor on demand from Company shall furnish the Insurance Policy having detail terms and conditions, with respect to any Certificate of Insurance submitted to the Company.

CONTRACTOR shall, at his own expense, arrange appropriate comprehensive insurance to cover all risks assumed by the CONTRACTOR under this CONTRACT in respect of CONTRACTOR's equipment, tools and any other belongings of the CONTRACTOR and its personnel as well deputed under this CONTRACT during the entire period of their engagement in connection with this CONTRACT including extensions if any. The CONTRACTOR shall also carry adequate insurance cover against damage/loss to third party person/property. OIL will have no liability on this account.

14.9 Principal Assured

The following are to be included as Principal Assured(s) in the Insurance Policies (except in case of Workmen's Compensation/Employer's Liability insurance): "Oil India Limited, and CONTRACTOR's name (as appearing in the Contract /LOA)".

14.10 Waiver of subrogation:

All insurance policies of the CONTRACTOR with respect to the operations conducted hereunder as set forth in clauses hereof, shall be endorsed by the underwriter in accordance with the following policy wording:

"The insurers hereby waive their rights of subrogation against Oil India Limited or any of their employees or their affiliates and assignees".

14.11 **Deductible:**

The CONTRACTOR shall take policy with minimum deductible as per IRDA prescribed for the policy(ies). That portion of any loss not covered by insurance provided for in this article solely by reason of deductible provision in such insurance policies shall be to the account of the CONTRACTOR.

14.12 Compliance with Sec 25(1), of "The General Insurance Business (Nationalization) Act 1972"

Section 25(1) of "The General Insurance Business (Nationalization) Act 1972" is reproduced below:

"No person shall take out or renew any policy of insurance in respect of any property in India or any ship or other vessel or aircraft registered in India with an

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insurer whose principal place of business is outside India save with the prior permission of the Central Government".

The above requirement of aforesaid Act needs to be complied with by the CONTRACTOR wherever the aforesaid provisions of Act apply, and compliance confirmations submitted.

14.13 Loss Payee Clause:

The Insurance Policies should mention the following in Loss Payee Clause: "In respect of Insurance claims in which OIL's interest is involved, written consent of OIL will be required".

14.14 On account payment to OIL in case of claim

In case any loss or damage happen and where OIL's interest is involved, OIL reserves the right to recover the loss amount from the CONTRACTOR prior to final settlement of the claim.

- 14.15 CONTRACTOR shall require all of its SUB-CONTRACTORs to provide such of the foregoing insurance cover as the CONTRACTOR is obligated to provide under this CONTRACT.
- 14.16 CONTRACTOR shall at all time during the currency of the contract provide, pay for and maintain the following insurance amongst others:
 - i) <u>Workman Compensation and/Employers' Liability Insurance</u>: Workmen's compensation and employer's liability insurance as required by the laws of the country of origin of the employee.
 - ii) <u>Commercial General Liability Insurance</u>: Commercial General Public Liability Insurance covering liabilities including contractual liability for bodily injury, including death of persons, and liabilities for damage of property. This insurance must cover all operations of CONTRACTOR required to fulfil the provisions under this Contract.
 - iii) <u>Comprehensive General Automotive Liability</u>: Automobile Public Liability Insurance covering owned, non-owned and hired automobiles used in the performance of the work hereunder, with bodily injury limits and property damage limits shall be governed by Indian Insurance Regulations.
 - iv) <u>Carrier's Legal Liability Insurance</u>: Carrier's Legal Liability Insurance in respect of all CONTRACTOR's items to be transported by the CONTRACTOR to the site of work, for physical loss or destruction of or damage to goods or merchandise, while in transit.
 - v) **Public Liability Act Policy:** Public Liability Act Policy covering the statutory liability arising out of accidents occurring during the currency of the contract due to handling hazardous substances as provided in the Public Liability Insurance Act 1991 and the Rules framed there under.

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- vi) Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojana (PMSBY) and Pradhan Mantri Jeevan Jyoti Bima Yojana (PMJJBY): CONTRACTOR shall, ensure that all his/its personnel deployed under this contract have obtained additional insurance coverage under the Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojana (PMSBY) and Pradhan Mantri Jeevan Jyoti Bima Yojana (PMJJBY) through the participating banks and submit the proof of such insurance coverage to the satisfaction of OIL.
- vii) CONTRACTOR's equipment used for execution of the work hereunder shall have an insurance cover with a suitable limit (as per international standards).

viii) Any other insurance policy set forth in the SCC

Note: An undertaking by the service provider has to be mandatorily provided during the Mobilization time that they have taken all the Insurance provisions as per the contract and as the Law and Insurance Regulation.

15.0 **LIABILITY:**

- 15.1 Except as otherwise expressly provided herein, neither COMPANY nor its servants, agents, nominees, CONTRACTORs, or sub-CONTRACTORs shall have any liability or responsibility whatsoever to whomsoever for loss of or damage to the equipment and/or loss of or damage to the property of the CONTRACTOR and/or their CONTRACTORs or sub-CONTRACTORs, irrespective of how such loss or damage is caused and even if caused by the negligence of COMPANY and/or its servants, agent, nominees, assignees, CONTRACTORs and sub-CONTRACTORs.
- 15.2 The CONTRACTOR shall protect, defend, indemnify and hold harmless COMPANY from and against such loss or damage and any suit, claim or expense resulting there from. Neither COMPANY nor its servants, agents, nominees, assignees, CONTRACTORs, sub-CONTRACTORs shall have any liability or responsibility whatsoever for injury to, illness, or death of any employee of the CONTRACTOR and/or of its CONTRACTORs or sub-CONTRACTOR irrespective of how such injury, illness or death is caused and even if caused by the negligence of COMPANY and/or its servants, agents nominees, assignees, CONTRACTORs and sub-CONTRACTORs. CONTRACTOR shall protect, defend, indemnify and hold harmless COMPANY from and against such liabilities and any suit, claim or expense resulting there from.
- 15.3 The CONTRACTOR hereby agrees to waive its right of recourse and further agrees to cause its underwriters to waive their right of subrogation against COMPANY and/or its underwriters, servants, agents, nominees, assignees, CONTRACTORs and sub-CONTRACTORs for loss or damage to the equipment of the CONTRACTOR and/or its sub-CONTRACTORs and/or their employees when such loss or damage or liabilities arises out of or in connection with the performance of the contract limited to the CONTRACTOR's liabilities agreed to under this Contract.
- The CONTRACTOR hereby further agrees to waive its right of recourse and agrees to cause its underwriters to waive their right of subrogation against COMPANY and/or its underwriters, servants, agents, nominees, assignees, CONTRACTORs and sub-CONTRACTORs for injury to, illness or death of any employee of the CONTRACTOR and of its CONTRACTORs, sub-CONTRACTORs and/or their em-

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ployees when such injury, illness or death arises out of or in connection with the performance of the contract limited to the CONTRACTOR's liabilities agreed to under this Contract.

- 15.5 Except as otherwise expressly provided herein, neither CONTRACTOR nor its servants, agents, nominees, CONTRACTORs or sub-CONTRACTORs shall have any liability or responsibility whatsoever to whomsoever for loss of or damage to the equipment and/or loss or damage to the property of the COMPANY and/or their CONTRACTORs or sub-CONTRACTORs, irrespective of how such loss or damage is caused and even if caused by the negligence of CONTRACTOR and/or its servants, agents, nominees, assignees, CONTRACTORs and sub-CONTRACTORs. The COMPANY shall protect, defend, indemnify and hold harmless CONTRACTOR from and against such loss or damage and any suit, claim or expense resulting there from.
- 15.6 Except as otherwise expressly provided herein, neither CONTRACTOR nor its servants, agents, nominees, assignees, CONTRACTORs, sub-CONTRACTORs shall have any liability or responsibility whatsoever to whomsoever for injury or illness, or death of any employee of the COMPANY and/or of its CONTRACTORs or sub-CONTRACTORs irrespective of how such injury, illness or death is caused and even if caused by the negligence of CONTRACTOR and/or its servants, agents, nominees, assignees, CONTRACTORs and sub-CONTRACTORs. COMPANY shall protect, defend indemnify and hold harmless CONTRACTOR from and against such liabilities and any suit, claim or expense resulting there from.
- 15.7 The COMPANY agrees to waive its right of recourse and further agrees to cause its underwriters to waive their right of subrogation against CONTRACTOR and/or its underwriters, servants, agents, nominees, assignees, CONTRACTORs and sub-CONTRACTORs for loss or damage to the equipment of COMPANY and/or its CONTRACTORs or sub-CONTRACTORs when such loss or damage or liabilities arises out of or in connection with the performance of the contract.
- 15.8 The COMPANY hereby further agrees to waive its right of recourse and agrees to cause it underwriters to waive their right of subrogation against CONTRACTOR and/or its underwriters, servants, agents, nominees, assignees, CONTRACTORs and sub-CONTRACTORs for injury to, illness or death of any employee of the COMPANY and of its CONTRACTORs, sub-CONTRACTORs and/or their employees when such injury, illness or death arises out of or in connection with the performance of the Contract.

16.0 **LIMITATION OF LIABILITY**:

- a) Notwithstanding any other provisions herein to the contrary, except only in cases of willful misconduct and/or criminal acts and/or criminal negligence, neither the CONTRACTOR nor the COMPANY (OIL) shall be liable to the other, whether in Contract, tort, or otherwise, for any consequential loss or damage, loss of use, loss of production, or loss of profits or interest costs, provided however that this exclusion shall not apply to any obligation of the CONTRACTOR to pay Liquidated Damages to the COMPANY and/or COMPANY's right to forfeit the Performance Bank Guarantee(s) in terms of the contract.
- b) Notwithstanding any other provisions incorporated elsewhere in the contract, the

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aggregate liability of the CONTRACTOR in respect of this contract, whether under Contract, in tort or otherwise, shall not exceed 100% of the Contract Price (if not specified otherwise in SCC), provided however that this limitation shall not apply to the cost of repairing or replacing defective equipment by the CONTRACTOR, or to any obligation of the CONTRACTOR to indemnify the COMPANY with respect to Intellectual Property Rights.

c) COMPANY shall indemnify and keep indemnified CONTRACTOR harmless from and against any and all claims, costs, losses and liabilities in excess of the aggregate liability amount in terms of clause (b) above.

17.0 LIABILITY OF UNION GOVERNMENT OF INDIA:

It is expressly understood and agreed upon by and between CONTRACTOR and OIL INDIA LIMITED, and that OIL INDIA LIMITED is entering into this agreement solely on its own behalf and not on behalf of any other person or entity. In particular, it is expressly understood and agreed that Union of India is not a party to this agreement and has no liabilities, obligations or rights, whatsoever hereunder. It is expressly understood and agreed that OIL INDIA LIMITED is an independent legal entity with power and authority to enter into contracts solely on its own behalf under the applicable laws of India and general principles of the Contract law. The bidder/CONTRACTOR expressly agrees, acknowledges and understands that OIL INDIA LIMITED is not an agent, representative or delegate of the Union of India. It is further understood and agreed that Union of India is not and shall not be liable for any acts, omissions, commissions, breaches or other wrongs arising out of the contract. Accordingly, bidder/ CONTRACTOR hereby expressly waives, releases and foregoes any and all actions or claims, including cross claims, impleader claims or counter claims against the Union of India arising out of this contract and covenants not to sue the Union of India as to any manner, claim, cause of action or thing whatsoever arising of or under this agreement.

18.0 **CONSEQUENTIAL DAMAGE:**

Except as otherwise expressly provided, neither party shall be liable to the other for special, indirect or consequential damages resulting from or arising out of the contract, including but without limitation, to loss or profit or business interruptions, howsoever caused and regardless of whether such loss or damage was caused by the negligence (either sole or concurrent) of either party, its employees, agents or sub-CONTRACTORs.

19.0 **RISK PURCHASE:**

In the event, CONTRACTOR's failure to provide the services as per the Contractual scope, terms and conditions, COMPANY (OIL) reserves the right to hire the services from any other source at the CONTRACTOR's risk & cost and the difference in cost shall be borne by the CONTRACTOR. Further, OIL shall retain the right of forfeiture of Performance Bank Guarantee and any other action as deemed fit. In certain operational situations OIL reserves the right to take over

the site including the service equipment at the risk and cost of the CONTRACTOR.

20.0 **INDEMNITY AGREEMENT:**

- 20.1 Except as provided hereof CONTRACTOR agrees to protect, defend, indemnify and hold COMPANY harmless from and against all claims, suits, demands and causes of action, liabilities, expenses, cost, liens and judgments of every kind and character, without limit, which may arise in favour of CONTRACTOR's employees, agents, CONTRACTORs and sub-CONTRACTORs or their employees or in favour of any third party(is) on account of bodily injury or death, or damage to personnel/property as a result of the operations contemplated hereby, regardless of whether or not said claims, demands or causes of action arise out of the negligence or otherwise, in whole or in part or other faults.
- 20.2 Except as provided hereof COMPANY agrees to protect, defend, indemnify and hold CONTRACTOR harmless from and against all claims, suits, demands and causes of action, liabilities, expenses, cost, liens and judgments of every kind and character, without limit, which may arise in favour of COMPANY's employees, agents, CONTRACTORs and sub-CONTRACTORs or their employees or in favour of any third party(is) on account of bodily injury or death, or damage to personnel/property as a result of the operations contemplated hereby, regardless of whether or not said claims, demands or causes of action arise out of the negligence or otherwise, in whole or in part or other faults.

21.0 **INDEMNITY APPLICATION:**

The indemnities given herein above, whether given by COMPANY or CONTRAC-TOR shall be without regard to fault or to the negligence of either party even though said loss, damage, liability, claim, demand, expense, cost or cause of action may be caused, occasioned by or contributed to by the negligence, either sole or concurrent of either party.

22.0 **ROYALTY PATENTS:**

Each party shall hold harmless and indemnify the other from and against all claim and proceedings for or on account of any patent rights, design, trade mark or other protected rights arising from any use of materials, equipment, processes, inventions and methods, which have not been imposed on the attending party by the terms of the contract or the specifications forming part thereof.

23.0 WARRANTY AND REMEDY OF DEFECTS:

- 23.1 CONTRACTOR warrants that they shall perform the work in a first class, workmanlike, and professional manner and in accordance with their highest degree of quality, efficiency and current state of the art technology/industry practices and in conformity with all specifications, standards and drawings set forth or referred to in the Terms of Reference and with instructions and guidance, which COMPANY may, from time to time, furnish to the CONTRACTOR.
- 23.2 Should COMPANY discover at any time during the tenure of the Contract or till the Unit/equipment/tools are demobilized from site or base camp (if applicable)

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that the work does not conform to the foregoing warranty, CONTRACTOR shall after receipt of notice from COMPANY, promptly perform any and all corrective work required to make the services conform to the Warranty. Such corrective Work shall be performed entirely at CONTRACTOR's own expenses. If such corrective Work is not performed within a reasonable time, the COMPANY, at its option may have such remedial Work performed by others and charge the cost thereof to CONTRACTOR subject to a maximum of the contract value payable for the defective work which needs corrective action which the CONTRACTOR must pay promptly. In case CONTRACTOR fails to perform remedial work, or pay promptly in respect thereof, the performance security shall be forfeited.

24.0 **SUBCONTRACTING/ASSIGNMENT:**

- 24.1 CONTRACTOR shall not subcontract, transfer or assign the contract, or any part under this contract, to any third party(ies). Except for the main services under this contract, CONTRACTOR may sub-contract the petty support services subject to COMPANY's prior written approval. However, CONTRACTOR shall be fully responsible for complete execution and performance of the services under the Contract.
- 24.2 Consequent upon of placement of contract, if successful bidder(s)(other than Micro/Small Enterprise) is procuring materials/services from their sub-vendor, who is a Micro or Small Enterprise registered with District Industry Centers or Khadi and Village Industries Commission or Khadi and Village Industries Board or Coir Board or National Small Industries Corporation or Directorate of Handicrafts and Handloom or any other body specified by Ministry of MSME with prior consent in writing of the purchasing authority/Engineer in Charge the details like Name, Registration No., Address, Contact No., details of material and value of procurement made, etc. of such enterprises shall be furnished by the CONTRACTOR at the time of submission of invoice/bill.

25.0 **RECORDS, REPORTS AND INSPECTION:**

The CONTRACTOR shall, at all times during the currency of the contract, permit the COMPANY and its authorized employees and representatives to inspect all the Work performed and to witness and check all the measurements and tests made in connection with the said work. The CONTRACTOR shall keep an authentic, accurate history and logs including safety records of each service item with major items consumed, which shall be open at all reasonable times for inspection by the COMPANY's designated representatives and its authorized employees. The CONTRACTOR shall provide the COMPANY's designated representatives with a daily written report, on form prescribed by the COMPANY showing details of operations during the preceding 24 hours and any other information related to the said services requested by the COMPANY whenever so requested. The CONTRACTOR shall not, without COMPANY's written consent allow any third person(s) access to the said information or give out to any third person information in connection therewith.

26.0 **CONFIDENTIALITY, USE OF CONTRACT DOCUMENTS AND INFORMATION:**

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- 26.1 CONTRACTOR shall not, without COMPANY's prior written consent, disclose the contract, or any provision thereof, or any specification, plan, drawing pattern, sample or information furnished by or on behalf of COMPANY in connection therewith, to any person other than a person employed by CONTRACTOR in the performance of the contract. Disclosure to any such employed person shall be made in confidence and shall extend only, as may be necessary for purposes of such performance with prior permission from COMPANY. However, nothing hereinabove contained shall deprive the CONTRACTOR of the right to use or disclose any information which is:
 - a) possessed by the CONTRACTOR, as evidenced by the CONTRACTOR's written records, before receipt thereof from the COMPANY which however the CONTRACTOR shall immediately inform to COMPANY; or
 - required to be disclosed by the CONTRACTOR pursuant to an order of a b) court of competent jurisdiction or other governmental agency having the power to order such disclosure, provided the CONTRACTOR uses its best efforts to provide timely notice to COMPANY of such order to permit COMPA-NY an opportunity to contest such order subject to prior permission from COMPANY.
- 26.2 CONTRACTOR shall not, without COMPANY's prior written consent, make use of any document or information except for purposes of performing the contract.
- 26.3 Any document supplied to the CONTRACTOR in relation to the contract other than the Contract itself remain the property of COMPANY and shall be returned (in all copies) to COMPANY on completion of CONTRACTOR's performance under the Contract if so required by COMPANY.
- During the currency of the Contract, COMPANY and its employees, agents, other 26.4 CONTRACTORs, sub-CONTRACTORs (of any tier) and their employees etc. may be exposed to certain confidential information and data of the CONTRACTOR. Such information and data held by the COMPANY, its employees, agents, other CONTRACTORs, sub-CONTRACTORs (of any tier) and their employees in the strictest Confidence and shall not be disclosed to any other party except on a need to know basis.

However, the above obligation shall not extend to information which:

- is, at the time of disclosure, known to the public which CONTRACTOR shall immediately inform COMPANY;
- is lawfully becomes at a later date known to the public through no fault of CONTRACTOR subject to CONTRACTOR's undertaking that no information has been divulged by them to the public;
- iii) is lawfully possessed by CONTRACTOR before receipt thereof from COMPANY which should be immediately informed to COMPANY;
- iv) is developed by CONTRACTOR independently of the information disclosed by COMPANY which should be shared with the COMPANY;
- CONTRACTOR is required to produce before competent authorities or by court order subject to prior permission from COMPANY;

27.0 REMUNERATION AND TERMS OF PAYMENT:

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- 27.1 COMPANY shall pay to the CONTRACTOR during the term of the Contract the amount due from time to time calculated according to the rates of payment set and in accordance with other provisions hereof. No other payments shall be due from COMPANY unless specifically provided for in the Contract. All payments will be made in accordance with the terms hereinafter described.
- 27.2 Request for payment/part payment to third party i.e. other than the party on whom the contract has been awarded will not be entertained by OIL under any circumstances.
- 27.3 MANNER OF PAYMENT: All payments due by COMPANY to CONTRACTOR hereunder shall be made at CONTRACTOR's designated bank. Bank charges, if any will be on account of the CONTRACTOR.
- 27.4 Payment of any invoices shall not prejudice the right of COMPANY to question the validity of any charges therein, provided COMPANY within one year after the date of payment shall make and deliver to CONTRACTOR written notice of objection to any item or items the validity of which COMPANY questions.
- 27.5 INVOICES: Mobilization charges will be invoiced only upon completion of mobilization as certified by COMPANY representative and CONTRACTOR is ready at site for starting the services/operation. Payment of mobilization charges shall be made within 45 days following the date of receipt of undisputed invoices by COMPANY.
- 27.6 CONTRACTOR shall send invoice to COMPANY on the day following the end of each month for all daily or monthly charges due to the CONTRACTOR.
- 27.7 CONTRACTOR will submit 02 (Two) sets of all invoices duly super scribed `Original' and `copy' as applicable to the COMPANY for processing payment. Separate invoices for the charges payable under the contract shall be submitted by the CONTRACTOR for foreign currency and Indian currency.
- 27.8 Payment of monthly invoices, if undisputed, shall be made within 30 days following the date of receipt of invoice by COMPANY.
- 27.9 COMPANY shall within 30 days of receipt of the invoice notify the CONTRACTOR of any item under dispute, specifying the reasons thereof, in which event, payment of the disputed amount may be withheld until settlement of the dispute, but payment shall be made of any undisputed portion on or before the due date. This will not prejudice the COMPANY's right to question the validity of the payment at a later date as envisaged in clause no. 27.4 above.
- 27.10 The acceptance by CONTRACTOR of part payment on any billing not paid on or before the due date shall not be deemed a waiver of CONTRACTOR's rights in any other billing, the payment of which may then or thereafter be due.
- 27.11 Payment of Final demobilization charges shall be made if applicable within 45 days on receipt of invoice by COMPANY accompanied by the following documents from the CONTRACTOR:
 - a) Audited account up to completion of the Contract.

- b) Tax audit report for the above period as required under the Indian Tax Laws.
- c) Documentary evidence regarding the submission of returns and payment to taxes for the expatriate personnel engaged by the CONTRACTOR or by its sub-CONTRACTOR.
- d) Proof of re-export of all items including the unutilized spares and consumables (excepting consumables consumed during the contract period) and also cancellation of re-export bond if any.
- e) Any other documents as required by applicable Indian Laws.

In case, no demobilization charges are payable, the documents mentioned above will have to be submitted by the CONTRACTOR before release of the final payment by the COMPANY. A certificate from Chartered Accountant on (a), (b) & (c) above will suffice.

- 27.12 CONTRACTOR shall maintain complete and correct records of all information on which CONTRACTOR's invoice are based upto 02 (two) years from the date of last invoice. Such records shall be required for making appropriate adjustments or payments by either party in case of subsequent audit query/objection.
- 28.0 PAYMENT OF COMMISSION/FEE/REMUNERATION OF INDIAN AGENT /CONSULTANT/REPRESENTATIVE/RETAINER/ASSOCIATE OF FOREIGN PRINCIPAL (APPLICABLE IN ICB TENDERS ONLY):

The Commission/fee/remuneration of the Indian agent/ consultant/ associate/ representative/retainer, if any, will be paid within 30 days of the payment of invoice made to the CONTRACTOR, the amount of commission/ fee/remuneration as a percentage of invoice value as per contract provisions will be deducted by COMPANY/OIL from the monthly invoices of the CONTRACTOR and paid to the Indian agent/ consultant/ representative/retainer/associate.

29.0 **DETAILS OF STATUTORY PAYMENTS LIKE EPF AND ESI ETC.**

Wherever applicable, the CONTRACTOR (including those engaging 'International Workers') shall have itself registered under Employees' Provident Fund and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 and Employees' State Insurance Act, 1948 and follow the relevant statutory provisions including Rules made there-under concerning contractual workers.

The CONTRACTOR shall be required to submit the following documents/details to the Corporation:

(i) Copy of PF-ECR duly stamped by the designated Bank, alongwith a print of the digitally signed PDF data sheet of the ECR, as proof of payment, each month, details of this PDF data sheet shall be verified by the appropriate authority (i.e. Payment Making Authority) in the COMPANY from the official website of EPFO (http://www.epfindia.gov.in).

- (a) Copy of the online challan endorsed/stamped by the designated bank as proof of receipt of payment towards monthly contribution of ESI contribution.
- (b) Copy of Return of contribution in respect of ESI for each contribution period of the six months i.e. for the contribution period ended 30th Sept and the contribution period ended 31st March.
- (ii) As an Annexure to each EPF-ECR and ESI Challan(s), CONTRACTOR shall also furnish the following Certificates:
 - 1) The furnished information is correct to the best of his knowledge.
 - 2) In case any discrepancies or irregularities is/are noticed in this undertaking, then OIL is free to inform the PF/ESIC Authorities.
 - 3) Before the completion of contract, CONTRACTOR shall serve one-month notice to all his contractual workers, informing that their services will be terminated.
 - 4) Within one month on completion/expiry of the contract, CONTRACTOR shall pay all the dues/terminal dues such as leave with wages, bonus (if applicable), Gratuity (if applicable), to all his contractual workmen, failing which CONTRACTOR's Bank Guarantee/Security Deposit may be withheld by OIL.

COMPANY may verify the deposit of statutory contribution made by the CONTRACTORs with the EPFO/ESI authorities, where deemed necessary. However, before making payment of the last bill/invoice of the CONTRACTOR, the COMPANY may verify the details/status of the payment towards EPF/ESI made by the CONTRACTOR from the authorities/official website of EPF/ESI (i.e. http://www.epfindia.gov.in and http://www.esic.in). In case the information furnished by the CONTRACTOR is found to be incorrect the COMPANY shall take appropriate action against the CONTRACTOR in accordance with law.

The CONTRACTOR agrees and undertakes to indemnify OIL for any liabilities arising out of declarations made by him in future on violation or provisions of the EPF Act 1952 and ESI Act 1948.

30.0 TIMELY MOBILISATION AND LIQUIDATED DAMAGES:

- a) Time is the essence of this Contract. If the CONTRACTOR fails to mobilize and deploy the required manpower/equipment and/or fails to commence the operation within the period specified as specified under mobilization clause under SCC, OIL shall have, without prejudice to any other right or remedy in law or contract including sub clause (b) below, the right to terminate the contract.
- b) If the contractor is unable to mobilize/deploy and commence the operation within the period specified in sub clause (a) above, it may request OIL for extension of the time with unconditionally agreeing for levy and recovery of LD. Upon receipt of such a request, OIL may at its discretion, extend the period of mobilization and shall recover from the CONTRACTOR, as an ascertained and

agreed Liquidated Damages, a sum equivalent to @0.5% of contract value including mobilization cost, per week or part thereof of delay subject to maximum of 7.5% of the Contract Price.

- c) The parties agree that the sum specified above is not a penalty but a genuine pre-estimate of the loss/damage which will be suffered by OIL on account of delay on the part of the CONTRACTOR and the said amount will be payable without proof of actual loss or damage caused by such delay.
- d) LD will be calculated on the basis of Total Contract value [(if not specified otherwise in SCC] excluding duties and taxes, where such duties/taxes have been shown separately in the contract. However, the applicable GST on the LD shall have to be borne by the CONTRACTOR. Accordingly, the liquidated damages shall be recovered from the CONTRACTOR along with applicable GST.

31.0 **FORCE MAJEURE:**

In the event of either party being rendered unable by `Force Majeure' to perform any obligation required to be performed by them under the contract, the relative obligation of the party affected by such `Force Majeure' will stand suspended as provided herein. The term force majeure as employed herein shall mean Acts of God such as earthquake, hurricane, typhoon, flood, volcanic activity etc.; war (declared/undeclared); riot, revolts, rebellion, terrorism, sabotage by persons other than the CONTRACTOR's Personnel; fires, explosions, ionising radiation or contamination by radio-activity or noxious gas, if not caused by CONTRACTOR's fault; declared epidemic or disaster; acts and regulations of respective Govt. of the two parties, namely the COMPANY and the CONTRACTOR and civil commotions, lockout not attributable to the CONTRACTOR.

Upon occurrence of such cause, the party claiming that it has been rendered unable as aforesaid thereby, shall notify the other party in writing within 72 (Seventy-Two) hours of the alleged beginning and ending thereof, giving full particulars and satisfactory evidence in support of its claim.

Should 'force majeure' condition as stated above occurs and should the same be notified within 72 (Seventy-two) hours after its occurrence the 'force majeure' rate (if specified in the SCC of the Contract) shall apply for the first 15 (fifteen) days for each such occasion.

Either party shall have the right to terminate the Contract if such `force majeure' conditions continue beyond successive 60 (Sixty) days [or exclusively mentioned in the SCC of the Contract] with prior written notice of 15 days, provided termination of the Contract does not result into safety hazard to the life and property on account of withdrawal of operations or the operation is at critical stage. COM-PANY shall have the absolute right to decide whether any safety hazard exists or operation is at critical position and decision of the COMPANY shall binding upon the CONTRACTOR.

Should either party decide not to terminate the Contract even under such condition, no payment would apply after expiry of fifteen (15) days force majeure period. [or exclusively mentioned in the SCC of the Contract]

Time for performance of the relative obligation suspended by Force Majeure shall then stand extended by the period for which such cause lasts.

If however, relative obligation of the party affected by such 'Force Majeure' is limited to part of the obligation(s), the contract shall not be terminated and the parties shall continue to perform their respective obligations, which are not affected by the 'force majeure' condition, provided the obligations affected by the 'force majeure' do not preclude the parties in performing the obligations not affected by such conditions.

32.0 **SET-OFF:**

Any sum of money due and payable to the CONTRACTOR (including Performance Security refundable to them) under this or any other Contract, whether in progress or in future, may be appropriated by OIL and set-off against any claim of OIL (or such other person or persons contracting through OIL) for payment of a sum of money arising out of this contract or under any other contract made by the CONTRACTOR with OIL (or such other person or persons contracting through OIL).

33.0 **WITHHOLDING:**

COMPANY may withhold or nullify the whole or any part of the amount due to CONTRACTOR, after informing the CONTRACTOR of the reasons in writing, on account of subsequently discovered evidence in order to protect COMPANY from loss on account of:

- 33.1 For non-completion of jobs assigned as per Scope of Work/Terms of Reference.
- 33.2 Defective work not remedied by CONTRACTOR.
- 33.3 Claims by COMPANY's recognized sub-CONTRACTOR of CONTRACTOR or others filed or on the basis of reasonable evidence indicating probable filing of such claims against CONTRACTOR.
- Failure of CONTRACTOR to pay or provide for the payment of salaries/ wages, contributions, taxes or enforced savings with-held from wages etc. with respect to personnel engaged by the CONTRACTOR.
- Failure of CONTRACTOR to pay the cost of removal of unnecessary debris, materials, tools, or machinery.
- 33.6 Any failure by CONTRACTOR to fully reimburse COMPANY under any of the indemnification provisions of this Contract. If, during the progress of the work CONTRACTOR shall allow any indebtedness to accrue for which CONTRACTOR, under any circumstances in the opinion of COMPANY, may be primarily or con-

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tingently liable or ultimately responsible and CONTRACTOR shall, within five days after demand is made by COMPANY, fail to pay and discharge such indebtedness, then COMPANY may during the period for which such indebtedness shall remain unpaid, with-hold from the amounts due to CONTRACTOR, a sum equal to the amount of such unpaid indebtedness.

- 33.7 Withholding will also be effected on account of the following:
 - i) Order issued by a Court of Law or statutory authority in India.
 - ii) Income-tax deductible at source according to law prevalent from time to time in the country.
 - iii) Any obligation of CONTRACTOR which by any law prevalent from time to time to be discharged by COMPANY in the event of CONTRACTOR's failure to adhere to such laws.
 - iv) Any payment due from CONTRACTOR in respect of unauthorized imports.

When all the above grounds for withholding payments are removed, payment shall thereafter be made for amounts so with-held.

33.8 COMPANY reserves the right to disburse or deposit the amount so withheld to the concerned person(s) or agency or government authority, as the case may be, besides nullifying such amount on account of loss suffered by the COMPANY against 33.2, 33.3, 33.6 & 33.7 above.

34.0 **APPLICABLE LAWS:**

The Contract shall be deemed to be a Contract made under, governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of India for the time being in force and shall be subject to the sole and exclusive jurisdiction of Courts situated in Guwahati and Principal Bench of Guwahati High Court.

This Agreement including all matter connected with this Agreement, shall be governed by the laws of India (both substantive and procedural) for the time being in force and shall be subject to exclusive jurisdiction of Courts, mentioned hereinabove. Foreign companies, operating in India or entering into Joint ventures in India, shall also be governed by the laws of India and shall be subject to sole and exclusive jurisdiction of above Courts.

The CONTRACTOR shall ensure full compliance of various Indian Laws and Statutory Regulations, as stated below, to the extent applicable, as stated below, but not limited to, in force from time to time and obtain necessary permits/licenses etc. from appropriate authorities for conducting operations under the Contract:

- a) The Mines Act 1952
- b) The Oil Mines Regulations, 1984
- c) The Employees' Compensation Act, 1923
- d) The Code of Wages, 2019
- e) The Contract Labour (Regulation & Abolition) Act, 1970 and the rules framed there under
- f) The Employees Pension Scheme, 1995

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- g) The Interstate Migrant Workmen Act., 1979 (Regulation of employment and conditions of service).
- h) The Employees Provident Fund and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952
- i) Goods and Service Tax Act
- j) Customs & Excise Act & Rules
- k) Factories Act, 1948
- 1) Industrial Disputes Act, 1947
- m) Payment of Gratuity Act, 1972
- n) Environmental Protection Act, 1986 & other pollution control Acts.

Note: The above Acts are only indicative and not exhaustive. The Acts shall include the rules and regulations framed thereunder.

35.0 **LABOUR LAWS:**

- i) CONTRACTOR shall comply with the provisions of various labour related laws, including but not limited to the Code of Wages, 2019, Employee Provident Fund and Miscellaneous Provisions Act 1952, COMPANY's Liability Act 1938, Employees' Compensation Act 1923, Industrial Disputes Act 1947, the Maternity Benefit Act 1961 and Contract Labour (Regulation and Abolition) Act 1970, Employment of Children Act 1938, Employees' State Insurance Act, 1948 or any modifications/amendment thereof or any other law relating thereto and rules made there under from time to time.
- ii) No Labour below the age of eighteen [18] years shall be employed on the work.
- iii) CONTRACTOR shall not pay less than what is provided under law to labourers engaged by him on the work.
- iv) CONTRACTOR shall at his expense comply with all labour laws and keep the COMPANY indemnified in respect thereof.
- v) CONTRACTOR shall pay equal wages for men and women in accordance with applicable Labour laws.
- vi) If the CONTRACTOR is covered under the Contract Labour (Regulation and Abolition) Act, he shall obtain a license from licensing authority [i.e. office of the Labour Commissioner] by payment of necessary prescribed fee and the deposit, if any, before starting the work under the Contract. Such fee/deposit shall be borne by the CONTRACTOR.
- vii) CONTRACTOR must obtain the PF Code from the concerned PF Authority under Employees Provident Fund and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952. Similarly, CONTRACTOR must obtain ESI Code under Employees State Insurance Act.
- viii) CONTRACTOR being the employer of the labours/personnel to be engaged under the contract shall be liable to pay gratuity to the labours/personnel as per the provision of the Payment of Gratuity Act, 1972 and accordingly, shall keep the COMPANY indemnified in respect thereof. If however, COM-

PANY requires to pay gratuity to such labour(s) as per the direction of the competent authority under the Act, COMPANY shall recover such amount from the outstanding dues payable to the CONTRACTOR under the contract or any other contract(s).

- ix) CONTRACTOR shall furnish to Engineer in Charge the distribution return of the number & description, by trades of the work people employed on the works. CONTRACTOR shall also submit on the 4th& 19th of every month to Engineer in Charge a true statement showing in respect of the 2nd half of the preceding month & the 1st half of the current month (1) the accidents that occurred during the said fortnight showing the circumstances under which they happened and the extent of damage and injury caused by them and (2) the number of female workers who have been allowed Maternity Benefit as provided in the Maternity Benefit Act 1961 on Rules made there under and the amount paid to them.
- x) Engineer in Charge shall on a report having been made by an inspecting officer as defined in Contract Labour (Regulation and Abolition) Act 1970 have the power to deduct from the money due to the CONTRACTOR any sum required or estimated to be required for making good the loss suffered by a worker or workers by reason of non-fulfillment of the conditions of the Contract for the benefit of workers, non-payment of wages or of deductions made from his or their wages which are not justified by the terms of the Contract or non-observance of the said regulations.
- xi) The CONTRACTOR shall indemnify the COMPANY against any payments to be made under and for the observance of the provisions of the aforesaid acts without prejudice to his right to obtain indemnity from his sub-CONTRACTOR.
- 36.0 **STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS:** During the tenure of this CONTRACT nothing shall be done by the CONTRACTOR in contravention of any law, act and/or rules/regulations, thereunder or any amendment.
- 37.0 GENERAL HEALTH, SAFETY & ENVIRONMENT (HSE) GUIDELINES:
- 37.1 It will be solely the CONTRACTOR's responsibility to fulfil all the legal formalities with respect to the Health, Safety and Environmental aspects of the entire job (namely; the person employed by him, the equipment, the environment, etc.) under the jurisdiction of the district of that state where it is operating. Ensure that all sub-CONTRACTORs hired by CONTRACTOR comply with the same requirement as the CONTRACTOR himself and shall be liable for ensuring compliance all HSE laws.
- 37.2 It will be entirely the responsibility of the Contractor / his Supervisor / representative to ensure strict adherence to all HSE measures and statutory rules during operation in OIL's installations and safety of workers engaged by him. The crew members will not refuse to follow any instruction given by company's Installation Manager / Safety Officer / Engineer / Official / Supervisor / Junior Engineer for safe operation.
- 37.3 Any compensation arising out of the job carried out by the Contractor whether

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related to pollution, Safety or Health will be paid by the contractor only.

- 37.4 Any compensation arising due to accident of the Contractor's personnel while carrying out the job, will be payable by the contractor.
- When there is a significant risk to health, environment or safety of a person or place arising because of a non-compliance of HSE Measures Company shall have the right to direct the contractor to cease work until the non-compliance is corrected.

38.0 **POLLUTION AND CONTAMINATION:**

The CONTRACTOR shall be liable for all surface and sub-surface pollution to the extent caused by CONTRACTOR and resulting from CONTRACTOR's operation/service or spillage or dumping of solvents/additive substances or pollutants, which the CONTRACTOR brings to the Site for use in connection with Work to be performed under this Contract.

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein, it is agreed that except on the ground of willful misconduct or criminal misconduct, COMPANY shall release, indemnify and hold CONTRACTOR and its sub-CONTRACTORs harmless from any and all claims, judgments, losses, expenses and any costs related thereto (including but not limited to Court costs and "Attorney's fees") for:

- a) Damage to or loss of any reservoir or producing formation; and/or
- b) Damage to or loss of any well; and/or
- c) Any other subsurface damage or loss; and/or
- d) Any property damage or loss or personal injury or death arising out of or in connection with a blowout, fire explosion and loss of well control regardless of cause.

39.0 **STATUTORY VARIATION/NEWLY ENACTED LAW:**

- 39.1 All duties, taxes except otherwise specified in the Contract as applicable on the closing date of bid submission as per relevant acts and rules shall be in CONTRACTOR's account. Variation in case of custom duty on CIF value declared by the bidder shall be to COMPANY account.
- 39.2 In the event of introduction of any new legislation or any amendment or enforcement of any Act or Law, rules or regulations of Government of India or State Government(s) or Public Body, which becomes effective after the date of submission of Price Bid or revised price bid, if any, for this CONTRACT and which results in increased/decreased cost of the works under the CONTRACT through increased/decreased liability of taxes and/or duties, required to be paid by the CONTRACTOR, (other than personnel and Corporate taxes), the Parties shall agree to a revision in pricing to reflect such change subject to the production of documentary proof to the satisfaction of the COMPANY/CONTRACTOR as applicable to the extent which directly is attributable to such introduction of new legislation or change or amendment as mentioned above and adjudication by the competent authority (applicable when disputed by COMPANY) & the courts wher-

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ever levy of such taxes/duties are disputed by COMPANY/CONTRACTOR.

- 39.3 Any increase in net amount of the duties and taxes (i.e. the amount of taxes/duties payable minus eligible credit of taxes/duties paid on input services/inputs) after the contractual completion/mobilization date during the extended period will be to the CONTRACTOR's account, where delay in completion/mobilization period is attributable to the CONTRACTOR. However, any decrease in net amount of the duties and taxes (i.e. the amount of taxes/duties payable minus eligible credit of taxes/duties paid on input services/inputs) after the contractual completion/mobilization date will be to COMPANY's account.
- 39.4 The Contract Price and other prices given in the Schedule of Prices are based on the applicable tariff as indicated by the CONTRACTOR in the Schedule of Prices. In case this information subsequently proves to be wrong, incorrect or misleading, COMPANY will have no liability to reimburse/pay to the CONTRACTOR the excess duties, taxes, fees, if any finally levied/imposed by the concerned authorities. However, in such an event, COMPANY will have the right to recover the difference in case the rate of duty/tax finally assessed is on the lower side.
- Notwithstanding the provision contained in Clause-39.1 to 39.4 above, the COM-PANY shall not bear any liability in respect of:
 - i. Personal taxes on the personnel deployed by CONTRACTOR, his sub-CONTRACTOR/sub-sub-CONTRACTORs and Agents etc.
 - ii. Corporate taxes and Fringe benefit tax in respect of CONTRACTOR and all of their sub-CONTRACTORs, agents etc.
 - iii. Other taxes & duties including Customs Duty and GST in addition to new taxes etc. in respect of sub-CONTRACTORs, vendors, agents etc. of the CONTRACTOR.
 - iv. Any liability on the CONTRACTOR, which was accrued under the old law or contract, which the CONTRACTOR is obligated to pay either to the COMPANY or to the Government Authority.
- 39.6 In order to ascertain the net impact of the amendment/ revisions/enactment of various provisions of taxes/duties, the CONTRACTOR is liable to provide following disclosure to COMPANY:
 - i. Details of each of the input services used in relation to providing service to COMPANY including estimated monthly value of input service and GST tax amount.
 - ii. Details of Inputs (material/consumable) used/required for providing service to COMPANY including estimated monthly value of input and GST paid/payable on purchase of inputs.
- 39.7 The above provisions would be applicable only in case of variation in rate of taxes and duties on supply of services to OIL and not applicable on taxes and duties on input (goods and services) towards such services.
- 39.8 Any claim or reduction on account of change in law shall be accompanied with undertaking that the provisions of anti-profiteering clause under GST Act have

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been complied with.

40.0 **SEVERABILITY:**

Should any provision of this agreement be found to be invalid, illegal or otherwise not enforceable by any court of law, such finding shall not affect the remaining provisions hereto and they shall remain binding on the parties hereto.

41.0 Commission of misconduct/submission of fraudulent document by the bidder/contractor and Banning thereof:

The information and documents furnished by the bidder/CONTRACTOR in respect of the tender/contract are accepted by COMPANY to be true and genuine. However, if it comes to the notice of the COMPANY anytime either during the pendency of the tender or after award of the contract or after completion the contract that a Bidder/CONTRACTOR furnished fraudulent document/false information in relation to the subject tender/contract or committed any misconduct, appropriate action shall be taken against the Bidder/CONTRACTOR for debarment/banning of the bidder/CONTRACTOR from participating in any future tender of the COMPANY in terms of the COMPANY's Banning Policy, 2017 besides making the CONTRACTOR liable for other penal action including termination of ongoing contract(s) at his/her risk and peril. In such event, the Bid Performance Security in respect of ongoing contract(s) shall be forfeited by the COMPANY.

42.0 **SETTLEMENT OF DISPUTES:**

42.1 Arbitration (Applicable for Suppliers/CONTRACTORs other than PSU and MSME):

- 1. Except as otherwise provided elsewhere in the contract, if any dispute, difference, question or disagreement arises between the parties hereto or their respective representatives or assignees, in connection with construction, meaning, operation, effect, interpretation of the contract or breach thereof which parties are unable to settle mutually, the same shall be referred to Arbitration as provided hereunder:
- 2. A party wishing to commence arbitration proceeding shall invoke Arbitration Clause by giving 30 days' notice to the other party. The notice invoking arbitration shall specify all the points of dispute with details of the amount claimed to be referred to arbitration at the time of invocation of arbitration and not thereafter. If the claim is in foreign currency, the claimant shall indicate its value in Indian Rupee for the purpose of constitution of the arbitral tribunal.
- 3. It is agreed and undertaken by the Parties that irrespective of country of origin of the CONTRACTOR, the arbitration proceedings shall be governed by the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 and under no circumstances, the proceedings shall be construed as International Arbitration.
- 4. The number of arbitrators and the appointing authority will be as under:

ties agree that they shall appoint only those persons as arbitrators who accept the conditions of the arbitration clause. No person shall be appointed as Arbitrator or Presiding Arbitrator who does not accept the conditions of the arbitration clause.

- 6. If any of the Arbitrators so appointed dies, resigns, becomes incapacitated or withdraws for any reason from the proceedings, it shall be lawful for the concerned party/arbitrators to appoint another person in his place in the same manner as aforesaid. Such person shall proceed with the reference from the stage where his predecessor had left if both parties consent for the same; otherwise, he shall proceed de novo.
- 7. Parties agree and undertake that neither shall be entitled for any pre-reference or pendente-lite interest on its claims. Parties agree that any claim for such interest made by any party shall be void.
- 8. The arbitral tribunal shall complete the proceedings, make and publish the award within time stipulated in the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996(as amended).
- 9. If after commencement of the arbitration proceedings, the parties agree to settle the dispute mutually or refer the dispute to conciliation, the arbitrators shall put the proceedings in abeyance until such period as requested by the parties. Where the proceedings are put in abeyance or terminated on account of mutual settlement of dispute by the parties, the fees payable to the arbitrators shall be determined as under:
 - (i) 20% of the fees if the claimant has not submitted statement of claim.
 - (ii) 40% of the fees if the pleadings are complete
 - (iii) 60% of the fees if the hearing has commenced.
 - (iv) 80% of the fees if the hearing is concluded but the award is yet to be passed.
- 10. Each party shall be responsible to make arrangements for the travel and stay etc. of the arbitrator appointed by it. Claimant shall also be responsible for making arrangements for travel/stay arrangements of the Presiding Arbitrator and the expenses incurred shall be shared equally by the parties.

In case of sole arbitrator, both parties shall equally share all expenditures that may be required to be incurred.

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- 11. The fees and other administrative/secretarial expenses of the arbitrator(s) shall not exceed the model fee as stipulated in Schedule--- of the Act and such expenses shall be equally borne by the parties.
- 12. The Place/Seat of Arbitration shall be Guwahati or the place where the contract is executed. The venue of the arbitration shall be decided by the Arbitrator(s) in discussion with the parties. The cost of arbitration sittings shall be equally borne by the parties.
- 13. The Arbitrator(s) shall give reasoned and speaking award and it shall be final and binding on the parties.
- 14. Subject to aforesaid, provisions of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 and any statutory modifications or re-enactment thereof shall apply to the arbitration proceedings under this clause.

42.2 Arbitration (applicable in case of Contract awarded on Public Sector Enterprise):

- a) In the event of any dispute or difference relating to the interpretation and application of the provisions of commercial contract (s) between Central Public Sector Enterprises (CPSEs) and also between CPSEs and Government Departments/Organizations (excluding disputes -concerning Railways, Income Tax, Customs & Excise Departments), such dispute or difference shall be taken up by either party for resolution through AMRCD as mentioned in OPE OM No. 4(1)/2013-DPE(GM)/FTS-1835 dated 22-05-2018.
- b) A party wishing to commence arbitration proceeding shall invoke Arbitration Clause and refer the dispute(s) to AMRCD with a copy to the other party. The notice invoking arbitration shall specify all the points of dispute with details of the amount claimed to be referred to arbitration at the time of invocation of arbitration and not thereafter.
- c) Upon such reference, the dispute shall be decided by the Competent Authority appointed under the AMRCD, whose decision shall bind the parties finally and conclusively. The parties in the dispute will share equally the cost of the arbitration as intimated by the Arbitrator.

42.3 Arbitration (Applicable to Micro, Small and Medium Enterprise)

In the event of any dispute or difference relating to, arising from or connected with the Contract, efforts shall be made to resolve the dispute(s) amicably by mutual consultation and in case such dispute(s) cannot be resolved through mutual consultation, then same shall be resolved through the procedure as prescribed in Section-18 of the Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises Development Act, 2006.

42.4 Resolution of disputes through conciliation by OEC

(Not Applicable in cases where value of dispute is less than Rs. 25 Lakhs and more than 2 Crore)

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If any dispute, difference, question or disagreement arises between the parties hereto or their respective representatives or assignees, in connection with construction, meaning, operation, effect, interpretation of the contract or breach thereof which parties are unable to settle mutually, Company at its discretion, on its own or on the request of the CONTRACTOR, may refer the dispute to Outside Expert Committee ("OEC") to be constituted by Corporate Business Committee (CBC), OIL as provided hereunder:

- a) The party desirous of resorting to conciliation shall send a notice of 30 (thirty) days to the other party of its intention of referring the dispute for resolution through OEC. The notice invoking conciliation shall specify all the points of disputes with details of the amount claimed to be referred to OEC and the party concerned shall not raise any new issue thereafter.
- b) OIL shall nominate three outside experts, one each from Financial/commercial, Technical and Legal fields from the Panel of Outside Experts maintained by OIL who shall together be referred to as OEC (Outside Experts Committee).
- c) Parties shall not claim any interest on claims/counterclaims from the date of notice invoking conciliation till execution of settlement agreement, if so arrived at. In case, parties are unable to reach a settlement, no interest shall be claimed by either party for the period from the date of notice invoking conciliation till the date of OEC recommendations in any further proceeding.
- d) The Proceedings of the OEC shall be broadly governed by Part III of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 including any modifications thereof. Notwithstanding above, the proceedings shall be summary in nature and Parties agree to rely only upon documentary evidence in support of their claims and not to bring any oral evidence in the OEC proceedings.
- e) OEC shall hear both the parties and recommend possible terms of settlement between the parties. The recommendations of OEC shall be non-binding and the parties may decide to accept or not to accept the same. Parties shall be at liberty to accept the OEC recommendation with any modification they may deem fit.
- f) Where recommendations are acceptable to both the parties, a settlement agreement will be drawn up in terms of the OEC recommendations or with such modifications as may be agreed upon by the parties. The settlement agreement shall be signed by both the parties and authenticated by all the OEC members either in person or through circulation. This settlement agreement shall have the same legal status and effect as that of an arbitration award on agreed terms on the substance of the dispute rendered by an arbitral tribunal under Section 30 of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996.
- g) OIL will share all other guidelines regarding reconciliation through OEC with the CONTRACTOR when it resorts to settlement through OEC. Both parties agree to adhere to these guidelines.
- h) All the expenditure incurred in the OEC proceedings shall be shared by the parties in equal proportion. The parties shall maintain account of expenditure and

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present to the other for the purpose of sharing on conclusion of the OEC proceedings.

- i) The OEC proceedings must be completed within a period of 3(three) months from the date of constitution of the OEC with a provision of extension of one months, subject to mutual agreement. The Place of OEC shall be either at New Delhi or Guwahati.
- j) If the parties are not able to resolve the dispute through OEC or do not opt for conciliation through OEC, the party may invoke arbitration clause as provided in the contract.
- k) The parties shall be represented by their in-house employees/executives. No party shall bring any advocate or outside consultant/advisor/agent. Ex-officers of OIL who have handled the matter in any capacity directly or indirectly shall not be allowed to attend and present the case before OEC on behalf of Contractor. However, ex- employees of parties may represent their respective organizations.
- Solicitation or any attempt to bring influence of any kind on either OEC Members or OIL is completely prohibited in conciliation proceedings and OIL reserves the absolute right to close the conciliation proceedings at its sole discretion if it apprehends any kind of such attempt made by the Contractor or its representatives.

42.5 Exclusions

Parties agree that following matters shall not be referred to conciliation or arbitration:

- i) Any claim, difference or dispute relating to, connected with or arising out of OIL's decision to initiate any proceedings for suspension or debarment or banning, or decision to suspend or to ban or to debar business dealings with the bidder/CONTRACTOR and/or with any other person involved or connected or dealing with bid/contract/bidder/CONTRACTOR.
- ii) Any claim, difference or dispute relating to, connected with or arising out of OIL's decision under the provisions of Integrity Pact executed between OIL and the Bidder/CONTRACTOR.
- iii) Any claim, difference or dispute relating to, connected with or arising out of OIL's decision to comply with any order or directive of any statutory or government authority.
- iv) Any claim which is less than Rs. 25 Lakh.

43.0 **COMPLETION OF CONTRACT:**

Unless otherwise terminated under the provisions of any other relevant Clause or extended through written communication, this Contract shall be deemed to have been completed at the expiry of the Period specified in the contract or period of defect liability, as provided for under the Contract, whichever is later.

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44.0 **TERMINATION:**

- 44.1 **Termination on expiry of the contract**: This Agreement shall be deemed to have been automatically terminated on the expiry of the contract period unless OIL has exercised its option to extend this contract in accordance with the provisions, if any, of this contract.
- 44.2 **Termination of contract for death**: If the CONTRACTOR is an individual or a proprietary concern and the individual or the proprietor dies or if the CONTRACTOR is a partnership concern and one of the partners dies then unless, the COMPANY is satisfied that the legal heir of the individual or the proprietary concern or the surviving partners are capable of carrying out and completing Contract, the COMPANY is entitled to cancel the Contract for the uncompleted part without being in any way liable for any compensation payment to the estate of the deceased CONTRACTOR and/or to the surviving partners of the CONTRACTOR's firm on account of the cancellation of Contract. The decision of the COMPANY in such assessment shall be final & binding on the parties. In the event of such cancellation, the COMPANY shall not hold the estate of the deceased CONTRACTOR and/or the surviving partners of CONTRACTOR's firm liable for any damages for non-completion of the Contract.
- 44.3 **Termination on account of Force Majeure**: Unless the contract provides otherwise, either party shall have the right to terminate this Contract on account of Force Majeure as set forth in Article-31.0 above.
- 44.4 **Termination on account of insolvency**: In the event that the CONTRACTOR or its collaborator or its guarantor at any time during the term of the Contract, becomes insolvent or makes a voluntary assignment of its assets for the benefit of creditors or is adjudged bankrupt or under the process of insolvency or liquidation, then the COMPANY shall, by a notice in writing have the right to terminate the Contract and all the CONTRACTOR's rights and privileges hereunder, shall stand terminated forthwith.

However, COMPANY shall be at liberty to give the Receiver or Liquidator or Insolvency Professional Manager, as appointed by the Competent Court/Tribunal, the option of carrying out the Contract subject to its technical & financial competence and his providing a guarantee for due and faithful performance of the Contract.

44.5 **Termination for Unsatisfactory Performance**: If the COMPANY considers that, the performance of the CONTRACTOR is unsatisfactory, or not as per the provision of the Contract, the COMPANY shall notify the CONTRACTOR in writing and specify in details the cause of dissatisfaction. The COMPANY shall have the option to terminate the Contract by giving 15 days' notice in writing to the CONTRACTOR, if CONTRACTOR fails to comply with the requisitions contained in the said written notice issued by the COMPANY. In the event CONTRACTOR rectifies its non-performance to the satisfaction of the COMPANY, the option of termination may not be exercised by the COMPANY. If however CONTRACTOR repeats non-performance subsequently, COMPANY shall exercise the option to terminate contract by giving 07 days' notice. Such CONTRACTOR shall be put on holiday as per the Banning Policy of OIL [available at www.oil-india.in].

- Termination due to change of ownership and Assignment: In case the CONTRACTOR's rights and/or obligations under this Contract and/or the CONTRACTOR's rights, title and interest to the equipment/ material, are transferred or assigned without the COMPANY's written consent, the COMPANY may at its option, terminate this Contract. COMPANY shall not be however under any obligation to accord consent to the CONTRACTOR for change of ownership & assignment of the contract.
- 44.7 If at any time during the term of this Contract, breakdown of CONTRACTOR's equipment results in CONTRACTORs being unable to perform their obligations hereunder for a period of 15 successive days, COMPANY at its option, may terminate this Contract in its entirely or partially to the extent non-performance, without any further right or obligation on the part of the COMPANY, except for the payment of money then due. No notice shall be served by the COMPANY under the condition stated above.
- 44.8 **Termination for delay in mobilization**: CONTRACTOR is required to mobilize complete equipment alongwith crew for commencement of services at the specified site within the maximum allowed number of days from the date of LOA/Notice for Mobilization as specified in the special conditions of contract. If the CONTRACTOR (successful bidder) fails to complete the mobilization as above, OIL shall have, without prejudice to any other clause of the CONTRACT, the right to terminate the contract.
- 44.9 Notwithstanding any provisions herein to the contrary, the Contract may be terminated at any time by the COMPANY on giving 30 (thirty) days written notice to the CONTRACTOR due to any other reason not covered under the above Article from 44.1 to 44.8 and in the event of such termination the COMPANY shall not be liable to pay any cost or damage to the CONTRACTOR except for payment of services as per the Contract upto the date of termination.
- 44.10 **Consequence of Termination**: In all cases of termination herein set forth, the relative obligations of the parties to the Contract shall be limited to the period up to the date of termination. Notwithstanding the termination of this Contract, the parties shall continue to be bound by the provisions of this Contract that reasonably require some action or forbearance after such termination.

Upon termination of this Contract, CONTRACTOR shall return to COMPANY all of COMPANY's properties, which are at the time in CONTRACTOR's possession.

In the event of termination of contract, COMPANY will issue Notice of termination of the contract with date or event after which the contract will be terminated. The contract shall then stand terminated and the CONTRACTOR shall demobilize their personnel & materials.

Demobilization charges shall not be payable by COMPANY in case of Article from 44.4 to 44.7.

45.0 **TO DETERMINE THE CONTRACT:**

In such an event the contract shall stand terminated and shall cease to be in force from the date of such notification by the COMPANY. Thereafter the CONTRACTOR shall stop forthwith any of the work then in progress, except those work which the COMPANY may, in writing, require to be done to safeguard any property or work, or installations from damages, and the COMPANY may take over the remaining unfinished work of the CONTRACTOR and complete the same through a fresh CONTRACTOR or by other means, at the risk and cost of the CONTRACTOR, and any of its sureties if any, shall be liable to the COMPANY for any excess cost occasioned by such work having to be so taken over and completed by the COMPANY over and above the cost at the rate/cost specified in the schedule of quantities and rates/prices.

46.0 **WITHOUT DETERMINING THE CONTRACT:**

To take over the work of the CONTRACTOR or any part thereof and complete the same through a fresh CONTRACTOR or by other means, at the risk and cost of the CONTRACTOR. The CONTRACTOR and any of its sureties are liable to the COMPANY for any excess cost over and above the cost at the rates specified in the schedule of quantities and rates/prices, occasioned by such work having been taken over and completed by the COMPANY.

47.0 **ERRING/DEFAULTING AGENCIES:**

Erring and defaulting agencies like bidder, CONTRACTOR, supplier, vendor, service provider will be dealt as per OIL's Banning Policy dated 6th January, 2017 available in OIL's website: www.oil-india.com. Moreover, OIL reserves the right to take legal or any other action on the basis of merit of the case.

48.0 **MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS:**

- 48.1 CONTRACTOR shall give notices and pay all fees at their own cost required to be given or paid by any National or State Statute, Ordinance, or other Law or any regulation, or bye-law of any local or other duly constituted authority as may be in force from time to time in India, in relation to the performance of the services and by the rules & regulations of all public bodies and companies whose property or rights are affected or may be affected in any way by the services.
- CONTRACTOR shall conform in all respects with the provisions of any Statute, Ordinance of Law as aforesaid and the regulations or bye-law of any local or other duly constituted authority which may be applicable to the services and with such rules and regulation, public bodies and Companies as aforesaid and shall keep COMPANY indemnified against all penalties and liability of every kind for breach of any such Statute, Ordinance or Law, regulation or bye-law.
- During the tenure of the Contract, CONTRACTOR shall keep the site where the services are being performed reasonably free from all unnecessary obstruction and shall store or dispose of any equipment and surplus materials and clear away and remove from the site any wreckage, rubbish or temporary works no longer required. On the completion of the services, CONTRACTOR shall clear away and remove from the site any surplus materials; rubbish or temporary works of every kind and leave the whole of the site clean and in workmanlike condition to the satisfaction of the COMPANY.

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48.4 Key personnel cannot be changed during the tenure of the Contract except due to sickness/death/resignation of the personnel or any other justified situation in which case the replaced person should have equal experience and qualification, which will be again subject to prior approval, by the COMPANY.

PART - 4 SECTION - I SCOPE OF WORK UNDER THE CONTRACT

SCOPE OF WORK

1.0 INTRODUCTION

Oil India Limited (OIL) is a premier Indian National Oil & Gas Company engaged in the business of exploration, development and production of crude oil and natural gas.

The Pipeline Department of OIL operates a total of 1860 KM cross country pipeline (Crude Pipeline & Product Pipeline). OIL's pipeline system has been in operation for over six decades now delivering crude oil to the four refineries located in Assam. The pipeline systems along with the pumping units and associated auxiliaries have rendered uninterrupted services and have already crossed the original design life. In view of this, the Up-gradation projects (Phase-1 & II) have been executed in order to replace the old pumping units and its auxiliaries throughout the pipeline with state-of-the-art equipment and to optimize the use of pipeline.

As upgradation of many pump stations have been completed and operationalized, the old plant and machineries which are not required to be operated or not in use anymore, need to be decommissioned, dismantled and disposed-off in order to create sufficient space for construction and operational/maintenance convenience or any future projects of OIL.

Under the scope of this contract, it is envisaged to dismantle old plant and machineries in Numaligarh NSPL-NDT (Assam), Pump Station-4 Sekoni (Assam), Pump Station-5 Guwahati (Assam), Pump Station-6 Bongaigaon (Assam), Pump Station-7 Madarihat (West Bengal) and Siliguri NSPL-RT. Separate contracts will be awarded in following groups:

Group # A: PS4 Sekoni & Numaligarh NSPL-NDT

Group # B: PS5 Noonmati

Group # C: PS6 Bongaigaon

Group # D: PS7 Madarihat & Siliguri NSPL-RT

Works under the contract are required to be carried out inside operational petroleum installations falling under the Factories Act and Rules. All statutory requirements including safety norms, as necessitated, must be complied by the contractor.

2.0 GENERAL SCOPE OF WORK

Decommissioning, dismantling, demolition and disposal of old units and builds are required to be carried out within operational areas of hydrocarbon industry. Units being offered for dismantling are –

- a) Old pump house & engine room including control room
- b) Old generator house

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- c) Various petroleum tanks
- d) Radiator banks
- e) Booster pump shed
- f) Old store rooms & workshops, as required
- g) Other smaller units

Mechanical stream dismantling includes reciprocating plunger pumps, engines, chimneys, turbine type pumps, fire water pump units, emergency DG units, other pumps & compressors, petroleum tanks, water tanks, radiator coil banks, radiator fans, HOT overhead cranes, overground and underground piping etc.

Electrical stream dismantling includes motors, various panels, lighting fixtures, overground and underground cables, earthing system, valve actuator etc.

Instrumentation stream dismantling includes various instruments fitted in machineries, equipment, tanks and valves, instrumentation panels, panels and equipment in control room and workshops, various control cables etc.

Civil stream includes dismantling of foundation of equipment and machineries, dismantling of buildings, dismantling of building foundations, dismantling of sheds, dismantling of structures, dismantling of various supports, dismantling of floor etc.

Contractor's scope of work shall comprise, but not limited to, following listed:

- (i) Barricading of the unit from all sides, with access path provided. This barricading shall be dismantled after completion of the job and will be taken out by the contractor.
- (ii) Isolation of Piping at identified "HOOK-UP" points by cutting and appropriate blinding of pipe. Required quantities of Blind flanges and fasteners shall be supplied by OIL. In case, such items are required to be supplied by contractor, cost of same will be reimbursed as per actual cost of delivery at respective site on production of purchase invoices.
- (iii) Decontamination and cleaning of tanks and piping from crude oil/petroleum residue
- (iv) Dismantling of unit consisting of equipment, piping items, electrical and instrumentation items, and Buildings, structures and sheds; All located at various levels/height on ground. Actual battery limit for dismantling shall be identified at the site. Decision of Engineer-In-Charge will be final.
- (v) Preparation of open storage yard with fencing for storing dismantled equipment & machineries at site provided by client
- (vi) Segregation of various scrap items as
 - a. Saleable scrap
 - i. All ferrous and non-ferrous material
 - ii. Electrical motors / panels (not falling in e-waste category)
 - iii. Electrical and Instrumentation cables (with Aluminium / Copper core)
 - b. E-Waste scrap (Disposal through registered and authorized agencies)
 - c. Debris falling in following two categories:
 - Concrete debris

- Other debris, like insulation material, refractory, Rubber/PVC waste etc.
- (vii) Disposal/ transportation of dismantled items outside industrial area
- (viii) Cleaning of site
- (ix) Making list of scrap items as per categories along with photograph and submission in hard and soft format

Bidder's are advised to visit the site(s) before submitting bid to have fair idea on scope of work. SOR quantities in the price bid are estimates only and may change during execution.

3.0 GENERAL PROCEDURE FOR BARRICADING

Works under the contract are required to be carried out inside operational petroleum installations. Proper hard barricading is mandatory for safety of operational plant and workforce.

- (i) Contractor shall ensure safety of the working personnel within the work area by barricading the work area suitably. The scope of work shall comprise of, but not limited to Supplying, Constructing & Erecting the barricade for carrying out the dismantling works.
- (ii) The contractor shall prepare his proposed layout of barricades for Owner / Consultant review & approval before commencing the work.
- (iii) The barricade shall be supported independently without disturbing the pipe routing & the existing pipe rack structure. Hard Barricading shall be continuous and the height of barricade shall be minimum 6.0 m/ as per site requirement/ as per safety procedures laid down by Owner/ Consultant/ Statutory requirement whichever is stringent.

The barricade shall be maintained in good working condition ensuring it remains effective as a control measure. The detail design & working drawing preparation of barricade to superstructure shall be carried out by the contractor & reviewed/approved by Engineer In charge/Owner.

4.0 GENERAL PROCEDURE FOR DECONTAMINATION, CLEANING & DISMANTLING OF EQUIPMENT & MACHINERIES

DECONTAMINATION, CLEANING & DISMANTLING OF ABOVE GROUND (AG) TANKS/VESSELS:

There are fatal and serious accidents caused by persons entering confined spaces without the necessary tests being carried out and correct safety/ rescue equipment being provided. It is therefore absolutely essential to ensure that product tanks are tested and certified gas free prior to starting of hot work.

Following sequence shall be followed for dismantling of AG tanks.

- a) Mechanical isolation of Tank by removing all pipe connections, fittings like Level Gauges, Dip hatch, PV Valves, Inter-tank catwalk (if any).
- b) Internal treatment and further dismantling.

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AG tanks shall be demolished preferably by reverse jacking method.

For safe working, necessary scaffolds/ platforms etc. shall be erected and proper access to them shall be provided. The steel plates cut from tank shall be lowered using safe hoisting devices having valid test certificates.

Prevention of further use of steel plates which contained leaded gasoline for storage of edible products/ drinking water, unless they are removed.

While disposing of the steel plates obtained from petroleum tanks, which contained leaded products, it shall be ensured that they are not further used for storing edible product and drinking water, unless they are rendered completely safe. This could be ensured by the following methods.

- By heat treatment of steel plates using flame cleaner.
- By removing all scales etc. by abrasive blast cleaning using grits / shots.

If the plates are grit/ shot blasted, care shall be taken to collect the grit or shot from operation to prevent spread of lead bearing dust. The used grits/ shots must be treated as contaminated and not reused for other operations. It should be disposed off along with the residue thus obtained as per practice followed for leaded sludge.

All parties involved in handling the plates should be made aware of their origin and risks involved in view of leaded products.

Steel plates of tanks/ vessels, in which leaded products have never been stored, can be disposed off after cleaning with wire brush to bare metal particularly the first strake and bottom plates. The responsibility of ensuring that the plates are completely safe for further use lies with the contractor.

Requirements of following Recommended Practices should be complied for Petroleum Tank entry & cleaning:

- IS: 9964 (Part 1) RECOMMENDATIONS FOR MAINTENANCE AND OPERATION OF PETROLEUM STORAGE TANKS; PART 1 PREPARATION OF TANK FOR SAFE ENTRY AND WORK
- Guidelines and Procedures for Entering and Cleaning Petroleum Storage Tanks ANSI/API RECOMMENDED PRACTICE.

DECONTAMINATION, CLEANING & DISMANTLING OF PETROLEUM PIPELINES:

The pipelines can be disposed off after evacuation of liquid and subsequent cleaning by sufficient sludge scrapping, cleaning with chemical agents and water flushing. The successful vendor shall ensure that these pipes are not re-used for carrying edible products/ drinking water unless they are rendered completely safe. All parties involved in handling the pipes should be made aware of their origin and risks involved.

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Contractor shall arrange for safe Cutting/dismantling, providing blinds wherever required, purging of piping using inert gas (as required) & steaming out the lines for hot works prior to dismantling of piping, standpipes, drain lines, vent lines, instrument tubing, flushing oil lines etc. on the equipment to be dismantled. Blinds will have to be provided at Tie-in points.

Long piping segments shall be cut down in segments as required for transportation and storing.

OTHER DISMANTLING REQUIREMENTS

- Contractor shall make all necessary arrangements for disconnecting all the Piping connections and instrument, ladder and platforms to make the equipment free of all attachments; Holding the equipment with proper care before dismantling the equipment, carefully unbolting the foundation bolts and dismantling the equipment and placing the equipment as per the instructions of "Engineer-in-charge". (Holding and Dismantling shall be done using appropriate cranes only). Contractor shall provide necessary scaffolding, all tools and tackles, equipment, apparatus etc., labour and supervision and completing the work in all respect at all heights as per specifications, drawings, equipment details for and as per instruction of Engineer-in-charge.
- Contractor shall make all necessary arrangements for dismantling of electrical items such as Motors, electrical panels, Local Push Button Stations and associated Power and Control Cabling System including cable trays, Lighting Poles, Lighting fittings on poles along with lighting accessories such as cables, junction boxes etc., Earthing Electrodes with earthing strips. Electrical cables connecting to the motors to be removed from the motor to the Motor Control Centre located in nearest substation shall be dismantled carefully considering all safety precautions and as per the instructions of "Engineer-incharge".
- Contractor shall strictly adhere to requirements of OISD-GDN-192 'Safety Practices during Construction'.

5.0 GENERAL PROCEDURE FOR EQUIPMENT AND MACHINERY DISMANTLING

Various machineries and equipment in the pump stations to be dismantled are to be decommissioned first. Liquid (Crude Oil/ Lube Oil/ Diesel etc.) inside the machinery/ equipment shall be evacuated first and stored at designated places as directed by Station operation team. Pipings are to be blinded properly before dismantling. Electrical Power connections in power cables and control cables shall be isolated by taking out the power termination from the source panels. All auxiliaries shall be dismantled first before dismantling the main machinery/ equipment. Weight of the machinery/ equipment shall be collected and recorded before targeting for lifting. All foundation bolts grouted for the machine/ equipment shall also be dismantled.

6.0 GENERAL PROCEDURE FOR ELECTRICAL AND INSTRUMENTATION DISMAN-TLING

Before starting any work related to dismantling of electrical and instrumentation equipment, OIL's concerned user section shall be informed. Competent person with adequate knowledge on electrical and instrumentation safety will supervise the work. All associated electrical power source will be isolated by taking out the power termination from the source connections.

7.0 GENERAL PROCEDURE FOR CIVIL DISMANTLING

The scope of work shall comprise of, but not limited to demolition, dismantling of mentioned structures, shifting of demolished, dismantled material outside plant premises to identified disposal area. Works shall also include furnishing of all material, labour, tools and equipment, consumables, transportation, supervision required for carrying out the dismantling works in compliance with following.

- a) All civil structures including foundations shall be dismantled. Bidder to visit the site to access quantum of dismantling for existing RCC and masonry work.
- b) The steel & RCC structure shall be demolished after dismantling of equipment and after getting clearance from other discipline/Engineer in Charge. The Completed job shall be in all respect with clearing the site for new construction.
- c) Any other work associated with the above activities.
- d) Blasting in any form is not allowed at site.
- e) The contractor shall dismantle structures mentioned above and shall be responsible for disposing the same at designated yards specifically earmarked for such purposes. Dismantled RCC can be disposed after separating them from the concrete.

8.0 GENERAL PROCEDURE FOR DISPOSAL/ TRANSPORTATION

The contractor shall be responsible for transportation of all dismantled items from the site and disposing to designate yard/ space provided by OIL. Lifting machineries and transportation vehicles shall be fit for operation. Safety engineer of the contractor shall provide safety training to all operators/ driver and their associates. Operators/ drivers/ associates shall be sensitized specifically on following areas:

- Gate and route for vehicle movement
- Use of spark arrestor
- Survey of hindrances on the routes and mitigation measures taken
- Use of safety belt and other PPEs
- Speed limit of vehicles
- Maximum load limit for vehicles
- Security pass for entry
- Material exit inspection procedure by security personnel
- Fall protection of load from vehicle

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- Emergency response procedure and assembly point
- Movement restrictions to other plant areas

9.0 GENERAL PROCEDURE FOR SEGREGATION & STORAGE OF SCRAPS

Contractor shall properly segregate and store dismantled items in designate yard/space.

Segregation of various scrap items should be as mentioned below:

- a. Saleable scrap
 - i. All ferrous and non-ferrous material
 - ii. Electrical motors / panels (not falling in e-waste category)
 - iii. Electrical and Instrumentation cables (with Aluminium / Copper core)
- b. E-Waste scrap (Disposal through registered and authorized agencies)
- c. Debris falling in following two categories:
 - Concrete debris
 - Other debris, like insulation material, refractory, Rubber/PVC waste etc.

Various machines & equipment will be stored as per specific segregation directives provided by client. Record of stored items with item description, approximate dimension, approximate weight etc. shall be listed and photographs of lots shall be recorded.

10.0 GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR HEALTH, SAFETY AND ENVIRONMENT MANAGE-MENT

Contractor shall comply to all statutory safety and procedural norms stipulated by various laws such as The Factories Act & Rules, The BOCW Act & Rules, Contract Labour Act & Rules etc.

Contractor shall furnish detailed method statement/ procedure to be adopted for every demolition, dismantling and shifting / transportation including type and capacity of crane & other lifting tackles, tools and tackles and equipment proposed to be deployed for the purpose. All tools, tackles and equipment such as cranes, Hydra, derricks, chain pulley blocks, wire slings, wire ropes, "D" shackles, turfur/hook chook, turn buckles, pulleys, clamps proposed to be deployed shall be accompanied by latest valid load test certificates issued by Government Approved Competent Authority and valid registration and road tax certificates issued by RTO and valid Insurance issued by Insurance Company for all mobile equipment to be used and valid licenses for the operators issued by RTO.

Work permit shall be obtained as per client's procedure. Job Safety Analysis shall be carried out for all critical activities for obtaining work permits.

Contractor shall make available calibrated LEL meters at all sites during work period. Measurements shall be taken as and when required throughout the day's activity.

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Contractor shall follow proper procedure for Work at height/ fall protection. Recommended safety practices and OISD-GDN-192 guideline shall be strictly followed.

Contractor shall make available adequate quantity of Fire protection and fire extinguishing systems/ equipment as necessitated for site works.

Contractor shall keep readily available First Aid kits as per site and workforce requirement. First aid boxes shall be inspected periodically by Safety Officer.

Safety Officer shall be deployed for every work site from the very first day of work till end of the works in all respect. He will be responsible for safety related duties only and shall not be engaged for any construction monitoring.

As a minimum, he will be responsible for safety training to each worker, daily head-count of workers, arranging security passes as per client's norms, ensuring PME requirement of workers, ensuring PPE compliance, holding everyday tool box talk and documenting it, ensuring scaffolding safety, ensuring fall protection measures, ensuring availability of sufficient numbers of fire extinguishing equipment, availability of barricade tapes, maintaining all records related to contractual labourers etc.

Following are mandatory PPEs for all supervisor/ workmen: Overall/ Safety Shoes/ Safety Helmet/ Hand Gloves/ Safety Goggles/ Ear plug or muff.

Except for permitted officials of contractor, no personnel of contractor shall carry mobile phone inside the plant area. It will be Safety Officer's duty to ensure compliance.

Non-compliance of Safety norms shall attract penalties as detailed in Special Condition of Contract (SCC)/ Payment terms.

11.0 MANPOWER AND MACHINERY REQUIREMENT

All Rotating Equipment dismantling shall be done by experienced fitters. For this purpose, the contractor shall engage experienced and suitably qualified erection supervisor and crew who have done similar jobs.

Contractor shall engage competent personnel from electrical and instrumentation for dismantling of various electrical and instrumentation equipment/ systems.

Experienced and competent riggers, crane operators and vehicle operators shall be engaged for the works under the contract.

Competent Safety Officer shall be engaged for each site and they must be present at work site during work hours. Minimum Qualification of Safety Officer shall be a Diploma Engineer with 2 years industrial work experience or any Degree holder with Certificate/ Diploma in Fire & Safety (minimum 3-month course) from a Govt./AICTE/ UGC approved institute.

Contractor shall use mechanized machineries and equipment for dismantling and demolition works. Spark free hand tools shall be used wherever required. All lifting machineries, tools and tackles shall be tested and certified by competent statutory authorities before deploying for use.

Contractor shall arrange own electrical power source required for operating their machines. Cables, switch boards and panels used for the purpose shall comply to required industrial norms. In case, electrical power is provided by client, it will charge cost of power at predetermined rate. In case of such power connection from OIL, a separate electrical panel with safety protection devices as suggested by OIL must be provided.

12.0 PROJECT MANAGEMENT

Contractor shall depute a Resident Construction Manager (RCM) for works under the project. He will be responsible for liaise with client for all communications related to site works. Contractor will maintain a site office near work site, if advised by client.

OIL may engage a separate agency to manage the project on behalf of OIL. Contractor shall abide by directives of the agency in line with contract terms.

13.0 TIME SCHEDULE PLANNING

The said work is to be done inside the plot where construction work of civil, mechanical & other agencies will continue simultaneously at various locations. Hence the contractor is required to plan and sequence his demolition, dismantling and shifting/ transportation activities meticulously in consultation with Owner/ Consultant, so that it will not affect and hinder the working of the other agencies work-

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ing in the premises. It will be the responsibility of the contractor to strictly adhere to all safety procedures laid down by Owner/ Consultant.

Contractor shall plan parallel activities for each site to complete dismantling works at the earliest. Contractor shall abide by client's site-specific directives on dismantling priorities and execute the works accordingly.

14.0 REPORTING, DOCUMENTATION AND RECORDS

Contractor shall submit following documents/ reports to client:

- Organogram with contact details
- Work programme with detailed schedule
- Bio data of supervisors
- Fitness certificated of machineries, vehicles, tools & tackles
- Insurance documents are per contract requirements
- Statutory compliance details
- Daily Progress Report including manpower and machinery deployment details
- Weekly Progress Report
- Monthly Progress Report
- Monthly Report on HSE
- List of segregated items with details and photograph of scrap lots
- Any other report/ record as advised by client or its representative

Contractor shall maintain following documents/ reports with them and make these available for inspection by client or its representative, as and when asked:

- Registers and forms as per statutory requirements (such as Factories Act & Rule, Contract Labour Act & Rule etc.)
- PME details for all personnel engaged for the work
- Copy of identity documents for all personnel engaged for the work
- Reports of safety training by Safety Officer
- Work permit
- Job Safety Analysis records
- Tool box talk record
- Near Miss reports
- Hindrance register
- Daily attendance register for all personnel engaged for the work
- PPE issue register
- List of Fire Fighting equipment available at site
- Any other report/ record as advised by client or its representative

15.0 DEMOLITION AND DISMANTLING PROCEDURES/ SPECIFICATIONS ETC.

1.0 SCOPE

This specification covers the procedure and safety requirements for demolition and dismantling of masonry (Brick & Stone), concrete (Plain/Reinforced), structural steel (sheeted/un-sheeted) works.

2.0 GENERAL

- 2.1 Apart from this specification, the demolition and dismantling of structures (part or whole) shall be in compliance with all statutory safety regulations and any other special requirement as shown/noted on the drawings and General Conditions of Contract. Prior consent and approval of the Engineer-in-charge shall be obtained in writing before starting any dismantling works. Any restrictions imposed regarding working hours shall be strictly followed by the Contractor.
- 2.2 All materials obtained from dismantling/demolition operations shall be the property of the Owner unless otherwise specified and shall be segregated as serviceable or unserviceable materials and kept in safe custody until handed over to the Engineer-in-charge.
- 2.3 Contractor shall follow the principle of selective demolition by sequencing the demolition activities in such a way that the non-structural materials like window/door frame, pipes, tiles, bricks, asphalt, ceramics, etc. shall be removed first before the main demolition activities.
- 2.4 Where it becomes necessary to disconnect any existing service line(s) (such as electrical, piping etc.) during dismantling/demolishing operation and where so required by the engineer-in-charge, suitable alternate arrangement shall be made by the Contractor to maintain the continuity and proper functioning of the affected service line(s) with the approval of the Engineer-in-Charge at no extra cost to the Owner.

3.0 SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

- 3.1 The Contractor shall adhere to safe demolishing/dismantling practice at all stages of work to guard against accidents, hazardous and unsafe working procedures.
- 3.2 Necessary propping, shoring, strutting and/or underpinning shall be done for the safety of all surrounding structures (whose safety is likely to be endangered) before taking up the demolishing and dismantling works.
- 3.3 Temporary enclosures/barricading made out of GI sheets, fencings, danger lights, warning tapes, etc. shall be provided by the Contractor and got approved by the Engineer-in-charge before start of the work to prevent accidents.
- 3.4 Contractor must ensure the availability of adequate firefighting equipment/arrangements before starting actual demolishing/dismantling works. These facilities shall be made available throughout the entire operation of demolition and dismantling of structures.
- 3.5 All equipment, pipes, fittings and instruments, underground utilities etc. located in the vicinity shall be protected by suitable means, as decided by the Engineer-in-charge, during demolishing/dismantling operations.

- 3.6 Roads and working spaces shall be kept free of any debris/dismantled materials at the end of day's work.
- 3.7 Necessary measures shall be taken to keep the dust and noise to minimum levels.
- 3.8 Dismantled elements/components shall not be dropped from a height or thrown from a distance. Dismantling of elements fixed by screws/bolts/hooks etc. shall be done by taking out the fixtures with proper tools only. Such fixtures may be allowed to be cut by sawing or flame cutting., in the event of their being stuck up due to corrosion etc. however, the decision of Engineer-in-charge, in this regard shall be final and binding. Welds shall be removed by flame cutting. Tearing or ripping of elements shall not be resorted to under any condition.
- 3.9 Dismantling of equipment/instruments and such other fixtures shall be done with utmost care with proper tools& tackles and shall be stacked separately. Their disposal or retainment shall be as per the direction of Engineer-in-charge.

4.0 PROCEDURE

- 4.1 Entire work of demolishing & dismantling shall be meticulously planned. Prior to start of work, the Contractor shall thoroughly understand the scope and nature of the work, and then prepare and submit the proposed work execution plan of demolishing & dismantling to the Engineer-in-charge for his review. Comments if any, shall be taken care by the contractor and execution of the work shall be done based on the revised execution plan.
- 4.2 Demolition and dismantling shall be restricted to the extent shown on drawings or as directed by the Engineer-in-charge.
- 4.3 Necessary work permits (as applicable) shall be obtained prior to start of demolishing/dismantling activities.
- 4.4 Demolition of any structure shall be carried out in the sequence reverse to that followed as the time of its construction.
- 4.5 Dismantling shall be done in a systematic manner. All elements including equipment/instruments shall be carefully removed without causing any damage.
- 4.6 Blasting in any form shall not be permitted. However, techniques like pneumatic/hydraulic breakers, diamond cutting etc. shall be utilized to the maximum possible extent.
- 4.7 Chipping of concrete/grout shall be done with precision by chiseling. The finished surfaces shall be made true to the requisite size and shape.
- 4.8 Pockets/holes of specified size shall be made /cut by drilling /chiseling/core cutting/diamond cutting etc.
- 4.9 Cut-outs in RCC slab/wall shall be made by vibration-less spark free mechanical means like core-cutting, wet cutting by diamond wall saw system, etc.

5.0 CLEANING & STACKING

All demolished/dismantled serviceable materials such as bricks, stones, reinforcement bars, structural steel, sheeting etc. be separated out, cleaned and stacked in separate lots within the plant boundary as directed by the Engineer-in-

charge.

6.0 DISPOSAL

All unserviceable materials shall be disposed off in spoil heaps within or outside the plant boundary as per the directions of the Engineer-in-Charge.

7.0 C&D WASTE MANAGEMENT

Contractor shall make all possible efforts to reduce, reuse and recycle. Construction & Demolition (C&D) waste. A comprehensive Waste management Plan shall be submitted to the Engineer-in-charge for review. As a social responsibility, contractor shall promote and spread awareness about recycling of C&D waste that can act as a perfect substitute for depleting natural aggregate resources, shortage of dumping sites, increasing transportation & disposal cost, stringent regulations for extracting new materials and environmental pollution as a whole. Recycling equipment like jaw/cone crushers, shaft impactors, magnetic separators, vibrating screens, washing equipment etc. are now easily available in the market. Recycled Aggregates (RA) both coarse & fine can be used in PCC, pavements, drains plastering making bricks, kerb stones, pavement blocks and for soil stabilization. Residual concrete can be recycled in Ready Mixed Concrete Plants by installing Recycling Drum and rebars extracted from C&D waste can be used in drains, pavements, chairs, spacers, stirrups etc.

8.0 PAYMENT

8.1 General

Measurement of all works shall be taken prior to start of demolishing/chipping/dismantling works.

8.2 Masonry / Concrete Works (Demolition)

- 8.2.1 Payment shall be made on the basis of actual volume in cubic meters (cu.m.) of masonry/concrete works demolished. The thickness of plasters/bitumen felt shall be included in measurements.
- 8.2.2 The rate for demolishing shall include supply of all labour, tools & tackles, necessary safety measures, propping, underpinning, minor scaffolding, handling, cutting, straightening, scrapping & cleaning of reinforcement bars and other embedments (in case of reinforced concrete works), sorting out and stacking of all serviceable materials, disposal of all unserviceable material, clearing the site etc. all complete as specified and directed by the Engineer-in-charge.

8.3 Excavation and backfilling

8.3.1 Excavation and backfilling shall be paid separately as per relevant clauses of Earth Work.

8.4 Chipping of Concrete Works

- 8.4.1 Payment shall be made on the basis of admissible area in square meters (sq.m.) of concrete surfaces chipped, pertaining to the different categories of thickness specified in the schedule of items.
- 8.4.2 The rate of chipping shall include supply of all labour, tools and tackles, necessary safety measures, scaffolding, chiseling, handling, exposing, cutting, straightening, scraping, clearing the reinforcement bars (in case of reinforced concrete works), wire

brushing and washing the exposed surfaces, disposal of all unserviceable material etc. all complete as directed.

8.5 Dismantling of Structural Steel Works

- 8.5.1 Payment shall be made on the basis of weight (MT) of the structure/components being dismantled. Assessment of weight shall be done as per the specification or as per the direction of Engineer-in-charge.
- 8.5.2 The rate for dismantling shall include supply of all labour, tools and tackles, equipment, consumables, necessary safety measures, scaffolding, propping, handling, unbolting, cutting (by sawing or flame cutting) of gussets/plates/bolts/hooks/welds, cleaning, sorting out and stacking of all serviceable materials, disposal of all unserviceable material etc. all complete as specified and directed.

8.6 Dismantling of Roof & Wall Sheeting

- 8.6.1 Payment shall be made on the basis of dismantled sheeted area in square metres (sq.m.) of plan area in case of roof sheeting and area in elevation in case of side and louver sheeting.
- 8.6.2 The rate for dismantling shall include supply of all labour, tools and tackles, equipment, consumables, necessary safety measures, handling, scaffolding, unbolting, cutting (by saw or flame cutting) of hook bolts, removal of ridges, gutters, flashings, transporting, stacking of all serviceable materials, disposal of all unserviceable material etc. all complete as directed.

2 Terms & Mode of Payment

2.0 ACCOMODATION & OTHER FACILTIES

All Boarding, lodging, transportation, Resident/Site/camp office, office infrastructure, required by the contractor for execution of the job shall be to contractor's account.

3.0 TIME SCHEDULE

Start date of contract shall be from the date of Issue of Work Order.

All efforts should be made to meet all the intermediate schedule and milestones.

INTEGRITY PACT

Between

Oil India Limited (OIL) hereinafter referred to as "The Principal"

And

(Name of the Bidder).....hereinafter referred to as "The Bidder/Contractor"

Preamble:

In order to achieve these goals, the Principal cooperates with the renowned international Non-Governmental Organization "Transparency International" (TI). Following TI's national and international experience, the Principal will appoint an external independent Monitor who will monitor the tender process and the execution of the contract for compliance with the principles mentioned above.

Section: 1 - Commitments of the Principal

- (1) The Principal commits itself to take all measures necessary to prevent corruption and to observe the following principles:
 - 1. No employee of the Principal, personally or through family members, will in connection with the tender for, or the execution of a contract, demand, take a promise for or accept, for him/herself or third person, any material or immaterial benefit which he/she is not legally entitled to.
 - 2. The Principal will, during the tender process treat all Bidders with equity and reason. The Principal will in particular, before and during the tender process, provide to all Bidders the same information and will not provide to any Bidder confidential/additional information through which the Bidder could obtain an advantage in relation to the tender process or the contract execution.
 - 3. The Principal will exclude from the process all known prejudiced persons.
- (2) If the Principal obtains information on the conduct of any of its employees which is a criminal offence under the relevant Anti-Corruption Laws of India, or if there be a substantive suspicion in this regard, the Principal will inform its Vigilance Office and in addition can initiate disciplinary actions.

Section: 2 - Commitments of the Bidder/Contractor

- (1) The Bidder/Contractor commits itself to take all measures necessary to prevent corruption. He commits himself to observe the following principles during his participation in the tender process and during the contract execution.
 - 1. The Bidder/Contractor will not, directly or through any other person or firm, offer, promise or give to any of the Principal's employees involved in the tender process or the execution of the contract or to any third person any material or immaterial benefit which he/she is not legally entitled to, in order to obtain in exchange any advantage of any kind whatsoever during the tender process or during the execution of the contract.

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- 2. The Bidder/Contractor will not enter with other Bidders into any undisclosed agreement or understanding, whether formal or informal. This applies in particular to prices, specifications, certifications, Subsidiary contracts, submission or non-submission of bids or any other actions to restrict competitiveness or to introduce cartelization in the bidding process.
- 3. The Bidder/Contractor will not commit any offence under the relevant Anticorruption Laws of India; further the Bidder/Contractor will not use improperly, for purposes of competition or personal gain, or pass on to others, any information or document provided by the Principal as part of the business relationship, regarding plans, technical proposals and business details, including information contained or transmitted electronically.
- 4. The Bidder/Contractor will, when presenting his bid, disclose any and all payments he has made, is committed to or intends to make to agents, brokers or any other intermediaries in connection with the award of the contract.
- (2) The Bidder/Contractor will not instigate third persons to commit offences outlined above or be an accessory to such offences.

Section 3 - Disqualification from tender process and exclusion from future Contracts

If the Bidder, before contract award has committed a transgression through a violation of Section 2 or in any other form such as to put his reliability or risibility as Bidder into question, the Principal is entitled to disqualify the Bidder from the tender process or to terminate the contract, if already signed, for such reason.

- 1. If the Bidder/Contractor has committed a transgression through a violation of Section 2 such as to put his reliability or credibility into question, the Principal is entitled also to exclude the Bidder/Contractor from future contract award processes. The imposition and duration of the exclusion will be determined by the severity of the transgression. The severity will be determined by the circumstances of the case, in particular the number of transgressions, the position of the transgressions within the company hierarchy of the Bidder and the amount of the damage. The exclusion will be imposed for a minimum of 6 months and maximum of 3 years.
- 2. The Bidder accepts and undertakes to respect and uphold the Principal's Absolute right to resort to and impose such exclusion and further accepts and undertakes not to challenge or question such exclusion on any ground, including the lack of any hearing before the decision to resort to such exclusion is taken. This undertaking is given freely and after obtaining independent legal advice.
- 3. If the Bidder/Contractor can prove that he has restored/recouped the Damage caused by him and has installed a suitable corruption prevention system, the Principal may revoke the exclusion prematurely.
- 4. A transgression is considered to have occurred if in light of available evidence no reasonable doubt is possible.

Section 4 - Compensation for Damages

- 1. If the Principal has disqualified the Bidder from the tender process prior to the award according to Section 3, the Principal is entitled to demand and recover from the Bidder liquidated damages equivalent to 3 % of the value of the offer or the amount equivalent to Earnest Money Deposit/, whichever is higher.
- 2. If the Principal has terminated the contract according to Section 3, or if the Principal is entitled to terminate the contract according to Section 3,the Principal shall be entitled to demand and recover from the Contractor liquidated damages equivalent to 5% of the contract value or the amount equivalent to Security Deposit/Performance Bank Guarantee, whichever is higher.

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3. The Bidder agrees and undertakes to pay the said amounts without protest or demur subject only to condition that if the Bidder/Contractor can prove and establish that the exclusion of the Bidder from the tender process or the termination of the contract after the contract award has caused no damage or less damage than the amount or the liquidated damages, the Bidder/Contractor shall compensate the Principal only to the extent of the damage in the amount proved.

Section 5 - Previous transgression

- 1. The Bidder declares that no previous transgression occurred in the last 3 years with any other Company in any country conforming to the TI approach or with any other Public Sector Enterprise in India that could justify his exclusion from the tender process.
- 2. If the Bidder makes incorrect statement on this subject, he can be disqualified from the tender process or the contract, if already awarded, can be terminated for such reason.

Section: 6- Equal treatment to all Bidders/Contractor/Subcontractors

- 1. The Bidder/Contractor undertakes to demand form all subcontractors a commitment in conformity with this Integrity Pact, and to submit it to the Principal before contract signing.
- 2. The Principal will enter into agreements with identical conditions as this one with all Bidders, Contractors and Subcontractors.
- 3. The Principal will disqualify from the tender process all Bidders who do not sign this Pact or violate its provisions.

<u>Section: 7</u>- Criminal charges against violating Bidders/Contractors/ Subcontractors

If the Principal obtains knowledge of conduct of a Bidder, Contractor or Subcontractor, or of an employee or a representative or an associate of a Bidder, Contractor or Subcontractor, which constitutes corruption, or if the Principal has substantive suspicion in this regard, the Principal will inform the Vigilance Office.

Section: 8 - External Independent Monitor/Monitors

(Three in number depending on the size of the contract) (To be decided by the Chairperson of the Principal)

- 1. The Principal appoints competent and credible external independent Monitor for this Pact. The task of the Monitor is to review independently and objectively, whether and to what extent the parties comply with the obligations under this agreement.
- 2. The Monitor is not subject to instructions by the representatives of the parties and performs his functions neutrally and independently. He reports to the Chairperson of the Board of the Principal.
- 3. The Contractor accepts that the Monitor has the right to access without restriction to all Project documentation of the Principal including that provided by the Contractor. The Contractor will also grant the Monitor, upon his request and demonstration of a valid interest, unrestricted and unconditional access to his project documentation. The same is applicable to Subcontractors. The Monitor is under contractual obligation to treat the information and documents of the Bidder/Contractor/Subcontractor with confidentiality.
- 4. The Principal will provide to the Monitor sufficient information about all meetings among the parties related to the Project provided such meetings could have an impact on the contractual relations between the Principal and the Contractor. The parties offer to the Monitor the option to participate in such meetings.

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- 5. As soon as the Monitor notices, or believes to notice, a violation of this agreement, he will so inform the Management of the Principal and request the Management to discontinue or heal the violation, or to take other relevant action. The Monitor can in this regard submit non-binding recommendations. Beyond this, the Monitor has no right to demand from the parties that they act in a specific manner, refrain from action or tolerate action.
- 6. The Monitor will submit a written report to the Chairperson of the Board of the Principal within 8 to 10 weeks from the date of reference or intimation to him by the 'Principal' and, should the occasion arise, submit proposals for correcting problematic situations.
- 7. If the Monitor has reported to the Chairperson of the Board a Substantiated suspicion of an offence under relevant Anti-Corruption Laws of India, and the Chairperson has not, within reasonable time, taken visible action to proceed against such offence or reported it to the Vigilance Office, the Monitor may also transmit this information directly to the Central Vigilance Commissioner, Government of India.
- 8. The word 'Monitor' would include both singular and plural.

Section: 9 - Pact Duration

This Pact begins when both parties have legally signed it. It expires for the Contractor 12 months after the last payment under the respective contract, and for all other Bidders 6 months after the contract has been awarded.

If any claim is made/ lodged during this time, the same shall be binding and continue to be valid despite the lapse of this pact as specified above, unless it is discharged/determined by Chairperson of the Principal.

Section: 10 - Other provisions

- 1. This agreement is subject to Indian Law. Place of performance and jurisdiction is the Registered Office of the Principal, i.e. Noida.
- 2. Changes and supplements as well as termination notices need to be made in writing. Side agreements have not been made.
- 3. If the Contractor is a partnership or a consortium, this agreement must be, signed by all partners or consortium members.
- 4. Should one or several provisions of this agreement turn out to be invalid, the remainder of this agreement remains valid. In this case, the parties will strive to come to an agreement to their original intentions.

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APPENDIX-A

GENERAL HSE POINTS

- 1.0 It will be solely the Contractor's responsibility to fulfil all the legal formalities with respect in the Health, Safety & Environmental aspects of the entire job (namely, the persons employed by him, the equipment, the environment etc.) under the jurisdiction of the district of that state where it is operating. Ensure that all sub-Contractors hired by him comply with the same requirement as the Contractor himself and shall be liable for ensuring compliance all HSE laws by the sub or sub-Contractors.
- 2.0 Every person deployed by the Contractor in a mine must wear safety gadgets to be provided by the Contractor. The Contractor shall provide proper Personnel Protective Equipment as per the hazard identified and risk assessed for the job and conforming to statutory requirement and the Company PPE schedule. Safety appliances like protect footwear, safety helmet and full body harness has to be DGMS approved. Necessary supportive document shall have to be submitted as proof. If the Contractor fails to provide the safety items as mentioned above to the working personnel, the Contractor may apply to the Company (OIL) for providing the same. OIL will provide the safety items, if available, but in turn. OIL will recover the actual cost of the items by deducting from Contractor's bill. However, it will be the Contractor's sole responsibility to ensure that the persons engaged by him in the mines use the proper PPE while at work. All the safety gears mentioned above are to be provided to the working personnel before commencement of the work.
- 3.0 The Contractor shall prepare written Safe Operating Procedure (SOP) for the work to be carried out, including as assessment of risk, wherever possible and safe methods to deal with it/them. The SOP should clearly state the risk arising to men, machineries and materials from the mining operation/operations to be done by the Contractor and how it is to be managed.
- 4.0 The Contractor shall provide a copy of SOP to the person designated the Mine Owner who shall be supervising the Contractor's work.
- 5.0 Keep an up to date SOP and provide a copy to changes to a person designed by the Mine Owner/Agent/Manager
- 6.0 The Contractor has to ensure that all work is carried out in accordance with the Statute and SOP and for the purpose he may deploy adequate qualified and competent personnel for the purpose of carrying out the job in a safe manner. For work of a specified scope/nature, he should develop and provide to the Mine Owner a site
- 7.0 All persons deployed by the Contractor for working in mine must undergo Mines Vocational Training, initial medical examination, PME. They should be issued cards

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stating the name of the Contractor and the work and its validity period, indicating status of MVT, IME & PME.

- 8.0 The Contractor shall submit to DGMS indicating name of his firm Registration Number, name 7 Address of person heading the firm, nature of work, type of deployment of work persons, No. of work persons deployed, how many work persons hold VT Certificate, how many work persons undergone IME and type of medical coverage given to the work persons.
- 9.0 The return shall be submitted quarterly (by $10^{\rm th}$ of April, July, October & January) for contracts of more than one year. However, for contracts of less than one year, returns shall be submitted monthly.
- 10.0 It will be entirely the responsibility of the Contractor/ his Supervisor/Representative to ensure strict adherence to all HSE measures and statutory rules during operation in Oil's installations and safety of workers engaged by him. The crew members will not refuse to follow any instruction given by the Company's Installation Manager/Safety Officer/Engineer/Official/Supervisor/Junior Engineer for safe operation.
- 11.0 Any compensation arising out of the job carried out by the Contractor whether related to pollution, Safety or Health will be paid by the Contractor only.
- 12.0 Any compensation arising due to accident of the Contractor's personnel while carrying out the job, will be payable by the Contractor.
- 13.0 The Contractor shall have to report all incidents including near miss to installation manager/Departmental Representative of concerned department of OIL.
- 14.0 The Contractor has to keep a register of the persons employed by him/her. The Contractor's supervisor shall take and main attendance of his men every day for the work, punctuality.
- 15.0 If the Company arranges any safety class/training for the working personnel at site (Company employees, Contractor worker etc.) the Contractor will not have any objection to any such training.
- 16.0 The health check-up of Contractor's personnel is to be done by the Contractor in authorized Health Centres as per Oil's requirement & proof of such test(s) is to be submitted to OIL. The frequency of periodic medical examinations should be every five years for the employees below 45 years of age and every three years for employees of 45 years of age and above.
- 17.0 To arrange daily tool box meeting and regular site safety meeting and maintain records.

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- 18.0 Records of daily attendance, accident report etc. are to be maintained in Form B, E, J (as per Mines Rules 1955) by the Contractor.
- 19.0 A Contractor employee must, while at work, take reasonable care for the health and safety of people who are all the employee's place of work and who may be affected by the employee's act or omissions at work.
- 20.0 A Contractor employee must, while at work, co-operate with his or her employer or other persons so far as is necessary to enable compliance with any requirement under the act or the regulations that is imposed in the interest of health, safety and welfare of the employee or any other person.
- 21.0 Contractor's arrangements for health for health and safety management shall be consistent with those for the mine owner.
- 22.0 In case Contractor is found non-compliant of HSE laws as required the Company will have the right for directing the Contractor to take action comply with the requirements, and for further non-compliance, the Contractor
- 23.0 When there is a significant risk to health, environment or safety of a persons or pace arising because of a non-compliance of HSE measure the Company will have the right to direct the Contractor to cease work until the non-compliance is corrected.
- 24.0 The Contractor should prevent the frequent change of his contractual employees as far as practicable.
- 25.0 The Contractor should frame a mutually agreed bridging document between OIL and the Contractor with roles and responsibilities clearly defined.
- 26.0 For any HSE matters not specified in the Contract document, the Contractor will abide the relevant and prevailing Acts/Rules/Regulations pertaining to Health, Safety and Environment.

Appendix-B

Procedure for obtaining Labour License under Contract Labour (R&A) Act, 1970 & Central Rules-1971

Every Contractor to whom this Act applies shall execute any work through Contract Labour only after obtaining valid license from Licensing Officer. To obtain license contractor is required to submit:

- i) Application in Form IV in triplicate duly filled (Name of the Proprietor/Partner or the Directors/Responsible person in case of firm/company, complete postal address including Pin Code number, Telephone Number, Fax Number & E-mail address, if any), correct details of PE and work to be executed etc. correctly against all columns;
- ii) In case contractor is registered under the Companies Act and applicant is other than Director then he should be holding valid Power of Attorney.
- iii) Original Form-V issued by PE
- iv) Demand Draft for license fees and security deposit payable in favour of Regional Labour Commissioner (Central), Ajmer along with duly filled central challan (in TR-6) duly signed by applicant in quadruplicate for each demand draft;
- v) Copy of Work Order;
- vi Copy of Partnership Deed and in case of Company, the application should be accompanied with Memorandum of Association/Article of Association;
- Note: 1. Application form complete in all respect shall be either personally delivered to the Licensing Officer or can be sent by Registered A.D. Post.
 - 2. Contractors, may intimate Dy. Chief Labour Commissioner (Central), Ajmer for expediting/suitable action if they do not receive license nor any communication within a week.
 - 3. Contractors are not required to visit office of Licensing Officer unnecessarily for obtaining license until and unless they have been specifically advised to appear in person. Appearance of contractors in the office of licensing officer for obtaining license by persuasion will be viewed seriously.

No. 6/18/2019-PPD dated 23rd July, 2020(order-Public Procurement no.1) has proclaimed the insertion of Rule 144 (xi) in the General Financial Rules (GFRs), 2017 w.e.f. 23rd July, 2020 regarding restrictions on procurement from a bidder of a country which shares a land border with India on the grounds of defence of India on matters directly or indirectly related thereto including national security. Bidders are requested to take note of the following clauses and submit their offers accordingly wherever applicable.

Bidders must submit duly sealed & signed undertaking as per format provided vide, "**Annexure-XX**" along with the technical bid.

I.Any bidder from a country which shares a land border with India will be eligible to bid in this tender only if the bidder is registered with the Competent Authority.

Validity of Registration:

In respect of tenders, registration should be valid at the time of submission of bids and at the time of acceptance of bids. In respect of supply otherwise than by tender, registration should be valid at the time of placement of order. If the bidder was validly registered at the time of acceptance/placement of order, registration shall not be a relevant consideration during contract execution.

- II. "Bidder" (including the term 'tenderer', 'consultant' or 'service provider' in certain contexts) means any person or firm or company, including any member of a consortium or joint venture (that is an association of several persons, or firms or companies), every artificial juridical person not falling in any of the descriptions of bidders stated hereinbefore, including any agency branch or office controlled by such person, participating in a procurement process.
- III. "Bidder from a county which shares a land border with India "for the purpose of this Order means: -

- a. An entity incorporated, established or registered in such a country; or
- b. A subsidiary of an entity incorporated, established or registered in such a country; or
- c. An entity substantially controlled through entities incorporated, established or registered in such a country; or
- d. An entity whose beneficial owner is situated in such a country; or
- e. An Indian (or other) agent of such an entity; or
- f. A natural person who is a citizen of such a country; or
- g. A consortium or joint venture where any member of the consortium or joint venture falls under any of the above.
- IV. The beneficial owner for the purpose of (iii) above will be as under:
 - 1. In case of a company or Limited Liability Partnership, the beneficial owner is the natural person(s), who, whether acting alone or together, or through one or more juridical person, has a controlling ownership interest or who exercises control through other means. Explanation
 - a. "Controlling ownership interest" means ownership of or entitlement to more than twenty-five per cent of shares or capital or profits of the company;
 - b. "Control" shall include the right to appoint majority of the directors or to control the management or policy decisions including by virtue of their shareholding or management rights or shareholders agreements or voting agreements;
 - 2. In case of a partnership firm, the beneficial owner is the natural person (s) who, whether acting alone or together, or through one or more juridical person, has ownership of entitlement to more than fifteen percent of capital or profits of the partnership.
 - 3. In case of an unincorporated association or body of individuals, the beneficial owner is the natural person(s), who, whether acting alone or together, or through one or more juridical person, has ownership or entitlement to more than fifteen percent of the property or capital or profits of such association or body of individuals;

- 4. Where no natural person is identified under (1) or (2) or (3) above, the beneficial owner is the relevant natural person who holds the position of senior managing official;
